AN ACT TO ADD A NEW ARTICLE 4 TO CHAPTER 10 OF TITLE 12 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE JOSE D. LEON GUERRERO COMMERICAL PORT TO ENTER INTO A PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP THROUGH **PERFORMANCE** MANAGEMENT A CONTRACT FOR THE MANAGEMENT, OPERATION AND **MAINTENANCE** OF THE **PORT** CARGO HANDLING **EQUIPMENT** AND/OR **FACILITIES** ASSOCIATED WITH SUCH EQUIPMENT AND/OR OTHER ASPECTS OF THE PORT OPERATIONS.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

2	Section 1.	A new Article 4 is hereby <i>added</i> to Chapter 10 of Title 12
3	Guam Code Annotated to read as follows:	

4 "ARTICLE 4

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#### PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP THROUGH

#### A PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT CONTRACT

**§10401.** Public-Private Partnership Authorization through a 7 **Performance Management Contract.** The Board of Directors of the Jose 8 D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port (Port) is authorized to issue a Request 9 for Proposal (RFP), Multi-Step Bid (MSB), Invitation for Bid (IFB), 10 11 soliciting bids or proposals from qualified parties for the management, operation and maintenance of its cargo handling equipment through a 12 performance management contract, subject to the procurement laws of 13 14 Guam. The scope of work required through this RFP, MSB or IFB shall include the daily operation and maintenance of its cargo handling 15 equipment; any repairs required, inclusive of all parts and labor; 16 17 performance monitoring requirements; and preventive maintenance of all equipment and/or facilities directly associated with the equipment, 18 19 including, but not limited to, the acquisition for replacement of such equipment. 20

The RFP, MSB and/or IFB *shall* include performance standards that will provide operating criteria, guidelines and requirements to minimize costly downtime and maximize cargo handling equipment availability and its life span. Parties interested in submitting proposals *shall* have sixty (60) days to prepare and submit a response to the Port. The General Services Agency Chief Procurement Officer *shall* be an observer throughout the RFP.

1 MSB or IFB process as specified in this Section, shall receive copies of all

2 documents involved and shall be invited to any meetings regarding the

3 public-private partnership process specified in this Section.

The Port *shall* award a performance management contract subject to the RFP, MSB or IFB detailed in this Section within one hundred twenty (120) to one hundred fifty (150) days of the date of issuance of the RFP, MSB or IFB; provided, that qualified offerors have submitted proposals in compliance with the procurement laws of Guam and the provisions of this Section.

§10402. Contract Limits. The awarded contract, which is subject to the provisions of this Act, may be awarded for periods of not less than five (5) years, with options to renew every five (5) years and not to exceed a total of twenty (20) years. The awarded contract, subject to the provisions of this Act, must contain performance reviews at least annually, and provisions for contract termination and penalty based upon such review.

§10403. Conflicts. No contract awarded subject to the provisions of this Act *shall* be awarded to any party who has a blood or marital relationship to the third (3<sup>rd</sup>) degree of consanguinity with the General Manager of the Port, a Board Member of the Port, *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* or a Member of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*.

§10404. Other Public-Private Partnership through Performance Management Contract. Notwithstanding any other provisions of law, the Board of Directors is authorized to enter into a public-private partnership through a performance management contract for other aspects of the Port operations it deems necessary, provided that the processes outlined in the above sections are complied with.

**§10405.** Termination of Contract for Reasons Unrelated to Performance. Should at some point in the future, a determination be made by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, that a broad-scale public-private partnership for the Port operations be advisable, subject to legislative approval, and if any agreements entered into pursuant to this Act are viewed as impeding, such provisions may be included in each contract for the purchase of such contract, except that no contract *shall* be purchased in any circumstance where a Contractor's performance has been deemed to be unacceptable in accordance with the provisions of this Act. **§10406.** Severability. *If* any provision of this Act or its application

**§10406. Severability.** *If* any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstances is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity shall *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be given effect without the invalid provisions or applications, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable."
