Dear Speaker Pangelinan:

Transmitted herewith is Bill No. 11 (COR), "AN ACT RELATIVE TO ASSISTING DRIVERS LICENSED IN OTHER JURISDICTIONS IN THE ACQUISITION OF A GUAM DRIVER'S LICENSE BY *ADDING* A NEW SUBSECTION (d) AND *AMENDING* SUBSECTION (c) OF §3101 OF ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 3, TITLE 16, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED," which I signed into law on December 17, 2003, as **Public Law No. 27-48**.

It has often been difficult for the men and women of the U. S. Armed Forces stationed here to obtain a Guam driver's license. This law will do much to alleviate this burden. It exempts persons with a driver's license from other territories, Commonwealth, or state of the United States, which includes military personnel and their dependants, from the requirement of taking the written driver's license test, but all fees assessed for them to get a driver's license remain in effect. The new law should expedite the process for many of them to acquire a Guam driver's license which I am sure will contribute towards a positive and enjoyable stay on Guam.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO ASSISTING DRIVERS LICENSED IN OTHER JURISDICTIONS IN THE ACQUISITION OF A GUAM DRIVER'S LICENSE BY *ADDING* A NEW SUBSECTION (d) AND *AMENDING* SUBSECTION (c) OF §3101 OF ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 3, TITLE 16, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan
- 3 recognizes that in order to further enhance the relationship between the
- 4 local community and the military community, it is important that mutual
- 5 concerns that affect both entities be discussed and effectively addressed.

This would insure that opportunities for improving this relationship and enhancing the quality of lives of our partner military personnel and their families contribute toward a positive and enjoyable stay on Guam. A concern that has been expressed by several individuals who are working toward enhancing the quality of lives of these military personnel and their families on Guam is the requirement for them to take the written driver's license examination prior to acquiring the necessary Guam driver's license. Suggestions have been made that these individuals who are temporarily residing on Guam due to the tour of duty assignment be permitted to exchange their valid stateside driver's license for a Guam driver's license and to pay the appropriate fees. A written driver's test is a mandated requirement nationwide prior to the issuance of a driver's license in any of the fifty (50) states and territories, and in many cases these tests are relatively similar to the written tests administered by the Division of Motor Vehicles of the Guam Department of Revenue and Taxation. It has been recommended that these military personnel and their family members be exempted from the requirement of taking such a written test. All fees assessed for the acquisition of a driver's license will remain in effect. This Provision would therefore exempt such individuals from taking the written test, and should expedite the process for many of them to acquire a Guam driver's license.

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Section 2. Driver's License Written Test Exemption for Persons Who Possess a Valid U.S. Driver's License. A new Subsection (d) is added to §3101 of Article 1, Chapter 3, Title 16 of the Guam Code Annotated as follows and all existing Subsections (d) through (n) are renumbered

accordingly:

"(d) A person having in his immediate possession a valid operator's license or chauffeur's license issued by any other territory, Commonwealth, or state of the United States, may drive a motor vehicle upon the roads and highways for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days from the date such person arrived on Guam. However, upon the expiration of such thirty (30) day period, such person must apply for a Guam driver's license and shall be exempted from taking the written driver's license examination. Upon issuance of the Guam driver's license, such person shall surrender the driver's license previously issued by the other United States jurisdiction, to the Division of Motor Vehicles of the Department of Revenue and Taxation, unless the Director of Revenue and Taxation has adopted other procedures for the disposition of the previously issued license from the other United States jurisdiction."

Section 3. Subsection (c) of §3101 of Article 1, Chapter 3, Title 16 of the Guam Code Annotated is hereby *amended* as follows:

"(c) A person having in his immediate possession a valid operator's license or chauffeur's license issued by the Republic of Palau, the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, Japan, the Republic of China (Taiwan), countries of the European Union, Canada, New Zealand, the Republic of Korea, the Republic of the Philippines, or Australia may drive a motor vehicle upon the highways for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days from the date such person arrived on Guam. However, upon the

expiration of such thirty (30) day period, such person must (i) apply for a Guam driver's license, and (ii) be required to take a written test, and if that person passes the written test, then a driver's license shall be issued; provided however, if such person fails the written test twice, such person shall be required to complete a driver education seminar before being allowed to retake the test, which seminar must include at least eight (8) hours of classroom instruction and four (4) hours of in-car instruction, and must pass the required road test. An individual is entitled to take a written test only three (3) times pursuant to this Subsection, and to be issued a license under this Subsection, an individual must pass both the written and the road test.

In addition, a person having in his immediate possession a temporary operator's or chauffeur's license issued under this Title may drive a motor vehicle upon the highways for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days, while the Guam Police Department is completing investigation and determination of all facts relative to the applicant's right to receive a license. Such temporary license is invalid when the applicant's license has been issued or refused."
