

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, in its support of our Veterans, would like to ensure that they have a place that is conveniently located and equipped with ample parking facilities accessible to the physically disabled, where they can conduct Veterans-related business. To this end, the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority has leased

*"LOT 8, BLOCK 19, TRACT 2025", which includes a two-story building, to*the Veterans Affairs Office for its use. The two-story building, which has been
vacant and left in disrepair, is in need of extensive renovation before it can be
effectively utilized as a Veterans Affairs Office. It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to appropriate the funds needed to the Veterans Affairs
Office for the renovation of this facility.

Section 2. Appropriation to the Office of Veterans Affairs. There is
hereby appropriated the sum of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
(\$150,000.00) from the General Fund to the Office of Veterans Affairs for the
repair and renovation of Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority LOT
8, BLOCK 19, TRACT 2025 so as to meet acceptable building occupancy
standards. The expenditure of said funds shall be in compliance with all
government of Guam procurement regulations and the laws of Guam.

Section 3. Reporting. A quarterly report shall be submitted by the
 Administrator of Veterans Affairs to *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* and the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, reporting on the progress made until completion of the
 project with respect to this specific appropriation.



Committee Report On Bill No. 380 (COR)

"AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE ONE HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$150,000.00) FROM THE GENERAL FUND TO THE OFFICE OF VETERANS AFFAIRS FOR THE NECESSARY REPAIR AND RENOVATION OF THE BUILDING LOCATED ON LOT 8, BLOCK 19, TRACT 2025 FOR THE VETERANS OF GUAM."



#### I. Overview

The Committee on Appropriations and Budgeting, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform held a public hearing on Bill No. 380 (COR) at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, November 19, 2004 in the Public Hearing Room, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*. Public notice for this hearing was made on: Friday, November 12, 2004 and Thursday, November 18, 2004 in the Pacific Daily News in the form of a paid advertisement.

Senators present at the public hearing were:

Vice Speaker Frank B. Aguon, Jr., Chairman Senator Toni Sanford, Vice-Chair Senator Carmen Fernandez, Member Speaker ben pangelinan Senator Robert Klitzkie

#### II. Summary of testimony

Senator Carmen Fernandez, main sponsor of Bill 380, was invited by the Chairman to elaborate on the history and intent of the bill. The senator requested qualified contractors to provide estimates for the scope of work needed on the structure identified. They have assured her that \$150,000 is adequate to complete this renovation.

**Mr. Juan Finoña,** President of Vietnam Veterans Association Chapter 668, appeared in support of Bill 380 and Major Benjamin Guerrero, admnistrator of the Veterans Affairs Office. Veterans need a stable location to call their own, to locate counseling, coordinate benefit and medical assistance, and provide a meeting location. Veteran community is getting larger: 4000-5000 retirees, plus about 8000 total known resident veterans. They are still trying to locate more. They aspire to have their own Veteran's Affairs office relationship with the federal agency, instead of the current/historical "piggybacking" off Hawaii.

**Major Benjamin Guerrero**, Administrator of the Veterans Affairs Office, thanked the bill's sponsor and Ronald DeGuzman for moving on this matter. The central Guam Asan location is the site of Guam's liberation landing, and is close to USNH and the Veterans Cemetary. With a T-1 line, direct on-line access to case files in Honolulu will be immediate. The office has worked 1060 health, counseling and benefits cases, injecting an additional \$12 million into Guam's economy. In addition to 8806 veteran visitors, they have 26,000 records on site, and are preparing to handle Iraq veterans. In response to questioning by the Chairman, MAJ Guerrero stated that they want the renovations to be done right, and can stay at Tiyan for another year. MAJ Guerrero

announced his impending retirement, on November 26. he will continue to volunteer until the office is staffed.

In response to questioning by Senator Klitzkie, MAJ Guerrero responded that the local office administers federal Veterans Administration programs and procedures. It has no social workers; those are provided by a federal office. The proposed new office is a two-story building located next to the former Joe & Flo's in Asan. Because the VAO is under the Department of Military Affairs, that department's staff will help with contractor procurement.

**Ronald DeGuzman**, administrator of the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority, appeared to clarify concerns about the lot title and renovation funding status. GHURA extended a rent-free lease after the Governor forwarded a VAO request. The VAO was approved among six applicants. The rent-free lease can be expanded if this bill passes and funds are available for renovation. GHURA will continue to hold title. The VAO is considered a "general governmental use" and therefore not eligible for grant assistance for renovations.

**Chairman Aguon** mentioned that the 27<sup>th</sup> Guam Legislature appropriated funds for two Veterans Affairs Office positions in FY2004, and two more in FY2005. The Vice-Speaker expressed his hopes that these positions will be filled as intended, and thanked the volunteers for assisting in the meantime. He thanked GHURA for accommodating VAO's needs.

#### **III.** Findings and recommendation

The Committee on Appropriations and Budgeting, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform finds that Bill No. 380 (COR) will appropriate the needed funds to renovate a facility to permanently house the Veterans Affairs Office.

Accordingly, the Committee on Appropriations and Budgeting, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform, to which Bill No. 380 (COR) was referred does hereby submit to *I Mina' Bente Siete Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* **TO DO PASS** Bill No. 380 (COR): "An Act to appropriate One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) from the General Fund to the Office of Veterans Affairs for the necessary repair and renovation of the building located on Lot 8, Block 19, Tract 2025 for the veterans of Guam".
