BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 31215 is hereby *added* to Article 2, Chapter 31, Division 3 of Title 7 of the Guam Code Annotated:

"Section 31215. Additional Powers of Court. In the event that a Court has issued a mandate to any inferior tribunal, corporation, board or person, and the inferior tribunal, corporation, board or person refuses to comply with the Court's mandate, the Court, in addition to its other powers contained within this Chapter and under law, may take such action that was mandated by the Court, including, but *not* limited to, making appointments, whether those appointments are ministerial or discretionary. This Section shall also apply to any Court issued mandates existing at the time of enactment of this Section."

Section 2. Section 79101 of Chapter 79, Division 2 of Title 12 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"Section 79101. Commissioners. The Commission shall be comprised of five (5) Commissioners elected at-large by the voters of Guam in a General Election. To be eligible to be a Commissioner, a person must be a registered voter of Guam and a minimum of twenty-five (25) years of age, and shall have been a resident of Guam for at least five (5) years prior to the date of the Commissioner's election. A person may not simultaneously serve as a Commissioner and an employee of the government of Guam, except that an adjunct instructor, teacher or professor employed by the University of Guam or the Guam Community College shall not be considered an employee of the

government of Guam for the purpose of this Section and may thus serve as a Commissioner.

Persons retired from the government of Guam may serve as Commissioners. At their first official meeting, the Commissioners shall elect from among the Commissioners a chairperson, who shall preside over meetings of the Commission. A majority of the Commissioners holding office shall constitute a quorum. The affirmative vote of the Commissioners holding office shall constitute the decision of the Commission. The Commission may adopt rules and regulations governing the conduct of its affairs."

Section 3. Extension of Filing Deadline for 2002 Election for Consolidated Commission on Utilities. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, including 3 G.C.A. § 6112, as repealed and reenacted by Public Law Number 26-119, the filing deadline for candidates for the Consolidated Commission on Utilities shall be by 5:00 p.m. on September 16, 2002 for the 2002 election year.

Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.

Dear Legislative Secretary Brown:

Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 362 (COR) "AN ACT TO ADD § 31215 TO TITLE 7 AND TO AMEND § 79101 OF TITLE 12, ALL OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE POWERS OF THE COURT ISSUING MANDAMUS RELIEF, EXTENDING THE FILING DEADLINE FOR THE CONSOLIDATED COMMISSION ON UTILITIES FOR YEAR 2002 ELECTIONS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES," which I have vetoed.

This legislation extends, for the second time, the deadline for filing for election to membership on the Combined Elected Utilities Commission. This new commission will oversee the operations of both the Guam Waterworks Authority and the Guam Power Authority. Besides prejudicing those who have already met the previous filing date by opening up the election, a second time, to additional competition, this legislation prevents the Guam Election Commission from sending out ballots to absentee voters by the required deadline.

The Guam Election Commission office must send out ballots by no later than Wednesday, September 18, to meet the 45-day deadline to get ballots to absentee voters for the General Election. At this time, the drawing to select ballot placement is set for September 12, 2002. This will allow just enough time for ballot placement to be decided and to design, print, dry, and separate the ballots to prepare them for mailing. It is not possible to delay the inclusion of candidates to file papers until September 18 for one of the numerous elections on the ballot and still meet the deadline.

In addition to the logistics of sending out ballots beyond the deadline, this legislation also is discriminatory. Section Two of the legislation carves out a separate class of individuals who are allowed to serve as members of the Combined Elected Utilities Commission for employees of the Guam Community College and the University of Guam. While employees of these institutions may

be good members of this commission, so might employees of other government agencies. To allow some government employees to serve on this commission, but not others, improperly creates categories that discriminate against those employees who might want to serve on this commission and are prevented from doing so. There are experienced, educated, and qualified employees within other government agencies as well as within the educational institutions.

Finally, the legislation concerning the additional powers of the court is inorganic with regard to appointments in the government. While the section can be applied in some cases to the private sector and in civil cases concerning corporations and other such bodies within the private sector, it cannot be applied in cases concerning the Governor's appointment powers under the Organic Act. The section is overbroad in its application.

(b) Every member of the Commission who is *not* in the service of the government, for which that person receives an annual compensation, shall be paid Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for each attendance of

a meetic; upon that person's duties. Subject to the availability of funds and in compliance with any applicable provision of law, any member may be reimbursed reasonable expenses authorized by the Commission to be incurred in the performance of that person's office.

- (c) Any appointed member may be removed for misconduct in office by a resolution duly adopted by a vote of two-thirds (2/3s) of the members elected and serving in *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*. At the written request via a duly passed resolution of the state central committee of any political party that has recommended the appointment of a member, *I-Maga'lahen Guåhan*—the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Guam immediately shall remove such member from the Commission. 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 2101 of Title 3 of the Guam Code Annotated, as repealed and reenacted by Public Law No. 25-146, is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"Section 2101. Election Commission: Composition; Removal of Members; Chairman; Quorum. (a) There is within, as an autonomous instrumentality and an independent commission of the government of Guam, the Election Commission. The Commission shall consist of seven (7) members, all of whom shall be eligible voters on the date of their appointment. *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* shall appoint Six (6)

members shall be appointed from recommendations made by the recognized political parties of Guam.
