Transmitted herewith is Bill No. 295 (COR), "AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE A CUMULATIVE AMOUNT OF SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$600,000.00) FOR THE EMERGENCY PROCUREMENT OF FIRE TRUCKS, EMERGENCY LIFESAVING EQUIPMENT OR SUPPLIES, AND FIRE FIGHTING APPARATUSES FOR THE GUAM FIRE DEPARTMENT, AND FOR THE REPAIR OF AMBULANCES; AND TO WAIVE PROCUREMENT REQUIREMENTS," which I have signed in to law on June 25, 2004 as Public Law No. 27-99.

I would like to commend I Mina' Bente Siete Na Liheslaturan Guåhan for passing Bill No. 295, most notably, the author, Senator Quinata for working with the Guam Fire Department (GFD) to find a solution to GFD's operational requirements and appropriate the necessary funds to achieve their duties and responsibilities. Bill No. 295 allows the GFD to procure necessary equipment and to repair ambulances. Unfortunately, the GFD and the General Services Agency (GSA) are left without any guidance to make the necessary procurement because the Bill waives all methods of procurement. Please amend the law to provide a procedure to purchase or repair fire trucks, ambulances and equipment as provided in the Bill or permit GSA to develop rules for the procurement.





**AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE A CUMULATIVE AMOUNT
OF SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$600,000.00)
FOR THE EMERGENCY PROCUREMENT OF FIRE
TRUCKS, EMERGENCY LIFESAVING EQUIPMENT OR
SUPPLIES, AND FIRE FIGHTING APPARATUSES FOR
THE GUAM FIRE DEPARTMENT, AND FOR THE REPAIR
OF AMBULANCES; AND TO WAIVE PROCUREMENT
REQUIREMENTS.**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
3 that the number of working fire trucks and ambulances is at a level where the
4 Guam Fire Department is unable to fulfill its mission. With the upcoming dry
5 season and *El Niño* weather cycle, it is predicted that Guam will experience a
6 significantly parched dry season and less rain during the wet season. It is
7 essential that the Guam Fire Department be properly equipped with necessary
8 and operable emergency fire trucks, equipment and gear.

9 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that the Guam Fire Department has
10 not procured necessary fire trucks in the last decade due to financial
11 constraints of the government of Guam, and the Department is also in need of
12 purchasing fire suppressant gear and equipment. Over the past years, the fire
13 trucks have been used extensively, leading to a number of trucks that are now
14 under repair, or in extreme need of replacement. Fire trucks have a life
15 expectancy of seven (7) years, with the average life of Guam's fire trucks
16 within the Guam Fire Department presently standing at over twelve (12)
17 years, thus, necessitating the upgrade of these emergency vehicles.
18 Furthermore, in several cases firefighters are also left unequipped with
19 appropriate firefighting gear and equipment, thus posing danger to their lives
20 and the lives of the public, making it difficult to properly provide quality and
21 timely services.

22 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that an agency that is an integral
23 element in ensuring the general public's safety is the Guam Fire Department.
24 Firefighters and Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) employed by the

1 Guam Fire Department are generally the first responders to many of Guam's
2 misfortunes including, but not limited to, fires, natural disasters and
3 automobile accidents. The aforementioned reason makes very clear the
4 importance of the Guam Fire Department.

5 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* further finds that the Guam Fire Department must
6 have available, the resources that are necessary to carry out its duties and
7 responsibilities. Currently, the Department is in need of various types of
8 equipment as well as the repair of existing equipment, which will allow for
9 more reliable operations. Currently, the Guam Fire Department operates with
10 two (2) fire trucks, which are certified by the National Fire Prevention
11 Association, and four (4) ambulances, dispersed among the twelve (12) fire
12 stations throughout Guam.

13 Additionally, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that the amount of Six
14 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000.00) was appropriated to the Guam Fire
15 Department for a municipal lease program, to acquire through a loan and
16 lease arrangement with the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA),
17 during Fiscal Year 2003. The Guam Fire Department proceeded with several
18 Requests for Proposal (RFPs) which were hampered by the inability of the
19 Bureau of Budget and Management Research to certify the availability of
20 funds appropriated through Public Law 26-35. Subsequently, the USDA
21 ended the municipal lease program and the window of opportunity afforded
22 to the Guam Fire Department no longer exists.

23 Therefore, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to appropriate the
24 necessary funds from the *GFD Lease Purchase and/or Program Fund* for the

1 purpose of purchasing and repairing equipment and vehicles needed to
2 ensure that necessary emergency and fire fighting vehicles and supplies are
3 properly provided to the Guam Fire Department to effectively fight island
4 fires and to ensure continued safety of our people. This provision would
5 authorize *I Maga'lahren Guåhan* to immediately procure the necessary fire
6 trucks, fire suppressant gear, and fire fighting equipment so that the Guam
7 Fire Department personnel may more effectively serve our island community.

8 **Section 2. Emergency Appropriation to the Guam Fire Department for**
9 **the Purchase of Fire Trucks and Equipment and for the Repair of Fire**
10 **Trucks and Ambulances.** Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 28(a),
11 Chapter III, of Public Law 26-35, the sum of Six Hundred Thousand Dollars
12 (\$600,000.00) is hereby appropriated from the *GFD Lease Purchase and/or*
13 *Program Fund* to the Guam Fire Department for the purchase or repair of
14 structural pumper fire trucks and maintenance of those trucks for a minimum
15 of five (5) years; the repair of any ambulances or standby ambulances; and the
16 purchase of any emergency or lifesaving equipment, supplies and fire fighting
17 apparatuses.

18 **Section 3. Waiver of Procurement Requirements.** In view of the
19 urgency in the procurement of fire trucks and emergency fire fighting
20 apparatuses and to repair all ambulances and standby ambulances
21 categorically appropriated within Sections 2 and 3 of this Act, the
22 requirements of Part B, Article 3, Chapter 5, of Title 5, Guam Code Annotated,
23 are waived for a period not to exceed one hundred eighty (180) days after the
24 enactment of this Act. The Public Auditor shall be an observer throughout the

1 procurement of any services, parts and equipment specified in this Act, shall
2 receive copies of all documents involved, and shall be invited to any meetings
3 relating to the procurement of any services, supplies or equipment as required
4 by this Act.

5 **Section 4. Sunset Provision on Emergency Appropriations.** Any
6 amounts appropriated and not encumbered within one hundred eighty (180)
7 days upon the enactment of this Act shall be deappropriated and transferred
8 to the General Fund.

9 **Section 5. Severability.** *If* any provision of this Law or its application
10 to any person or circumstances is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such
11 invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Law which
12 can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this
13 end the provisions of this Law are severable.



I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Appropriations and Budgeting, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform to which was referred Bill No. 295 (COR) as substituted, held a public hearing at 9:30 a.m. Friday June 4, 2004 in the Legislative Public Hearing Room, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*. Public hearing notice was provided to the media on Friday, May 28, 2004 and Thursday June 3, 2004, which was posted in the PDN.

Senators Present At The Public Hearing Were:

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY:

Mike Uncangco, Fire Chief of the Guam Fire Department, Provided written and oral testimony in support of bill 295 but is requesting amendments to allow GFD the flexibility in utilizing the appropriated funds due to the increase of equipment prices. (See attachment).

Senator Quinata commented on the total amount of fire trucks and ambulances available. Mr. Uncangco responded that he only has (4) Fire trucks and (5) Ambulances that is operable to date. Senator Quinata requested that Mr. Uncangco declare a state of emergency to the Governor due to the shortage of fire trucks and ambulances that is available for the island.

Senator Joanne Brown commented about how many fire personnel are in the Guam Fire Department and Mr. Uncangco responded that the Department has (277) fire personnel in the Department. Senator Brown replied that the numbers just don't add up, regarding the large number of personnel and only a limited amount of fire trucks and ambulances.

In closing, the Chairman referred to a provision of the bill in regards to Section 2. He stated that the amount in that particular provision needs to be looked into so that it does not get duplicated when it becomes Law.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION:

The Committee on Appropriations and Budgeting, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform finds that Bill No. 295 (COR) as substituted, is a good measure for the Guam Fire Department to have the necessary funds it needs in order to purchase its equipments, supplies, and emergency vehicles.

Accordingly, the Committee on Appropriations and Budgeting, General Governmental Operations, Reorganization and Reform, to which Bill No 295 (COR) as substituted, was referred, does hereby submit its findings and recommendations to *I Mina Bente Siete Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* **TO DO PASS BILL NO. 295 (COR)** as substituted, **An act to appropriate Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000.00) from the "GFD Lease Purchase and/or Program Fund" to the Guam Fire Department for the emergency procurement of fire trucks and ambulances; the emergency repair of a sky-lift aerial ladder platform high rise fire truck; to purchase emergency life saving equipment and supplies or fire fighting apparatuses for the Guam Fire Department and to waiver procurement requirements.**

Hafa Adai and good morning! Mr. Chairman and distinguished Members of the Committee on Appropriations & Budgeting, General Government Operations, Reorganization and Reform.

On behalf of the Guam Fire Department, and, as Fire Chief, I am in full support of Bill 295, this much needed measure to enable the department to fulfill its mandated mission.

Indeed, with the passage of this legislation, the Guam Fire Department will have the opportunity to continue to replace its aged and obsolete fleet of Fire Apparatus, finally repair its high-rise capable "Bronto Sky-lift" Apparatus, repair serviceable Ambulances and purchase two new Ambulances, and the acquisition of emergency life saving firefighting/EMS - Rescue equipment and supplies.

Though I am full support of the intent of this legislation, I am requesting that amendments be made to allow the Guam Fire Department the flexibility in utilizing the appropriated funds. The bill in its present form may impose procurement problems due to the price estimates that were in place at the time the bill was

drafted. Since then, prices of ambulances and firefighting apparatus have increased. I am requesting that to alleviate and avert any problems, that the GFD be given the latitude to have procurement flexibility by lump-sum appropriation and not to exceed such, yet fulfilling the intent of this legislation as it relates to the equipment involved.

Furthermore, as a result of this body acknowledging the urgency to procure firefighting apparatus, ambulances and repairs of such, GFD requests that Section 6 Waiver of Procurement Requirements be amended to include the procurement of three (3) additional fire trucks which will be procured utilizing Department of Interior Compact Impact Funds.

Sir, I ensure you that I will work aggressively to expedite the intent of this measure, as I know how critical these assets are to our personnel who are our "first responders".

Please be assured that my personnel and I continue to support your efforts in ensuring that your Fire Department is always vigilant and prepared to face the challenges of our chosen profession "saving lives and property"

Bill No. 295 (COR) - An act to appropriate One Hundred Ninety Thousand Dollars (\$190,000.00) from special funds and to appropriate all sums from the "GFD Lease Purchase and/or Program Fund" to the Guam Fire Department for the emergency procurement of fire trucks and ambulances; the emergency repair of a sky-lift aerial ladder platform high rise fire trucks; to authorize *I Maga'lahaen Guahan* to purchase emergency life saving equipment and supplies or fire righting apparatuses for the Guam Fire Department and to repeal Section 28 of Public Law 26-35 relative to the creation of the "GFD Lease Purchase and/or Program Fund."
