

AN ACT TO AMEND §76212 OF TITLE 21, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED. RELATIVE TO **SPECIFYING** THE DEPOSITORY FOR ALL HISTORIC PROPERTIES; TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION (e) TO §76511 OF TITLE 21, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE PENALTIES FOR TO COMPLY WITH A CERTIFICATE FAILURE APPROVAL; AND TO ADD A NEW §76512 TO ESTABLISH HISTORIC PRESERVATION ARCHAEOLOGICAL ANMITIGATION FUND.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Statement. Guam's historic preservation laws will
- 3 be severely tested in the years to come as our island experiences its next surge in

development. A review of the laws across the United States guiding the ownership, repatriation, caretaking, and exhibition of prehistoric and historic properties reveals a wide range of allowable actions, mitigation remedies, and penalties and fines for non-compliance with approved actions. Guam's statute relative to historic preservation has also gone through changes over the twenty (20) years of its existence, and it is situated almost midway between the extremes found in other jurisdictions. It is the intent of these proposed amendments to further highlight the need for vigilance when it comes to the preservation of Guam's culture and history, and to deter, by the imposition of hefty fines and/or terms of imprisonment, the unauthorized destruction of irreplaceable properties that make up Guam's unique place in the world.

Section 2. §76212 of Title 21, Guam Code Annotated is *amended* to read:

"§76212. Prehistoric or Historic Objects; Public Property. The Department shall, subject to the provisions of this Chapter, determine the

disposition of such prehistoric or historic properties wheresoever located within the territorial limits of the Island of Guam. Any person who disturbs properties of prehistoric or historic significance or removes such properties from their sites without approval or concurrence from the Historic Preservation Office shall be guilty of a felony of the third degree.

When a private landowner *or* lessee in the territory discovers properties which may be of historic significance on his property, he *shall* report the location of such objects, without disturbing the properties, to the Department.

All prehistoric and historic properties *shall* be returned to the people of Guam, with the Guam Museum serving as the depository for said properties."

- "(e) After a Certificate of Approval *or* permitting approval has been issued for a requested action as enumerated in subsection (a), any unauthorized disturbances of prehistoric *or* historic properties *shall* be subject to fines of up to Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) and/or imprisonment of up to three (3) years for each violation."
- Section 4. A new §76512 is *added* to Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, to 9 read:
 - **%76512.** Historic **Preservation** Archaeological **Mitigation** Fund, established. (a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, there is hereby created, within the Department of Parks and Recreation, the "Historic Preservation Archaeological Mitigation Fund", which shall be a fund separate and apart from the General Fund and from any other special funds of the government of Guam. Any and all funds generated through fines imposed by the Historic Preservation Office of the Department of Parks and Recreation shall be deposited into the Historic Preservation Archaeological Mitigation Fund. The Director of the Department shall administer said funds independently from the General Fund, with a minimum requirement of dual signatures for the expenditure of any funds within the authorized guidelines.
 - (b) Expenditures of the Fund *shall* be restricted to the following areas, and for the following purposes:
 - (1) the contracting of archaeological services as determined by the Historic Preservation Office;
 - (2) public education and awareness activities; and

(3) the purchase of supplies, materials and equipment to support the activities outlined in Subsections (1) and (2) above.

Funds from the Historic Preservation Archaeological Mitigation Fund shall *not* be expended for personnel services, but used *solely* for operations as highlighted above. The Director of the Department of Parks and Recreation *shall* provide to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* a monthly financial report on the funds generated each month, within ten (10) days following the preceding month."
