AN ACT TO RE-ESTABLISH THE GUAM ETHICS COMMISSION, BY *REPEALING* SECTION 56 OF PUBLIC LAW 26-76, AND *AMENDING* §15301 OF TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan
- 3 finds that the Guam Ethics Commission, as established by Public Law 23-105,
- 4 has been inadvertently repealed by Public Law 26-76, when Public Law 26-76
- 5 attempted to abolish all boards, commissions, councils or oversight bodies
- 6 that have not met in the last twelve (12) months upon the passage of that law.

It was never the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to abolish the Guam Ethics Commission and therefore, would like to re-establish it as it was in existence prior to the passage of Public Law 26-76.

4 **Section 2.** Section 56 of Public Law 26-76 is hereby *repealed*.

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5 **Section 3.** §15301 of Article 3 of Chapter 15 of Title **4**, Guam Code 6 Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

"§15301. Guam **Ethics** Commission Re-established; There shall be within the government of Guam, a Composition. commission to be known as the 'Guam Ethics Commission'. The Commission shall consist of seven (7) members to be appointed by I Maga'lahi. Each appointee shall be a United States citizen and a bona fide resident of Guam. No person who has ever been convicted of a felony shall be eligible to serve on the Commission. Members of the Commission shall not be an employee, as defined herein, or have any member of their immediate family employed by the government of Guam. All appointments to the Guam Ethics Commission shall be confirmed by I Liheslatura.

The Chairman of the Commission shall be elected by the majority of the Commission. The term of office of each member shall be for four (4) years, provided that of the original members, two (2) shall hold office for two (2) years, two (2) shall hold office for three (3) years, and one (1) shall hold office for four (4) years. The determination of these members' length of office shall be by lot drawn by the members at their initial meeting. *No* person shall be appointed consecutively to more than two (2) terms as a member of the Commission.

Members shall serve without compensation, *except* that they shall receive a stipend of Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) per meeting *not to exceed* four (4) meetings per calendar month, and shall be compensated for all normal expenses of travel, and for the cost of meals while in session.

Vacancies shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointments. *I Maga'lahi* may remove or suspend any member of the Commission for cause, upon the filing of a written finding with the Commission and upon service of a copy of the written findings on the member removed or suspended."

Section 4. Severability. *If* any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstances is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.

COMMITTEE ADDS TO HEARING AGENDA A BILL TO REESTABLISH GUAM ETHICS COMMISSION

(For immediate release December 3, 2004)

Vice Speaker Frank B. Aguon announced today that Bill 382 will be added to his Public Hearing agenda for Monday, December 13. Passage of Bill 382 would reestablish the Guam Ethics Commission.

Bill 382 also proposes to streamline the nomination process to place members on the Guam Ethics Commission.

"Without the Guam Ethics Commission, there is no formal process to compel our public officials and employees to adhere to established standards of ethical conduct," the Vice-Speaker said today. "Is there a problem with unethical behavior? Only through an objective, fair process can we know for sure. This measure is necessary to monitor the very real distance between gossip and talk-show calls, and breaking other laws."

The Guam Ethics Commission was established in 1996 to administer standards of professional conduct for public officers and employees. It was inadvertently repealed in March 2002 when a government reorganization law abolished commissions that had not met in the previous 12 months.
