AN ACT TO REPEAL § 22431 OF TITLE 4 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO WAIVING THE REQUIREMENT TO ARRANGE A LINE OF CREDIT FROM A BANK OR LENDING INSTITUTION LICENSED ON GUAM FOR FISCAL YEAR 2003, FOR SUPER TYPHOON PONGSONA RECOVERY EFFORTS AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Section 22431 of Article 4, Chapter 22, Division 2 of
- 3 Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated, as added by § 4 of Public Law Number
- 4 26-85, is hereby *repealed* in its entirety.

Section 2. For Fiscal Year 2003, I Maga'lahen Guåhan may arrange a line

3 provided for in 5 G.C.A. § 22413, notwithstanding the requirement in 5 G.C.A.

4 § 22413 to borrow from a bank or lending institution licensed on Guam.

Section 3. Notwithstanding any provision of law, I Maga'lahen Guåhan is hereby authorized to spend a maximum of Five Million Dollars (\$5,000,000) from the Twenty-four Million Dollars (\$24,000,000) line of credit for the payments of prior years tax refunds authorized under Public Law Number 26-85, for operational expenses of the government of Guam for Fiscal Year

Section 4. For ninety (90) days from the enactment of this measure, in response to the destruction caused by Super Typhoon Pongsona to Guam's power and water systems, the Guam Power Authority and the Guam Water Works Authority are authorized to employ retired qualified transmission and distribution field personnel to assist in restoration efforts, notwithstanding the provisions of 4 G.C.A. § 8121, which shall *not* be applicable to those employees hired pursuant to this Section for the prescribed time period.

Section 5. Expedited Procurement Authorized. Notwithstanding the Guam Procurement Law, the Guam Power Authority is hereby authorized to purchase materials and items necessary in response to the destruction caused by Super Typhoon Pongsona to Guam's power system; *provided*, that the Guam Power Authority must solicit *at least* three (3) informal price quotations, and must award the procurement to the firm with the best offer, as determined by evaluating cost and delivery time.

Section 6. Notwithstanding any provision of law, the sum of Three Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$300,000.00) is hereby *directly* appropriated to the Mayors' Council from the Village Street Funds for Super Typhoon Pongsona recovery efforts.

Section 7. The Department of Public Works shall coordinate and schedule with the Mayors of each Village the clean-up of Super Typhoon Pongsona debris within each Village.

Section 8. Transition Committee Appropriation.

- (\$150,000.00) is hereby appropriated from the General Fund to the Transition Committee established pursuant to the provisions of § 1502 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated for the purposes of ensuring the smooth transition from the out-going administration to the in-coming administration, and for other expenses of the Office of *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* associated with the transition activities, to include travel.
- (b) The Transition Committee is authorized to reimburse, from the appropriations made in Subsection (a) of this Section, any office or government entity for any expenditure of funds previously made for transition costs or activities.

Section 9. Assistance to Commercial Farmers.

(a) Grants to Farmers for Storm Damages. The sum of Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00) is hereby appropriated from Special Funds of the Executive Branch of the government of Guam for Super Typhoon Pongsona recovery efforts for the purpose of providing

disaster relief in the form of individual grants to *bona fide* commercial farmers on Guam, including aquaculture farmers, for losses incurred as a result of Super Typhoon Pongsona.

(b) Administration of Grants. The University of Guam's College of Agriculture and Life Sciences ("CALS") shall develop, within ten (10) calendar days of the enactment hereof, the grants authorized herein based upon an inversed sliding scale. The grants provided for in Subsection (a) herein shall be administered by CALS, in cooperation with the Department of Agriculture and the Guam Economic Development and Commerce Authority to insure accessibility and availability to all *bona fide* farmers on Guam. CALS is hereby authorized to utilize ten percent (10%) of the funds appropriated in Subsection (a) of this Section to offset the costs to develop and administer this program.

Section 10. Severability. *If* any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.

Executive Order 2002 - 26

RELATIVE TO ESTABLISHING PRIORITIES FOR GOVERNMENT CONSUMPTION OF FUEL AND FOR THE DEVELOPMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF AN INTERIM ISLAND TRANSPORTATION PLAN

WHEREAS, the island of Guam was hit by Super Typhoon Pongsona, with speeds in excess of 160 miles per hour on December 8, 2002; and

WHEREAS, the island suffered extensive damage to all of its infrastructure system including power, water, telephone, extensive damage to facilities at the Port Authority of Guam, the Antonio B. Won Pat International Airport Authority, the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority and other government facilities; and

WHEREAS, during Typhoon Pongsona, a Mobil fuel storage facility at Cabras Island caught on fire and has subsequently spread to other storage tanks co-located at this facility; and

WHEREAS, this fire has prevented the local gas companies on island from loading the gasoline from the remaining storage facilities at Cabras Island and servicing the island in an adequate and orderly manner; and

WHEREAS, such minimal petroleum products currently available must first be rationed to certain agencies of the government and key private industries so that critical supplies and services can continue to be available to the broadest number of people, including the maintenance of services at Guam's Port, Airport and Utility Agencies; and

WHEREAS, a unified command center has been established with Mobil Oil Guam, the Office of Civil Defense, and the United States Coast Guard to determine the best course of action to resolve the crisis and to establish a secure method in which shipments of gasoline can be received and distributed for island consumption; and

WHEREAS, the remaining gasoline on-island has been reserved by industry officials for emergency and critical operations of the government and the island community;

NOW THEREFORE, I, CARL T.C. GUTIERREZ, do hereby make the following

1. Establishment of Priorities & Plans for Government Fuel Consumption.

- A. The Director of the Department of Administration and the Chief Procurement Officer of the General Services Agency shall immediately prepare a plan of action for use by local gasoline companies to distribute the remaining reserve to government-licensed vehicles used only for emergency or critical operations to include the following.

 i. The authorization of propaging as a state of the contraction of
 - i. The authorization of procuring gas at the following rates: ten (10) gallons for sedan vehicles; twenty (20) gallons for mid-sized vehicles (vans, etc.); and thirty (30) gallons for large transportation vehicles.

- ii. The program will require that all odometer readings be taken for all government-vehicles that receive petroleum under this program.
- The program shall include authorization for gasoline purchase for iii. essential personnel (as determined by the Director Administration) using their privately owned vehicles. ív.
- Identifying which emergency response vendors shall be authorized for fueling (to include basic debris clean-up, gas-powered support vehicles, communications systems, etc.).
- Develop a program for meeting the fueling needs of the Mayors, if v.
- B. All Government Agencies shall adhere to and follow the plan of action resulting from this executive order relative to government fuel consumption.
- Reporting Requirement of Government Vehicle Inventory. The Director of the 2. Department of Public Works in conjunction with the Director of the Department of Revenue and Taxation shall provide the following information to the Director of
 - A. A listing of all government-vehicles from each agency and department.
 - B. Such listing shall include all diesel-powered vehicles.
- Development of Transportation Plan. The Director of Administration shall direct 3. the Guam Mass Transit Authority Division to integrate the following into a mass transit plan:
 - A. A system for mass transit for all essential personnel.
 - B. A system for Red Cross, Salvation Army and other volunteer programs.
 - C. A system for health and human services (medical professionals, nurses, dialysis patients, cancer patients, etc.)
 - D. A mass transits system for essential employees in the tourism industry, either through public or private means
 - E. If necessary, a system in which critical goods and services are distributed for public consumption
- Health Care Needs. The Director of the Department of Public Health and Social 4. Services, in consultation with the Administrator of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, and the Director of the Department of Mental Health & Substance Abuse, shall provide the following information to the Director of Administration to address
 - A. A listing of homebound patients requiring fuel for gas powered generators.
 - B. Identification of health issues in the villages.
 - C. Other essential health care providers necessary to meet the needs of the

WHEREAS, a unified command center has been established with Mobil Oil Guam, the Office of Civil Defense, and the United States Coast Guard to determine the best course of action to resolve the crisis and to establish a secure method in which shipments of gasoline can be received and distributed for island consumption; and

WHEREAS, the remaining gasoline on-island has been reserved by industry officials for emergency and critical operations of the government and the island community;

NOW THEREFORE, I, CARL T.C. GUTIERREZ, do hereby make the following declarations:

1. Establishment of Priorities & Plans for Government Fuel Consumption.

- A. The Director of the Department of Administration and the Chief Procurement Officer of the General Services Agency shall immediately prepare a plan of action for use by local gasoline companies to distribute the remaining reserve to government-licensed vehicles used only for emergency or critical operations to include the following.

 i. The authorization of pressuring and the Chief Procurement
 - The authorization of procuring gas at the following rates: ten (10) gallons for sedan vehicles; twenty (20) gallons for mid-sized vehicles (vans, etc.); and thirty (30) gallons for large transportation vehicles.

- The program will require that all odometer readings be taken for ii. all government-vehicles that receive petroleum under this program.
- The program shall include authorization for gasoline purchase for iii. essential personnel (as determined by the Director Administration) using their privately owned vehicles.
- Identifying which emergency response vendors shall be authorized iv. for fueling (to include basic debris clean-up, gas-powered support vehicles, communications systems, etc.).
- Develop a program for meeting the fueling needs of the Mayors, if ٧. possible.
- B. All Government Agencies shall adhere to and follow the plan of action resulting from this executive order relative to government fuel consumption.
- Reporting Requirement of Government Vehicle Inventory. The Director of the 2. Department of Public Works in conjunction with the Director of the Department of Revenue and Taxation shall provide the following information to the Director of
 - A. A listing of all government-vehicles from each agency and department.
 - B. Such listing shall include all diesel-powered vehicles.
- Development of Transportation Plan. The Director of Administration shall direct 3. the Guam Mass Transit Authority Division to integrate the following into a mass transit plan:
 - A. A system for mass transit for all essential personnel.
 - B. A system for Red Cross, Salvation Army and other volunteer programs.
 - C. A system for health and human services (medical professionals, nurses, dialysis patients, cancer patients, etc.)
 - D. A mass transits system for essential employees in the tourism industry, either through public or private means
 - E. If necessary, a system in which critical goods and services are distributed for public consumption
- 4. Health Care Needs. The Director of the Department of Public Health and Social Services, in consultation with the Administrator of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, and the Director of the Department of Mental Health & Substance Abuse, shall provide the following information to the Director of Administration to address health care needs:
 - A. A listing of homebound patients requiring fuel for gas powered generators.
 - B. Identification of health issues in the villages.
 - C. Other essential health care providers necessary to meet the needs of the community.

AN ACT TO REPEAL SECTION 4 OF PUBLIC LAW 26-85, AND TO WAIVE THE REQUIREMENT TO ARRANGE A LINE OF CREDIT FROM A BANK OF LENDING INSTITUTION LICENSED ON GUAM AS CONTAINED IN 5 GCA §22413 FOR FISCAL YEAR 2003.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

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- Section 1. Section 4 of Public Law 26-85 is hereby *repealed* in its entirety.
 - **Section 2.** For fiscal year 2003, the Governor may arrange a line of credit, as authorized and provided for in 5 GCA §22413, notwithstanding the requirement to borrow from a bank or lending institution licensed on Guam, as contained in 5 GCA §22413.
- 8 **Section 3. Severability.** *If* any provision of this Law or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to
- 10 law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this
- 11 Law which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application,
- 12 and to this end the provisions of this Law are severable.
