Dear Legislative Secretary Brown:

Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 371 (LS) "AN ACT TO AMEND § 6504.1 OF TITLE 4 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO ALLOWING DUAL EMPLOYMENT FOR SCHOOL HEALTH COUNSELORS AND OTHER POSITIONS," which was signed into law by the Governor as **Public Law No. 26-143.**

This legislation attempts to solve some of the problems the government of Guam is experiencing with a shortage of employees in certain fields. The legislation allows those who are employed in other areas of the government and who are qualified to be part-time health counselors to also be employed as part-time health counselors if that employment does not conflict with their other employment. The legislation also extends the dual employment privilege to those government employees who are employed in one field and yet possess qualifications to work in the fields where the government is experiencing a shortage to afford them an opportunity to work in those other fields also, as long as the dual employment does not conflict with their primary employment.

- (1) persons serving as part-time teachers, part-time school health counselors and University of Guam instructors for the Guam Community College, and instructors for the University of Guam who may be employed during the summer and at any other time *not* in conflict with their primary employment *if* they are employed elsewhere in the government of Guam as their primary employer;
 - (2) persons employed by the Youth Congress;
- (3) persons employed on a part-time basis by boards or commissions;
- (4) persons employed as nurses, physicians, and as ancillary/allied health professionals in the government of Guam;
- (5) attorneys engaging in the active practice of law, or part-time judges or part-time court referees;
- (6) persons employed on a part-time or contractual basis who are individual and family counselors or chemical dependency specialists; *or*
- (7) any employee of the government of Guam whose primary employment is *not* in any of the agencies or professions listed in items (1), (2), (3), (4), (5) and (6) herein, but has training and experience to qualify to be employed in the professions listed in items (1), (2), (3), (4), (5) and (6) herein, may be employed in secondary jobs in such professions within the government of

Guam; provided, that such secondary job is not in conflict with that 1 2 person's primary job and there are no other qualified applicants 3 not within the employ of the government of Guam." If any provision of this Law or its Section 2. Severability. 4 application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to 5 law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this 6 Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, 7 and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable. 8

Buenas! The Department of Education fully supports with modification the enactment of Bill No. 371 (LS), "AN ACT TO AMEND §6504.1 OF CHAPTER 6, TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO ALLOWING DUAL EMPLOYMENT WITHIN THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM OF SCHOOL HEALTH COUNSELORS AND TO EXPAND THE CONDITIONS BY WHICH DUAL EMPLOYMENT IS ALLOWED IN GUAM'S EDUCATION AGENCIES".

The Department of Education recommends a minor modification of line 14 and 15 of Bill No. 371 (LS). We recommend the language as follows: except for: (1) persons serving as part-time teachers, part-time school health counselors, <u>part-time health care professionals</u> and University of Guam instructors for the Guam Community College......

The Department of Education has been hiring regular full-time teachers, school health counselors and health care professionals as part-time employees for after school programs and summer programs for several decades, however there is no statute that clearly authorizes dual employment of such full-time employees in the department. The hiring of full-time teachers, school health counselors, and health care professionals under part-time employment status has been based on decades of practice including some documents that implied authorization for hiring of permanent employees in part-time positions. The enactment of Bill No. 371 (LS) will clearly clarify the hiring status since most recently, the Civil Service Commission is questioning the propriety of dual employment of teachers, school health counselors and health care professionals through the post audits of personnel actions.

The Department of Education currently employs 285 full-time teachers, school health counselors, and health care professionals under part-time employment. Of the 285, 233 are part-time employees under the Deed Program, 24 under the Guam LAGU 21st Century Community Learning Center Program and 28 under the Special Education After-School Program. Furthermore, in the summer that just ended, the Department hired 505 part-time

teachers, school health counselors and health care professionals. These programs are 100% federally funded. In previous years, the Department of Education hired essentially the same number of teachers, school health counselors, and health care professionals under part-time employment and we anticipate such hiring to continue in the future. These programs supplement regular instruction of students by helping them improve learning and development of their skills and talents.

While the Department of Education relies strongly on decades of practice and established precedence in the hiring of regular full-time teachers, school health counselors and health care professionals under part-time employment such as for the after school programs and summer programs, the department feels more secured in its hiring practice by relying on public law that clearly authorizes such employment.

I want to express my support of Bill No. 371 (LS) and I also want to thank the chairman and members of the Committee on Education for giving us the opportunity to submit testimony on this bill.

Dear Honorable Senator Kasperbauer:

During this time of critical need for teachers and school health counselors at our public schools, I would like to express my appreciation for your Bill No. 371 (COR) which helps to address this critical need in our public schools.

The above bill, however, only partially addresses the much needed solution(s) to the problem. I believe that those teachers and school health counselors who voluntarily purchased early retirement (Public Law No. 26-19 Section 2, (c)) and those who took voluntary separation with compensation, and who cannot be re-employed or reinstated for a period of at least three (3) years, should be given a waiver for the remaining time of their 3-year waiting period. I suggest that those who have been out be given a waiver for the remaining waiting period which is less than 6 months, so those who want to return now to the public schools can return. This will also help to alleviate, to some degree, our critical need for certified school teachers and counselors.

I support Bill No. 371 (COR).







Bill No. 371 (LS): AN ACT TO AMEND§6504.1 OF CHAPTER 6, TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO ALLOWING DUAL EMPLOYMENT WITHIN THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM OF SCHOOL HEALTH COUNSELORS AND TO EXPAND THE CONDITIONS BY WHICH DUAL EMPLOYMENT IS ALLOWED IN GUAM'S EDUCATION AGENCIES.

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Education held a public hearing on Friday, August 30, 2002 at 9:00 a.m. at I Liheslatura's Public Hearing Room.

II. Testimony

The Department Of Education officials testified as a group in favor of the Bill. The Superintendent advised the Committee that because of the limited numbers of individuals who qualify as teachers and health counselors on Guam, the Department has exhausted most alternatives to fill such vacancies. She noted that there are many employees working outside of DOE in the Government of Guam that hold credentials to fill these positions on a part-time basis but are prohibited from doing so because of limitations in public law on duel employment. She noted that the bill would remove such limitations while at the same time protect the agency that is the primary employer. She suggested that the bill be expanded to allow healthcare professionals working in other agencies to besides education related agencies to hold dual

employment at DOE. She also suggested that DOE be allowed to pay higher salaries for substitute teachers that are certified teachers who are retired or employed elsewhere in Gov Guam noting that many will not work for the low wages of \$9.00 per hour that they are limited to for substitutes. The Superintendent also submitted written testimony that she read to the Committee.

Mr. Benny P. San Nicolas testified in favor of the Bill. He suggested that the bill also include provisions that allow retirees to teach part-time and as substitutes. Chairman Kasperbauer informed him that such a provision already exist in Guam Law.

Dr. John Rider submitted written testimony in favor of the Bill. He suggested that the restrictions be loosed to allow any employee of the Government of Guam regardless of where they are employed or in what profession, who meet the qualifications to be teachers, instructors, or health counselors to be employed on a part-time basis in any educational institution.

Ms. Trini Torres submitted written testimony in favor of the Bill and requested that teachers and health counselors who took the voluntary separation and early retirement be allowed to return.

III. Findings and Recommendation

The Committee finds that dual employment of individuals who qualify as teachers or health counselors is a viable means of providing DOE and other education agencies in the government of Guam with such qualified professions. The Committee further finds that restrictions to allow for such dual employment be removed with the limitation that such dual employment does not interfere or conflict with the employee's primary job. The Committee agrees with the recommendations of the Superintendent and the GCC VP and incorporated such recommendations in a substitute bill.

It is the recommendation of the Committee on Education that Substitute Bill No. 371 (LS) be reported out with the recommendation **TO DO PASS.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 6504.1 of Chapter 6, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated to is herby *amended* to read:

§ 6504.1. Dual Employment Prohibited. No employee of the government of Guam may be employed on a full-time, part-time or contractual basis by more than one (1) department, agency or branch of the government of Guam at any time, except for: (1) persons serving as part-time teachers, part-time school health counselors and University of Guam instructors for the Guam Community College and instructors for the University of Guam who may be employed during the summer and at any other time not in conflict with their primary employment if they are employed elsewhere in the Government of Guam as their primary employer; (2) persons employed by the Youth Congress; (3) persons employed on a part-time basis by boards or commissions; (4) persons employed as nurses, physicians, and as ancillary health professionals in the Guam Memorial Hospital's Ancillary Services Department, (5) attorneys engaging in the active practice of

- law, or part-time judges or part-time court referees, or (6) persons employed on a
- 2 part-time or contractual basis who are individual and family counselors or
- 3 chemical dependency specialists.
