Dear Legislative Secretary Brown:

Enclosed please find Bill No. 209 (LS) "AN ACT TO AMENI) § 16(c) OF CHAPTER III OF P.L. NO. 26-35, RELATIVE TO GUAM VISITORS BUREAU APPROPRIATIONS" which was I have signed into law as Public Law No. 26-67.

There are some inconsistencies in this legislation, because Section 16(c) was added in Public Law No. 26-35, but deleted along with Sections 16 (b) and (d) in Public Law No. 26-36.

Section 16(c), as originally enacted in Public Law No. 26-35, provided for a 5% transfer authority between the marketing items within the budget of the Guam Visitors Bureau. All of the transfer flexibility was subsequently deleted in the amendment made to Section 16 in Public Law No. 26-36.

The original bill No. 209 removed the language restricting the transfer authority to 5%, to allow the GVB to transfer more than 5% between marketing item categories. The original bill also added language: "These funds shall not be subject to the transfer authority of I Maga'lahen Guåhan". The final version of this bill, now acted upon, reinstates the 5% transfer authority that was originally contained in Public Law No. 26-35, but now includes the language: "These funds shall not be subject to the transfer authority of I Maga'lahen Guåhan".

arrivals expected to remain well below previous years' arrivals. The hotels, restaurants, tour operators and other businesses that rely upon tourists are struggling to survive. As such, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that there is a need for GVB to adjust its marketing budgets to better serve the needs of the Island's visitor industry. It is the intent of this legislation to allow GVB the transfer authority to move funds among its marketing areas. *However*, GVB

shall *not* use the funds for any other purpose.

- **Section 2.** Section 16(c) of Chapter III of Public Law Number 26-35 is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

mmittee on Tourism, Thank you for the Act to Amend Section and other purposes of propriations.

in past years, we have been witness to events that affected our tourism industry and island's economy such as the KAL ± 1 crash and the Asian Economic Crisis. During these times, we were proceed with promising marketing opportunities that would allow for recovery and prosperity. However, most of the opportunities had to be passed on because funding was not available in marketing budgets.

However, knowing the importance to recover from these events, we had to alter and sometimes cancel scheduled marketing promotions and activities to tackle what was more real and present to our island's situation.

Due to the 9-11 tragedic transport product to the funds within our Japan budget to implement the \$1.6 million recovery plan. Similar circumstances were also applied to our Korea efforts. And, with the future prospect of including Guam on the approved destination for travel list in China, we must also re-evaluate marketing dollars.

We know that we will have to look at our entire marketing budget and reallocate the bottom line figures in order to accommodate programs and activities for our more lucrative markets of Japan and Korea.

These incidents are just some examples of how GVB had to redirect marketing funds for emergency or recovery efforts. The goal continues to be that we need to maintain or build Guam's image as an ideal visitor destination, and for this reason, we need the flexibility to transfer funds within the Bureau's appropriation.

We all hope and pray that there will never be another "September 11" attack, however, in this volatile industry that we live and work in, we must be able to react quickly to address challenges and obstacles along the way.
