Dear Legislative Secretary Brown:

Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 067 (COR) entitled: "AN ACT TO AMEND §8210(e) AND TO ADD §8217(c) TO TITLE 4 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM DEFINED CONTRIBUTION RETIREMENT SYSTEM" which I have signed into law as Public Law No. 26-13.

This legislation allows the Government of Guam Retirement Fund, with respect to the Defined Contribution Plan, to spend funds for administrative expenses of the Retirement Fund from the expense account set up to receive funds of the employer's contribution paid into the fund on behalf of employees who never become vested in the fund. These funds are forfeited funds, and may be applied to the employee should the employee become re-employed within 5 years of termination. If the employee does not become re-employed, the forfeited funds can be used for administrative costs.



PUBLIC HEARING:

The Committee on Ways and Means, to which was referred Bill No. 67 (COR), "AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 8210(e) AND TO ADD A NEW SECTION 8217(c) TO ARTICLE 2, CHAPTER 8 OF TITLE 4 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM DEFINED CONTRIBUTION RETIREMENT SYSTEM," conducted a public hearing on Tuesday, May 8, 2001, at the Guam Legislature Public Hearing Room Senator Kaleo S. Moylan, Chairperson of the Committee on Ways and Means convened the hearing at 8:30 a.m. Also in attendance were Senators Vicente C. Pangelinan, Eddie B. Calvo, Lou A. Leon Guerrero and Thomas C. Ada.

TESTIMONY

Appearing before the Committee was Mr. John A. Rios, Director of the Government of Guam Retirement Fund. Mr. Rios informed the Committee that the proposed Bill will cover the costs associated with the creation of the Defined Contribution Plan as well decreasing the future costs to the individual DC member for administrative expenses. In closing, Mr. Rios, urged the Committee and other members of the Guam Legislature to act favorably on Bill No. 67.

There being no further discussion, the Chair adjourned the hearing on Bill No 67 (COR) at 9:00 a.m.

SECTION ANALYSIS:

Section 1. This section amends Section 8210(e) of Article 2, Chapter 8 of Title 4 of the Guam Code Annotated. The proposed amendment ensures that the costs associated with the creation of the Deferred Contribution Plan will be covered.

Section 2. This sections adds a new paragraph (c) to Section 8217(c). This new subsection provides that for fiscal years beginning October 1, 2001 and thereafter, the Board of Trustees shall use the aggregate amount of forfeitures released from the suspense account at the end of each fiscal year to pay for the plan's administrative expenses to reduce the administrative fees or charges allowed by this section.

Section 3. Severability.





Water, poaching top at Legislature hearir

THE Guam Legislature's Natural Resources Committee will take up a bill to assess new users of Guam's water and wastewater system hooking up, a bill to issue citations and fines to poachers, and the re-appointment of a Guam Waterworks Authority board member during a meeting this morning at 9:00 a.m.

Bill 46, authored by Sen. Tom Ada, would re-institute a Systems Development Charge paid by all new homes and buildings connecting to the Guam water system. Laws to establish such a charge has existed for years, but was never implemented because of concerns over the calculation of the charges, according to Sen. Joanne Brown, chairperson of the committee that will hear the bill.

"Some of the previous figures that have surfaced are astronomically high. For a three-bedroom residential home, the systems development charge, eight or nine years ago, was calculated at about \$7,000," Brown said, "At the same time, we recognize the need to address upgrading and improving the infrastructure."
