ANACT TO **REQUIRE** THE CONSOLIDATED ON**UTILITIES** COMMISSION TO **EXAMINE** THE FEASIBILITY **OF INCREASING** THE SPEED AND REDUCING THE COST OF POWER RECOVERY FROM NATURAL DISASTERS BY PLACING CERTAIN POWER LINES UNDERGROUND AT THE SAME TIME THAT CONSTRUCTION MAJOR ROAD **AND** WATER/WASTEWATER PROJECTS ARE UNDERTAKEN.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan
- 3 finds that when major typhoons strike our island, the strong winds and
- 4 storm surge will often wreak havoc with our island's infrastructure,

especially our power system, causing millions of dollars of damage and leaving residents without basic utility services for many weeks at a time.

I Liheslaturan Guålian, research by the Public Utilities Commission and experience of the Guam Power Authority and power utilities across the country have found that if certain power lines were placed underground, recovery could take place much more quickly, and this faster restoration of service would benefit the people of Guam, our island's economy, and the Guam Power Authority. One prohibitive factor in placing certain power lines underground is the cost of digging the necessary trenches for the power lines. However, a golden opportunity exists when highway construction takes place, or when water/wastewater lines are being buried, because trenching will already be taking place. The costs associated with placing power lines below ground could be reduced dramatically by sharing the costs for trenching equipment and labor.

It is the understanding of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* that not all power lines can be placed underground, due to safety and other concerns. However those lines that can be buried, should be buried whenever the opportunity arises. Current road projects in Yona and several other projects around the island already announced for this year present the perfect opportunity to begin placing these lines out of harm's way.

It is therefore the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to require that the Consolidated Commission on Utilities closely examine the feasibility of planning the underground placement of certain power lines whenever major highway and water/wastewater projects are undertaken, to take advantage of the savings in both time and labor.

Section 2. Consolidated Commission on Utilities to Conduct Study. The Consolidated Commission on Utilities ("CCU") shall study the

feasibility of placing certain power lines underground. The CCU shall, in the course of that study, determine the feasibility of burying certain power lines whenever major road and water/wastewater projects are underway in order to take advantage of the excavation required, and determine the cost savings possible through sharing the costs. The CCU should also

consider allowing the inclusion of other lines, including but not limited to

telephone, cable television and data services for additional sharing of costs.

The CCU will also investigate and report to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* within one hundred eighty (180) days on potential sources of federal funds in order to put power lines underground throughout Guam, and said report shall describe all federal agencies contacted by the CCU and results of each inquiry.

Section 3. Cooperation of Government Entities. Departments and agencies of the government of Guam, including the Department of Public Works, shall extend their cooperation to the CCU for the purposes of the study.

Section 4. Report Findings. The CCU shall report its findings and recommendations to *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* and *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, within one hundred eighty (180) days of the effective date of this Act. The recommendations shall contain, in draft form, legislation the CCU believes may be necessary to accomplish the intent of this Act.
