Dear Legislative Secretary Brown:

Enclosed please find Substitute Bill No. 43 (COR) entitled: "AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE "COMMUNITY PUBLIC WELFARE DISENTITLEMENT REVIEW TASK FORCE" TO ADDRESS THE IMPENDING EMERGENCY RELATED TO THE TERMINATION OF SPECIFIC SOCIAL WELFARE BENEFITS" which I have signed into law as Public Law No. 26-46.

This legislation creates a task force consisting of government and community representatives concerning the situation that will shortly present itself to our island on July 1, 2002, where many current recipients of public assistance will no longer be eligible for this assistance.

The task force will seek to outline the impact of this termination, including statistics, calculate "cost savings" for government subsidies, and offer recommendations for the transition of these cases.

Welfare reform legislation has instituted this sunset date for receipt of public assistance to those who have received benefits for 60 months in an effort to work with the individuals and families to make them self sufficient or employed. This will be difficult in these economic times.

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE "COMMUNITY PUBLIC WELFARE DISENTITLEMENT REVIEW TASK FORCE" TO ADDRESS THE IMPENDING EMERGENCY RELATED TO THE TERMINATION OF SPECIFIC SOCIAL WELFARE BENEFITS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan
- 3 finds that over the past several years numerous individuals and families have
- 4 been recipients of public welfare services through the Department of Public
- 5 Health and Social Services ("DPH&SS"). The public welfare program has

been provided to eligible individuals and families who for years have
experienced difficulty in meeting their needs.

These programs, which in some cases have been jointly funded through Federal and local funds, have provided a considerable level of support to its recipients. In 1997 the U.S. Congress passed welfare reform legislation that would significantly impact the program and its recipients. This included a time restriction of five (5) years a recipient can receive applicable public welfare benefits. The individuals and families that will be affected by this restriction upon the realization of the initial five (5) years since the enactment of the welfare reform Federal legislation will be *directly* impacted on July 01, 2002. This restriction will present a tremendous challenge to the Guam community, because it may leave many individuals and families in a very difficult predicament. This at a time when Guam is still in the process of recovering from its economic challenges experienced over the past five (5) years.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that the timeframe eligibility restriction would apply to the General Assistance Program and the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Program of DPH&SS, and it will affect the other public welfare programs that are administered by DPH&SS.

Therefore, this provision would require the establishment of a community task force which will review this impending ineligibility restriction for public benefits, and insure the formulation of a plan necessary to address this situation. Due to the huge impact that this would have on the community, with the potential for many individuals and families to be left without the support of these much-needed programs and services, it is

I. PUBLIC HEARING

BILL NO. 43 (COR) was introduced on March 14, 2001 and referred to the Committee on Public Works, Health and Human Services ("the Committee") on March 30, 2001. Fiscal note was requested from the Bureau of Budget and Management Research on May 1, 2001 and was received on June 18, 2001. (See attachment B)

The Committee called a public hearing to order at 9:15 a.m., Tuesday, June 12, 2001 to hear testimony on **BILL NO. 43 (COR)**. The hearing was held in the Public Hearing Room of I Liheslaturan Guåhan in Hagåtña. Notices were placed in the Pacific Daily News in compliance with stipulations mandated for proper notification of the public.

The hearing was called to order by Senator Eddie Baza Calvo, Chairman, Committee on Public Works, Public Health and Social Services, with Senators Tom C. Ada and Frank B. Aguon, Jr. in attendance.

II. TESTIMONY

Mr. Dennis Rodriguez, Ms. Diana Calvo and Mr. Delos Santos testified in support of the measure.

II. FINDINGS

Federal reforms created the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) block grant in August 1996 which added time limits, work requirements and new sanctions while expanding support services to help recipients find and keep jobs. In 1997 the U.S. Congress passed welfare reform legislation that would significantly impact the program and its recipients that included a time restriction of five (5) years a recipient can receive applicable public welfare benefits. The Committee finds that in September 2000, Guam adopted its own welfare reform, Public Law 25-163, revising the Medically Indigent Program (MIP). The reform affords greater access to program services, provides for efficiency in program operations, better allocation of scarce government resources and to more efficiently provide health care services to our families most in need effective October 1, 2001. Along with emphasis on work, reform recognizes the necessity of helping recipients overcome barriers that have kept them from employment such as childcare and transportation. The Committee further finds the five-year restriction directly impacts individuals and families under the General Assistance Program and the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Program on July 01, 2002. The Committee further finds it is of utmost importance to establish a community task force to review the impending ineligibility restriction for public benefits. The Committee finds that a proactive discussion can insure the formulation of a plan of action on identifying solutions addressing the potential impact for many individuals and families to be left without the support of these much needed programs and services. The Committee recommends the composition of the Community Public Welfare Disentitlement Review Task Force include a member of the Medically Indigent Program Advisory Council.

IV. RECOMMENDATION

The Committee on Public Works, Health and Human Services does hereby report out **SUBSTITUTE BILL NO. 43 (COR)**, to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, with the recommendation **TO DO PASS.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings/Intent.

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The Liheslaturan Guahan finds that over the past several years numerous 2 individuals and families have been recipients of public welfare services through the Department of Public Health and Social Services. The public welfare program 4 has been provided to eligible individuals and families who for years have 5 experienced difficulty in meeting their needs. These programs, which in some 6 cases have been jointly funded through federal and local funds, have provided a 7 considerable level of support to its recipients. In 1997 the U. S. Congress passed 8 welfare reform legislation that would significantly impact the program and its 9 recipients, this included a time restriction of five (5) years a recipient can receive 10 applicable public welfare benefits. The individuals and families that will be 11 affected by this restriction upon the realization of the initial five years since the 12

enactment of the welfare reform federal legislation will be directly impacted on July 01, 2002. This restriction will present a tremendous challenge to the island community because it may leave many individuals and families in a very difficult predicament. This at a time when the island is still in the process of recovering from its economic challenges experienced over the past three years.

The Liheslaturan Guahan further finds that the timeframe eligibility restriction would apply to the General Assistance Program and the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families Program of the Department of Public Health and Social Services, and it will may not affect the other public welfare programs that are administered by the agency.

Therefore this provision would require the establishment of a community task force which will review this impending ineligibility restriction for public benefits and insure the formulation of a plan necessary to address this situation. Due to the huge impact that this would have on the community, with the potential for many individuals and families to be left without the support of these much-needed programs and services, it is imperative that proactive discussion commence immediately and ideas be formulated to work on identifying solutions to address this community concern.

Section 2. Establishment of the "Community Public Welfare Disentitlement Review Task Force".

There is hereby established the "Community Public Welfare Disentitlement Review Task Force" (the "Task Force") which shall be responsible for the overall review of the five-year federal welfare reform timeframe restriction imposed upon specific public welfare programs of the Department of Public Health and Social Services (the "Department"), and its impending impact on the local community.

1	The review and analysis of the five-year restriction for public welfare
2	recipients by the Task Force shall conclude the formulation of a plan of action
3	which shall incorporate the following:

- 1.) Identify the number of individuals and families within the respective programs who will be affected by such restrictions commencing with July 01, 2002 and to include each of the following three years;
 - 2.) Identify the cumulative financial impact or loss of benefits for General Assistance and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families recipients who will be immediately impacted;
 - 3.) Prepare a proposal, to contain solutions, for addressing the significant impact the loss of such benefits would have on these welfare recipients.
 - 4.) Present ideas for assisting these individuals and families to transition from the program to a situation with no or minimal public welfare support from pertinent public benefits programs.

Section 3. Composition of the Community Public Welfare Disentitlement Review Task Force.

The Community Public Welfare Task Disentitlement Review Task Force shall be composed of the following individuals or representatives:

- 1. The Director of the Department of Public Health and Social Services, who shall be the Chairperson;
- 2. The Director of the Bureau of Planning;

3. Two representatives from the business community, to be recommended by the Guam Chamber of Commerce and appointed by I Maga'Lahen Guahan (Governor of Guam);

- 1 4. A mayor from the Mayor's Council of Guam, to be appointed by the
 2 President of the Council;
- 5. The Chairperson of the Committee on Health of the Liheslaturan Guahan;
- 6. A Senator to be appointed by the Speaker of the Liheslaturan Guahan; and
- 7. Four additional individuals representing the general community, two of whom shall be present recipients of the programs, to be selected and appointed by the Maga'Lahen Guahan.

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The Department shall provide the personnel and logistics support necessary for the Task Force to carry out its responsibilities and duties. Such support shall cease upon the termination of the Task Force.

13 The Task Force shall be formed and meet no later than thirty (30) days upon 14 the enactment of this Act.

Section 4. Formulation of a Written Report of Findings and Recommendations.

A written comprehensive report shall be prepared by the Task Force which shall include its findings, recommendations and proposed plan of action for addressing the community concern. The Chairperson of the Task Force shall present copies of the report to the Maga'lahen Guahan (Governor of Guam) and to the Lihelsaturan Guahan (Guam Legislature) no later than fifteen days upon the completion and acceptance of the report by the Task Force.

Section 5. Termination of the Community Public Welfare Disentitlement Review Task Force.

The Community Public Welfare Disentitlement Review Task Force shall have one hundred and eighty (180) days from its initial meeting to complete its

- work as outlined above, and shall immediately terminate upon the completion and
- 2 transmittal of the written report as required in the previous section above. The
- members of the Task Force may be called upon at any time subsequent to its
- 4 termination to provide information or to respond to inquiries about its findings and
- 5 recommendations contained within the written report.
