



4 158, is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

5 **"(4) School Aides Employed by DOE.** Notwithstanding any
6 other provision of law, administrative rules and regulations, School
7 Aides employed by the Department of Education may qualify for
8 financial assistance through the Guam Teacher Corps and may: (1)
9 continue such employment while enrolled in the Guam Teacher Corps;
10 *and* (2) enroll in the Guam Teacher Corps on part-time basis. Those
11 opting for part-time enrollment must be enrolled in *at least* six (6) credit
12 hours per semester and are entitled to a stipend equal to Fifty Percent
13 (50%) of the stipends provided for in Item (1) of this Section. School
14 Aides enrolled on a full-time basis while maintaining employment in
15 such capacity with the Department of Education are entitled to the full
16 stipend amounts as provided by Item (1) of this Section. For purposes
17 of this Section, *'Library Technicians'* employed by the Department of
18 Education are considered as School Aides.

19 Other employees within the Department of Education may qualify
20 for assistance as provided by this Section; *provided*, that such employees'
21 actual job duties primarily deal with the instruction or supervision of
22 students. A letter of recommendation from the applicant's supervisor
23 attesting to the applicant's job duties shall be required."






I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Education held a public hearing on Thursday, May 24, 2001 at 9:00 a.m. at I Liheslaturan Public Hearing Room.

II. Testimony

Dr. Roy T. Tsuda, Acting President, University of Guam. Dr. Tsuda testified in favor of the bill. He reassured the Committee that there has always been, and will continue to be support from the University for the endeavors of the Yamashita Corps. He noted that he found it odd, however, that the bill added only "Library Technicians". He suggested that the Committee may want to include other classes of employees as well.

Mr. George F. Pereda, Director, Yamashita Corps. Mr. Pereda testified in favor of the bill. He noted that since the passage of PL 25-158 in July of 2000, seven school aides were accepted into the program and expects the number to rise. He noted the enthusiasm within this group of students and believes that most will make teaching a career endeavor for many years. He suggested, however, the Committee may want to attract "broader perspective" employees by including eligibility for not just other DOE employees but other employees throughout the Government of Guam.

Ms. Rosie R. Tainatongo, Director of Education and Mr. Luis S.N. Reyes, Personnel Services Administrator, DOE. Mr. Reyes delivered that testimony of the Director of Education and responded to questions from the committee. He testified that DOE supports the intent of the bill and recommended that other DOE employees be included in the program.

III. Findings and Recommendation

The Committee finds that because of the interest and success with assisting DOE school aides to become teachers through the Teacher Corps component of the Yamashita Corps, that similar results could be obtained by providing such educational financial to Library Technicians and other DOE employees who work with children. Surveys of students and faculty involved in the school aide training programs at the Guam Community College have shown that many graduates have shown the desire and the initiative to pursue Teaching credentials. The same surveys also reveal that many of these individuals will continue to be employed long after their service credit obligations are repaid.

The bill's sponsor noted that the original bill added only Library Technicians to the definition of school aides since they were the only class of employees that directly expressed an interest in the program and informed him that much of their work is similar to the work expected of school aides. As a result of testimony received from the University of Guam, The Yamashita Corps and the Department of Education, the Committee recommends the inclusion of other employees that work with students. The Committee is not compelled to include all DOE employees because the University of Guam administers several other programs that can adequately provide financial assistance.

It is the recommendation of the Committee on Education that Substitute Bill No. 81 (COR) be reported out with the recommendation **TO DO PASS**.

Buenas yan Saludo! Thank you for inviting the Department of Education to submit testimony on BILL NO. 81 (LS): AN ACT TO AMEND §18202(B)(4) OF ARTICLE 2, CHAPTER 18, DIVISION 3 OF TITLE 17 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED RELATIVE TO INCLUDING LIBRARY TECHNICIANS EMPLOYED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION IN THE DEFINITION OF SCHOOL AIDES FOR PURPOSES OF PARTICIPATION IN THE TEACHER CORPS PROGRAM OF THE DR. ANTONIO C. YAMASHITA EDUCATOR CORPS.

The Department of Education supports the intent of this bill. In this manner, we support the inclusion of library technicians in the Guam Public Schools. However, the Department of Education recommends that other employees in the department who are interested in becoming certified teachers be given the same opportunity as school aides and library technicians to participate in the Dr. Antonio C. Yamashita Educator Corps program.

Several employees in other classes of positions have expressed their interests in becoming certified teachers such as those in the clerical positions. But they have been discouraged in pursuing college education because they have to pay for their education. Also, because they need the income to support themselves and their families, it prevents them from terminating employment to pursue education to

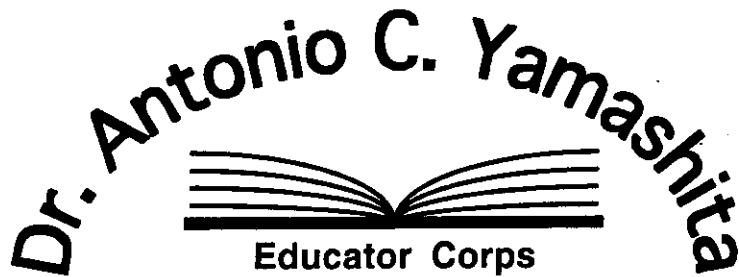
become certified teachers. These employees should then be given the equal opportunity as the school aides to maintain their employment as are now afforded school aides in the Department of Education.

When the Yamashita Educator Corps statute was amended to include school aides, there seems to have been an assumption that all school aides would be interested in becoming certified teachers. Now that library technicians are being considered for the Yamashita Educator Corps, it is also assumed that all would aspire to become classroom teachers. The department, therefore, takes the position that all other employees in the department who are interested in becoming certified teachers be included under the teacher corps since this will attract those who are truly interested in the teaching profession.

Again, thank you for giving the Department of Education the opportunity to submit testimony on BILL NO. 81 (LS) and to consider our recommendation to expand the opportunity to all other Department of Education employees.

Good Morning Mr. Chairman and members of the Committee on Education for Mina' Bente Seis na Liheslaturan Guahan. My name is George F. Pereda and I am the current director for the Dr. Antonio C. Yamashita Educator Corps. I would like at this time to enter some written and verbal testimony on Bill 81(LS) before your committee today.

I would like to report that the Yamashita Educator Corps currently has 7 school aide recipients on board as a result of the expansion of service benefits brought about by the passage of PL25-158 in July of last year. By all indications, that figure should see a steady and consistent increase over the next three to seven years. It is the contention of the Educator Corps Council that by allowing this recipient category to be enrolled on a part-time basis a true opportunity and incentive is being afforded to them to take on the challenge of higher education and to look more seriously into careers in the teaching field and beyond. There is a large number in the current pool of DOE school aides that, if given the opportunity and support for educational advancement, will make wonderful, effective teachers for our island's school system. But, then again, that can be said of other categories of employees within the Department of Education. It would then seem more reasonable to extend benefits eligibility to all Department of Education employees desiring to pursue teaching degrees and placement as certified classroom teachers, and not to limit it to the singular additional category of Library Technicians. It might even be argued that it would be most appropriate to extend part-time enrollment eligibility to all Government of Guam employees and to try and attract many more prospective teachers from that broad perspective. The question at hand would therefore be, to what extent should inclusion or exclusion of eligibility be made? The current bill should address this concern. Yamashita Educator Corps remains receptive to new recipient categories or to expansions of existing recipient categories.

I would be glad at this time to answer any questions you may have on the current operations of the Yamashita Educator Corps.



II. Testimony

Dr. Roy T. Tsuda, Acting President, University of Guam. Dr. Tsuda testified in favor of the bill. He reassured the Committee that there has always been, and will continue to be support from the University for the endeavors of the Yamashita Corps. He noted that he found it odd, however, that the bill added only "Library Technicians". He suggested that the Committee may want to include other classes of employees as well.

Mr. George F. Pereda, Director, Yamashita Corps. Mr. Pereda testified in favor of the bill. He noted that since the passage of PL 25-158 in July of 2000, seven school aides were accepted into the program and expects the number to rise. He noted the enthusiasm within this group of students and believes that most will make teaching a career endeavor for many years. He suggested, however, the Committee may want to attract "broader perspective" employees by including eligibility for not just other DOE employees but other employees throughout the Government of Guam.

Ms. Rosie R. Tainatongo, Director of Education and Mr. Luis S.N. Reyes, Personnel Services Administrator, DOE. Mr. Reyes delivered that testimony of the Director of Education and responded to questions from the committee. He testified that DOE supports the intent of the bill and recommended that other DOE employees be included in the program.

III. Findings and Recommendation

The Committee finds that because of the interest and success with assisting DOE school aides to become teachers through the Teacher Corps component of the Yamashita Corps, that similar results could be obtained by providing such educational financial to Library Technicians and other DOE employees who work with children. Surveys of students and faculty involved in the school aide training programs at the Guam Community College have shown that many graduates have shown the desire and the initiative to pursue Teaching credentials. The same surveys also reveal that many of these individuals will continue to be employed long after their service credit obligations are repaid.

The bill's sponsor noted that the original bill added only Library Technicians to the definition of school aides since they were the only class of employees that directly expressed an interest in the program and informed him that much of their work is similar to the work expected of school aides. As a result of testimony received from the University of Guam, The Yamashita Corps and the Department of Education, the Committee recommends the inclusion of other employees that work with students. The Committee is not compelled to include all DOE employees because the University of Guam administers several other programs that can adequately provide financial assistance.

It is the recommendation of the Committee on Education that Substitute Bill No. 81 (COR) be reported out with the recommendation **TO DO PASS**.

Yamashita Educator Corps program.

Several employees in other classes of positions have expressed their interests in becoming certified teachers such as those in the clerical positions. But they have been discouraged in pursuing college education because they have to pay for their education. Also, because they need the income to support themselves and their families, it prevents them from terminating employment to pursue education to

become certified teachers. These employees should then be given the equal opportunity as the school aides to maintain their employment as are now afforded school aides in the Department of Education.

When the Yamashita Educator Corps statute was amended to include school aides, there seems to have been an assumption that all school aides would be interested in becoming certified teachers. Now that library technicians are being considered for the Yamashita Educator Corps, it is also assumed that all would aspire to become classroom teachers. The department, therefore, takes the position that all other employees in the department who are interested in becoming certified teachers be included under the teacher corps since this will attract those who are truly interested in the teaching profession.

Again, thank you for giving the Department of Education the opportunity to submit testimony on BILL NO. 81 (LS) and to consider our recommendation to expand the opportunity to all other Department of Education employees.

Good Morning Mr. Chairman and members of the Committee on Education for Mina' Bente Seis na Liheslaturan Guahan. My name is George F. Pereda and I am the current director for the Dr. Antonio C. Yamashita Educator Corps. I would like at this time to enter some written and verbal testimony on Bill 81(LS) before your committee today.

I would like to report that the Yamashita Educator Corps currently has 7 school aide recipients on board as a result of the expansion of service benefits brought about by the passage of PL25-158 in July of last year. By all indications, that figure should see a steady and consistent increase over the next three to seven years. It is the contention of the Educator Corps Council that by allowing this recipient category to be enrolled on a part-time basis a true opportunity and incentive is being afforded to them to take on the challenge of higher education and to look more seriously into careers in the teaching field and beyond. There is a large number in the current pool of DOE school aides that, if given the opportunity and support for educational advancement, will make wonderful, effective teachers for our island's school system. But, then again, that can be said of other categories of employees within the Department of Education. It would then seem more reasonable to extend benefits eligibility to all Department of Education employees desiring to pursue teaching degrees and placement as certified classroom teachers, and not to limit it to the singular additional category of Library Technicians. It might even be argued that it would be most appropriate to extend part-time enrollment eligibility to all Government of Guam employees and to try and attract many more prospective teachers from that broad perspective. The question at hand would therefore be, to what extent should inclusion or exclusion of eligibility be made? The current bill should address this concern. Yamashita Educator Corps remains receptive to new recipient categories or to expansions of existing recipient categories.

I would be glad at this time to answer any questions you may have on the current operations of the Yamashita Educator Corps.

Fiscal Note Comments to Bill No. 81 (LS)
June 5, 2001

The intent of this Bill is to include Library Technicians employed by the Department of Education under the definition of School Aides as prescribed by Section 18202(b)(4) of Article 2, Chapter 18, Division 3 of Title 17 of the Guam Code Annotated.

A fiscal impact will be realized once Library Technicians enroll in the Guam Teacher Corps Program and begin receiving financial assistance. Additionally, this may result in either additional appropriation to the Guam Teacher Corps Program in order to accommodate the new recipients per this Bill or a decrease in financial assistance to current recipients in order to absorb the cost of the new enrollees.
