Dear Legislative Secretary Brown:

Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 352 (COR) "AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE DEFERMENT OF POWER, WATER AND SEWER, AND TIPPING FEE PAYMENTS" which I have signed into law as Public Law No. 26-118.

While this legislation provides temporary relief for the payment of utility bills due to the disruption of service and need to recover from the effects of the passage of several typhoons over and near Guam, there are some inherent problems in the relief as stated.

All three of the types of payments that are deferred are not under the same status. For example, the Guam Power Authority exists under certain bond covenants that govern the manner in which it conducts business. The utilities must also operate under the auspices of the Public Utilities Commission. Should there be difficulties in administering the deferment of payments specified in this legislation, the difficulties will have to be worked out with these matters in mind.

It must also be kept in mind, that while service in these areas was interrupted as far as the customer is concerned, the costs to the utilities and to the Department of Public Works were seriously increased during the time of interruption. In other words, in order to get these systems back in working order, an increase of cost is incurred, not a decrease. In many cases, the cost was increased to the point as if the service had not been provided to the area in the first place. This would happen in the provision of power by the need for replacement of poles, replacement of wires, installing transformers, and reworking of connections, and so forth.

Our people individually have also suffered a good deal from the lack of power and water after these destructive typhoons, and have also suffered an increased cost to try to replace food, keep generators running if available, haul water and clear debris, pay for repairs to the home, and Legislative Secretary SB352;PL26-118 August, 2002 Page 2

experience the anxiety of trying to put a home back in order. The public at large has also experienced increased costs from these endeavors, and are also experiencing a set back in their individual incomes from this natural disaster. Unfortunately, no one escaped from the increased burden, economically, to their pocket books.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE DEFERMENT OF POWER, WATER AND SEWER, AND TIPPING FEE PAYMENTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that the aftermath of Typhoon Chata'an has caused undue financial hardship upon the
- 4 entire Community and, as a matter of survival, the People of Guam have had to
- 5 redirect financial resources toward basic needs to include food replacement, fuel for
- 6 generators, water tanks and other out of the ordinary expenses. It is, therefore, the
- 7 intent of I Mina' Bente Sais Na Liheslaturan Guåhan to provide for the temporary
- 8 relief of power, water and tipping fee payments.

This Session of *I Mina'Bente Sais Na Liheslaturan Guåhan*, as convened by the Speaker, is called to provide legislative recognition of the need to give our People a form of reprieve as Guam returns to normal conditions.

Section 2. Power Payment Deferment.

- (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Guam Power Authority Board of Directors shall establish and implement, within three (3) working days of enactment of this Act, a payment deferment policy for power consumption charges billed and due, or becoming due, during the period of July 5, 2002 through September 15, 2002, inclusive.
- (b) All government of Guam agencies and instrumentalities shall *not* be subject to any deferment policy as provided for in this Section.

Section 3. Water and Sewer Payment Deferment.

- (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Guam Waterworks Authority Board of Directors shall establish and implement, within three (3) working days of enactment of this Act, a payment deferment policy for water consumption and sewer charges billed and due, or becoming due, during the period of July 5, 2002 through September 15, 2002, inclusive.
- (b) All government of Guam agencies and instrumentalities shall *not* be subject to any deferment policy as provided for in this Section.

Section 4. Tipping Fee Payment Deferment.

(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law or this Act, tipping fee payments may be deferred for services billed and due, or becoming due, during the period of July 5, 2002 through September 15, 2002, inclusive. The Director of the Department of Public Works shall establish and implement a payment deferment policy within three (3) days of enactment of this Act pursuant to this Section.

1 (b) All government of Guam agencies and instrumentalities shall *not* 2 be subject to any deferment policy as provided for in this Section.

Section 5. Billing Process. In the event of a natural disaster resulting in a declared emergency by *I Maga'lahen Guåhan*, the Guam Power Authority ("GPA") and the Guam Waterworks Authority ("GWA") are directed to use their best efforts to produce accurate and true billings based upon true and metered consumption. *If* such is impossible due to emergency conditions, then GPA and GWA shall issue no billing to any customer that is higher in amount than the amount billed to such customer in the billing cycle *immediately prior* to the onset of the natural disaster. This Section shall *not* be construed as preventing either GPA or GWA from issuing a billing that is lower in amount as compared to the billing *immediately prior* to the onset of the natural disaster.

Section 6. Severability. If any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.
