**AN ACT RELATIVE TO AMENDING §79101 OF TITLE 12,
GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO ALLOW QUALIFIED
GOVERNMENT OF GUAM EMPLOYEES THE
OPPORTUNITY TO SERVE AS MEMBERS OF THE
CONSOLIDATED COMMISSION ON UTILITIES.**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
3 that the current requirements for Commissioners of the Consolidated
4 Commission on Utilities ("CCU") prohibits many capable and qualified
5 government of Guam employees, such as professors at the University of
6 Guam and the Guam Community College, Department of Education

1 employees, and retired professional educators hired on contract to meet
2 critical teaching needs at those facilities, from serving as Commissioners,
3 hence, depriving our residents of the best representation on said Commission.

4 Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to lessen the
5 restrictions imposed on certain government of Guam employees and retired
6 professional educators by amending the enabling legislation of the CCU.

7 **Section 2. Amendment of §79101 of Title 12, Guam Code Annotated.**
8 §79101 of Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby *amended* to read as
9 follows:

10 **“§79101. Commissioners.**

11 The Commission shall be comprised of five (5) Commissioners
12 elected at-large by the voters of Guam in a General Election. To be
13 eligible to be a Commissioner, a person must be a registered voter of
14 Guam and a minimum of twenty-five (25) years of age, and shall have
15 been a resident of Guam for at least five (5) years immediately prior to
16 the date of the Commissioner’s election.

17 A person may not simultaneously serve as a Commissioner and an
18 employee of the Guam Waterworks Authority, the Guam Power
19 Authority, or the Public Utilities Commission, or simultaneously serve
20 as a Commissioner and an unclassified or contracted employee of the
21 government of Guam. An adjunct instructor, adjunct teacher, or adjunct
22 professor employed by the University of Guam or the Guam
23 Community College may serve as a Commissioner.

24 Persons retired from the government of Guam may serve as
25 Commissioners. At their first official meeting, the Commissioners shall

1 elect from among the Commissioners a chairperson, who shall preside
2 over meetings of the Commission. A majority of the Commissioners
3 holding office shall constitute a quorum. The affirmative vote of the
4 Commissioners holding office shall constitute the decision of the
5 Commission. The Commission may adopt rules and regulations
6 governing the conduct of its affairs.”
