AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE STATUS OF THE GUAM ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND COMMERCE AUTHORITY AS PART OF THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM FOR PROCUREMENT PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan
- 3 finds that the Guam Economic Development and Commerce Authority
- 4 ("GEDCA") has for too long been removed from the procurement laws
- 5 of Guam, and that its most recent contract for lobbyist services
- 6 amounting to 1.5 Million Dollars in the face of government employee

- 1 layoffs and reductions in pay, is evidence that the power of the GEDCA
- 2 Board when spending government funds must be contained.
- 3 Accordingly, GEDCA's status will be that of an autonomous
- 4 instrumentality within and of the government of Guam for procurement
- 5 purposes.

- 6 Section 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Guam
- 7 Economic Development and Commerce Authority shall be subject to the
- 8 Freedom of Information Law and the Sunshine Information Act of 1999,
- 9 5 GCA Chapter 10, and the Open Government Law, 5 GCA Chapter 8.
- Section 3. §5125 of Part C of Article 2 of Chapter 5 of Title 5, Guam
- 11 Code Annotated, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"§5125. Application of this Chapter to Executive Branch. Every governmental body which is in the purview of the Executive Branch, and including Guam Community College, the University of Guam, the Department of Education, the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority, Guam Economic Development and Commerce Authority, and the Guam Visitor's Bureau, shall be governed by Articles 1, 3, 6, 7, 10, 11 and 12 of this Chapter, except to the extent that any such governmental body or other above-named body may be exempted from the centralized procurement regime of Article 2 of this Chapter, in which event the Director of each such governmental body or other above-named body shall be substituted wherever there is reference to the Public Policy Office, Chief Procurement Officer or Director of Public Works in Articles 4, 5, 8 and 9 of Chapter 5 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated.

It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to require all Executive Branch governmental bodies, including autonomous agencies, and other above-named bodies, to be governed to the maximum extent practicable by Chapter 5 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated. This provision requires any governmental body, and each above-named body, to conduct their procurement activities pursuant to Chapter 5 of Title 5 of the Guam Code Annotated, except insofar as said Chapter establishes and effects a system of centralized procurement."

Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
