AN ACT TO *ADD* SECTION 5212 TO CHAPTER 5 OF TITLE 5 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO CLARIFY BID SECURITY AND PERFORMANCE BOND REQUIREMENTS FOR CONTRACTORS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan
- 3 finds that a notable omission within Guam's Procurement Laws is a
- 4 provision that specifically addresses the requirements for bid security and
- 5 performance bonds relative to various products and services from
- 6 contractors who are participating in competitive sealed bidding. Instead,

1 security and performance bonds are presently determined2 administratively.

I Liheslatura further finds that the administrative practice of requiring successful bidders to post a performance bond equal to one hundred percent (100%) of the bid amount is excessive in some cases, such as when a procurement is limited to supplies or services. It is often quite difficult for small local businesses to tie up their available cash in large performance bonds, and it is likely that contractors could offer lower bid prices *if* such onerous requirements for performance bonds were not administratively applied.

I Liheslatura additionally recognizes that requiring one hundred percent (100%) performance bonds from successful bidders may have become an administrative substitute for a "determination of bidder responsibility". If this is the case, the practice would be in direct violation of the general provisions of the Guam Administrative Rules that prescribes specific bid security and performance bond requirements applicable to the competitive sealed bidding procurement of supplies or services.

I Liheslatura finds that the act authorizes the General Services Administration Policy Office to establish or revise regulations under the Administrative Adjudication Act in conformity with these specific requirements.

It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to add specific language to the law concerning bid security and performance bond requirements for contractors that are participating in competitive sealed

bidding, to allow greater participation by small, local businesses and to
reduce the overall cost of government.

Section 2. Bid Security and Performance Bond Requirement for Bidders. A new §5212 is hereby *added* to Part B of Article 3 of Chapter 5 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated, to read:

"§5212. Bid Security and Performance Bond Requirement for Contractors.

- (a) Requirement for Bid Security. Bid security shall be required for all competitive sealed bidding for the procurement of supplies or services when the total price is estimated by the Chief Procurement Officer to exceed Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00). Bid security shall be a bond provided by a surety company authorized to do business in Guam, or the equivalent in cash, or otherwise supplied in a form satisfactory to the government of Guam. Nothing herein prevents the requirement of such bonds on the procurement of supplies or services totaling fewer than Twenty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) when a written determination and justification for such requirement is included as an integral part of the Invitation for Bid solicitation package.
- (b) **Amount of Bid Security.** Bid security shall be in an amount equal to fifteen percent (15%) of the total amount bid.
- (c) **Release of Bid Security.** The bid security required above under any applicable Invitation for Bid shall *not* be released upon award of the bid, but instead shall continue in full force and effect until delivery of the supplies or services required by any contract

awarded to contractor under the associated Invitation for Bid is completed.

- (d) Action against Bid Security. In the event that a successful bidder fails to complete delivery of supplies or services as required in the contract between such contractor and the government of Guam, the government of Guam may proceed to procure such supplies or services from the next lowest bidder who is able to deliver such supplies or services. The government of Guam may retain so much of the bid security as may be required to compensate the government for damages arising from contractor's failure to complete delivery of such supplies or services, and the government of Guam may also bring an action in the Superior Court of Guam against the contractor for direct damages, *if* any, beyond the amount of the bid security posted except that no action against bid security maybe taken in such circumstances where supplies or services are terminated due to the government of Guam's failure to pay for such services or supplies on a timely basis.
- (e) Rejection of Bids for Noncompliance with Bid Security Requirements. When the Invitation for Bids requires bid security, noncompliance requires that the bid be rejected unless, pursuant to Policy Office regulations, it is determined that the bid fails to comply in a non-substantial manner with the security requirements.
- (f) Withdrawal of Bids. After the bids are opened, they shall be irrevocable for the period specified in the Invitation for Bids, except as provided in §5211(f) of this Chapter. *If* a bidder is

permitted to withdraw its bid before award, no action shall be had against the bidder or the bid security.

- (g) No Requirement for Performance Bond. The bid security that shall be held until complete delivery of the supplies or services by the successful bidder is deemed to be satisfactory to adequately protect the best interest of the government of Guam, from default, and thus, no separate performance bond shall be required of the successful bidder on a contract for supplies or services.
- (h) **Bond Forms**. The Policy Office shall promulgate by regulation the form of the bond or other bid security required by this Section together with any additional regulations necessary for the administration of this Section. Any person may request and obtain from the Government of Guam a certified copy of a bond upon payment of the cost of reproduction of the bond and postage, *if* any. A certified copy of a bond shall be prima facie evidence of the contents, execution and delivery of the original."
- **Section 3. Amendment.** Subsection 5304 (c) of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read as follows:
 - "(c) Authority to Require Additional Bonds. Nothing in this Section shall be construed to limit the authority of the Government of Guam to require a performance bond or other security for a construction contract awarded hereunder in addition to those bonds specified in Subsection (a) of this Section."
- **Section 4. Severability.** *If* any of the provisions of this Act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such

- 1 invalidity shall not affect any other provision or application of this Act
- 2 which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and
- 3 to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.

I. Overview

The Committee on Appropriations and Budgeting, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform held a public hearing on Bill No. 385 (COR) at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, November 19, 2004 in the Public Hearing Room, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*. Public notice for this hearing was made on: Friday, November 12, 2004 and Thursday, November 18, 2004 in the Pacific Daily News in the form of a paid advertisement.

Senators present at the public hearing were:

Vice Speaker Frank B. Aguon, Jr., Chairman Senator Toni Sanford, Vice-Chair Senator Carmen Fernandez, Member Speaker ben pangelinan Senator Robert Klitzkie

II. Summary of testimony

Mr. John Limtiaco of Pacific Unlimited, Inc. appeared in support of Bill 385. He asserted that the 10% bid bond and 100% performance bond were very restrictive for small businesses. Such funds would be tied up for 90 to 120 days. If the bid was not awarded, the funds would be tied up for 30 days minimum. Vendors are lucky to be paid in 90 days.

Mr. Limtiaco suggested that the government should provide a performance bond to ensure vendors that they will be paid.

When goods are received but are not accepted, small businesses face the loss of the performance or bid bond. Perhaps debarment should be the penalty for non-performance, instead of funds.

No further testimony was received on Bill 385.

III. Findings and recommendation

The Committee on Appropriations and Budgeting, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform, to which Bill No. 385 (COR) was referred does hereby submit to *I Mina' Bente Siete Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* **TO DO PASS** Bill No. 385 (COR): "An Act to add Section 5212 to Chapter 5 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated to clarify bid security and performance bond requirements for contractors".
