AN ACT RELATIVE TO TRANSFERRING THE BAZA GARDENS BASEBALL FIELD FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKS AND RECREATION TO THE OFFICE OF THE MAYOR OF YONA FOR USE BY THE COMMUNITY, BY ADDING A NEW SUBSECTION (e) TO §40113 OF TITLE 5, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan
- 3 Guåhan finds it is important that local sports venues be properly
- 4 maintained and made available for the use by the island community.

The availability and use of island-wide sport facilities encourages the 1 people of Guam, inclusive of our youth and adults, to actively 2 participate in these positive sport community activities. It has further 3 become apparent that local government agencies continue to experience 4 difficulty in the maintenance and upkeep of island-wide sports fields 5 and facilities due to the government of Guam's limited financial 6 resources. One (1) such facility that has not been properly maintained in 7 recent years is the youth baseball field located in Baza Gardens, Yona. 8 Because of the inadequate maintenance of the field causing a lack of 9 extensive use by the people of the village for a number of years, the 10 Mayor of Yona took over the maintenance of the baseball field so that 11 Yona villagers could enjoy it. Now the Mayor of Yona has requested 12 that the field be transferred to the Office of the Mayor of Yona which 13 already maintains it, so that the Mayor can administer the use of the 14 field for the benefit of the people of the community. By transferring this 15 particular sport facility to the Office of the Mayor of Yona, I Liheslaturan 16 Guåhan has been assured that every effort will be applied toward its 17 18 proper upkeep and use, without necessarily further burdening the government of Guam's limited financial condition. Therefore, it is the 19 20 intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to transfer the baseball field to the Office of the Mayor of Yona for continual use of the residents within the village 21 22 and the entire island community.

Section 2. A new Subsection (e) is hereby *added* to 5 GCA §40113 to read:

"(e) Transfer of the Baza Gardens Baseball Field from the Department of Parks and Recreation to the Office of the Mayor of Yona. The Baza Gardens Baseball Field located at the entrance of the Baza Gardens housing area, designated as Lot No. 95-REM 2C-1, Municipality of Yona, Guam, containing an area of two (2) acres, is hereby officially transferred from the control of the Department of Parks and Recreation to the control of the Office of the Mayor of Yona. The Office of the Mayor of Yona shall be responsible for the overall administration, operation and maintenance of the baseball field for use by the residents of Yona and the island community."

Transmitted herewith is Bill No. 76 (COR), "AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 5.55 AND TO ADD A NEW SECTION 5.56 TO CHAPTER 8 OF TITLE 8 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED FOR THE INCLUSION OF AIRPORT POLICE OFFICERS, PORT POLICE OFFICERS, AND GUAM PARK PATROL OFFICERS AS PEACE OFFICERS," which I have signed into law on November 13. 2003, as Public Law No. 27-36.

This legislation is in line with our commitment to have an integrated law-enforcement system under a Department of Public Safety. The Department of Public Safety will consolidate the activities of the Guam Police Department, the Guam Fire Department, the Guam International Airport Authority Police and Fire Department, the Port Authority of Guam Police, the Department of Corrections, and the Department of Youth Affairs. With the support of the Legislature, I hope to establish this integrated law-enforcement system to enable the different law-enforcement agencies to provide a nexus of available law enforcement resources to support each other in carrying out their missions.

With the passage of this measure, we must be committed to not only provide adequate training to our law enforcement personnel, but we must ensure that they have the tools they need to properly protect our people at all our ports of entry and in our public park areas. Also please note, that there is no Chapter 8 in Title 8. Public Law 27-36 should instead read Section 5.55 of Article 2 of Chapter 5 of Title 8.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:
