AN ACT TO *ADD* A NEW §66202.1 TO TITLE 21, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO REQUIRE GOVERNMENT, AUTONOMOUS, AND PUBLIC ENTITIES TO OBTAIN PERMITS FOR CLEARING, GRADING, AND CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS.

#### 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds that
- 3 there is a need to ensure that the government of Guam follows the same
- 4 permitting requirements for environmental projects requiring clearing,
- 5 grading and construction as private citizens.
- 6 Section 2. A new §66202.1 is hereby added to Title 21, Guam Code
- 7 Annotated, to read as follows:

"§66202.1. (a) A permit for Clearing, Grading, and Construction 1 shall be required of government, autonomous, and public entities in the 2 same manner as private citizens. An application for the permit shall be 3 submitted to the Department of Public Works by the entity who owns the 4 property, or which is to authorize, complete, or contract for the proposed 5 project on government land, with the approval of the following agencies 6 indicated on the application to the Department of Public Works: 7 8 Department of Land Management, Zoning Division; Department of Parks and Recreation; Guam Power Authority; Guam Environmental Protection 9 10 Agency; Guam Telephone Authority; Guam Geodetic Network Survey 11 Division; and the Department of Public Works. No fee shall be charged for 12 government application for a permit pursuant hereto and the application 13 shall be submitted in such form as the Building Official may prescribe. 14 Government entities shall be subject to all other applicable provisions of 15 this Chapter. Clearing, grading, or construction shall *not* begin on any 16 government property or project in violation of this statute. 17 Officials and Guam Peace Officers are authorized to issue citations to 18 violators of this Section in accordance with the Rules and Regulations 19 promulgated by the Department of Public Works in this regard. Officers 20 acting in violation of this statute shall be held personally liable for all damages resulting therefrom, and shall be subject to a fine of One 21 22 Thousand Dollars (\$1,000) for each offense, and may be fined up to Five 23 Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) for violations after the third violation of this 24 Section.

(b) Government, autonomous, and public entities shall not be

- 2 response to typhoons, earthquakes, or other natural disaster or emergency
- 3 as declared by I Maga'lahen Guåhan and requiring an immediate response in

Dear Mr. Speaker:

Transmitted herewith is Bill No. 193 (COR), "AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 66202.1 TO TITLE 21, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED AN ACT TO REQUIRING GOVERNMENT, AUTONOMOUS AND PUBLIC ENTITIES TO OBTAIN PERMITS FOR CLEARING, GRADING AND CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS", which I have vetoed.

While I understand the intent of this measure and can appreciate the concern that the government of Guam should be held to the same standards as private sector customers, the clearing, grading and construction projects conducted by the government of Guam often involve responses to customer needs, such as those of the Guam Power Authority, the Guam Telephone Authority, the Guam Waterworks Authority and other services that often require immediate remedy or repair. The delay that would result from the additional permitting requirements will only erode the level of customer service these government agencies are able to provide.

In most cases, the government of Guam contracts large clearing, grading and construction projects to private construction and development companies, which are responsible to secure the appropriate permitting prior to the start of each project.

For these reasons I have vetoed this measure.

#### I. OVERVIEW

#### A. Purpose and Essential Elements

To ensure that Government of Guam agencies and departments, whether it be a line or autonomous, follows the same permitting requirements for environmental projects requiring clearing, grading and construction as private citizens.

#### SECTION BY SECTION

Section 1. Legislative Finding: Legislature finds a need to ensure that Government of Guam follows the same permitting requirements for environmental projects requiring clearing, grading and construction as private citizens.

Section 2. Adds a new section 66202.1 to Title 21, Guam Code Annotated-requiring government, autonomous and public entities to apply for permits for clearing, grading and construction in the same manner as private citizens.

- 1. Application for permit to be submitted to DPW by entity that owns property or which to authorize, complete or contract for the proposed project on government land and gain clearance by all departments listed on the application.
- 2. No fee shall be charged for government application for permit but all other applicable provisions shall apply except for fee.
- 3. Clearing, grading or construction shall not begin on government property or it would be in violation.
- 4. Building officials and Guam peace officers are authorized to issue citations to violators/Officers in violation shall be personally liable for all damages resulting and shall be subject to \$1,000.00 for each offense and may be fined up to \$5,000 for violations after the third violation.

#### **B.** Public Hearing Conducted

The Committee on Economic Development, Retirement, Investments, Public Works and Regulatory Functions conducted a public hearing on Wednesday, November 12, 2003 in the Legislative Public Hearing Room, I Liheslaturan Guahan, in Hagatna. Public notice was provided on November 6, 2003

Committee Chairwoman Toni Sanford called the public hearing to order at approximately 12:20 p.m. in the Legislative Public Hearing Room. Committee members present were: Senators Robert Klitzkie, Tina Muna-Barnes, and Carmen Fernandez.

Individuals who appeared before the Committee and provided testimony were: John Benavente, General Manager of Guam Power Authority and Fred Castro, Administrator of Guam Environmental Protection Agency

Another written testimony that was submitted and did not appear before the Committee: Gerald S.A. Perez, Administrator for Guam Economic Development and Commerce Authority.

#### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

Mr. John Benavente, Guam Power Authority General Manager appeared before the Committee and provided oral testimony and comments on the bill. Mr. Benavente stated while he supports the intent of Bill 193, he provide proposed amendments to the bill at a later date.

In his oral testimony before the Committee, Mr. Benavente stated GPA does follow the permit – clearing and grading law – however, in the area of maintenance work; line extensions; tree trimming – maintenance within the right of ways and other government – which; GPA does get clearance from GTA, GWA, and DPW, also from the SHPO archeological approval from the Department of Parks and Recreation. GPA is concerned the permitting process might get too lengthy – emergency work to restore – and this bill does this, more the intention of the construction.

In his written testimony (attached) submitted to the Committee subsequent to the November 12, 2003 Public Hearing, Mr. Benevente had stated that GPA be exempt from getting permit to do the following work:

- Pole installation (pole digging) for line extensions
- Conductor upgrades/changes
- Maintenance of existing poles and lines (replacing and repairing)
- Tree-trimming and grubbing (clearing trees above ground)
- In-house cable pulling in underground conduits
- In-house work within substations or power plants
- Construction during typhoon restoration (NEPA and SHPO approval obtained during restoration)
- Responding to emergency oil spills (permits process will hamper response)

Mr. Benavente in his written testimony states that if permits will be required, this will lengthen the processing time of customer work orders and the response time to maintenance and emergency situations. GPA's focus remains to ensure that any new policy will only enhance GPA's service reliability and customer satisfaction.

Mr. Fred Castro, Guam Environmental Protection Agency Director appeared before the Committee and provided written and oral testimony containing comments on the bill. Mr. Castro stated he feels honored, if there is one Government of Guam agency that has been a model agency in terms of regulatory, safety, and compliance – they manage – they have put on line the most complex broad based system and they have done it commendably. Problems would come from other regulatory considerations like breakage of old pipes and spills and they have been very responsive. They have established within their agency an environmental regulatory compliance capacity. You don't see that at DPW or any of

the other autonomous agencies, but you do see that at GPA. You have to have a very keen conscience awareness of potential environmental impacts. Sometimes when these things happen the adverse impacts are irreversible.

Mr. Castro in his written testimony states that this proposed legislation would statutorily address problems and lessons encountered with public projects that by-pass and receives no thorough review and analysis from appropriate permitting agencies of the Government of Guam. Certain adverse environmental and financial impacts are irreversible and costly once clearing, grading, and construction activities proceed. Overall interest of the public need to be protected and states that this Bill serves to do just that recognizing that government project rate as relatively some of the largest and most complex.

Senator Sanford had stated that DPW is not represented in the Public Hearing this morning. They were invited to be here. She thinks their absence here is very loud. We are going to follow up with our director here. The permitting section and if the GPA and administrator for GEPA is here we think the director for DPW should have been here.

Mr. Castro indicated that the problems of Southern High School, the drainage on Marine drive those we can pre-empt; Government of Guam agencies are among the biggest violators. One house out of set if we circumvent then the whole house falls down. Could be avoided if the permits – if there was some review where to dig.

**Senator Sanford** pointed out that there are some instances where she hears on the radio where they have some construction going on and they cut the whole telephone system. She is not sure if some of these problems can be avoided if the permits have been taken into consideration if there has been some review of where to dig and not to dig.

Mr. Castro says that is a simple fix, and if you can envision the hundreds of restoration projects – we can be in a better posture.

Senator Muna-Barnes had stated that DPW is responsible for issuing the permits and do they issue permits to themselves as well as payment. The approving authority is the director and he is personally liable. We need a clarification what officials are liable? Amendment to clarify definition of officials. The title of the bill says "government, autonomous and public entities" and she asked if the word government should be replaced with line agencies, for clarity. She does support the intent of this bill. There has been some instances where Department of Parks and Recreation did have some concerns with environmental work that came into play when there was not any permits issued and no process that DPW made any clearances; She would like to be a co-sponsor.

Senator Klitzkie asked about the bill containing a prohibition, a special permitting.

Mr. Castro commented about on a national level, for example on wetlands, they have what they call nationwide permits. We can negotiate and issue certain blanket type permits for similar type projects and negotiate for example a major project, for a general

clearance – simplify the procedures to handle phases of construction that were expedited and alleviate any problems of delays.

Senator Fernandez stated that she fully supports the bill.

#### III. COMMITTEE FINDINGS/COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Economic Development, Retirement, Investments, Public Works, and Regulatory Functions recommends that <u>BILL 193: "AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 66202.1 TO TITLE 21, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED REQUIRING GOVERNMENT, AUTONOMOUS AND PUBLIC ENTITIES TO OBTAIN PERMITS FOR CLEARING, GRADING AND CONSTRUCTION PROJECT" to be hereby reported out of Committee with the recommendation **TO PASS**.</u>

This testimony is submitted in strong favor of Bill No. 193 COR: "AN ACT TO ADD A NEW SECTION 66202.1 TO TITLE 21, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED REQUIRING GOVERNMENT, AUTONOMOUS AND PUBIC ENTITIES TO OBTAIN PERMITS FOR CLEARING, GRADING AND CONSTRUCTION PROJECT."

This proposed legislation would statutorily address previous problems and lessons encountered with public projects that by-pass and receive no thorough review and analysis from appropriate permitting agencies of the Government of Guam.

- (3) Section 2 line 1, delete after Land Management and insert <u>Department of before</u> "Parks"; line 7 <u>Grading</u>, and line 9, <u>Officials and Guam Peace Officers</u>, lower case.

Dear Senator Sanford:

The Guam Power Authority is submitting written testimony regarding Bill 193, an act requiring government, autonomous and public entities to obtain permits for clearing, grading and construction projects. The concern is that if elements of the bill are not clarified, additional unnecessary time and costs will be expended, GPA's ability to respond to emergencies will be restricted and GPA's operations and service to its ratepayers will be unduly affected.

The Authority is unclear of the definition of "environmental projects." However, the Authority does obtain permits through the Department of Public Works for large projects that involve contractors performing major trenching or clearing. Work performed by GPA without a permit is limited to existing facilities or areas that have already been permitted for clearing, grading and construction, work related to typhoon restoration and work involving responding to emergency oil spills. GPA obtains clearances from GTA, GWA, and SHPO at all times prior to new pole installations or pole change-outs. Additionally, new pole locations are surveyed to ensure they are within the defined rights-of-way. Consequently, GPA is requesting an exemption for the following work:

- Pole installations (pole digging) for line extensions
- o Conductor upgrades/changes
- o Maintenance of existing poles and lines (replacing and repairing)
- o Tree trimming and grubbing (clearing trees above ground)
- o In-house cable pulling in underground conduits
- o In-house work within substations or power plants
- o Construction during typhoon restoration (NEPA and SHPO approval obtained during
- o Responding to emergency oil spills (permit process will hamper response)

If permits will be required, this will lengthen the processing time of customer work orders and the response time to maintenance and emergency situations. GPA's focus remains to ensure that any new policy will only enhance GPA's service reliability and customer satisfaction. Thank you for the opportunity to submit written testimony to further clarify this bill.
