AN ACT TO ENHANCE THE ENFORCEMENT POWERS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE AND TAXATION REGARDING THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES BY BUSINESS ESTABLISHMENTS BY *ADDING* A NEW §3122 TO CHAPTER 3, ARTICLE 1, TITLE 11 GUAM CODE ANNOTATED.

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that
3 it has been many years since the laws pertaining to the licensing of businesses and
4 establishments that sell alcoholic beverages have been updated to allow for more

1 effective enforcement by the appropriate personnel of the Department of Revenue and
2 Taxation. The Department of Revenue and Taxation recently suggested for the
3 establishment of a schedule of fines and penalties that can be assessed to a business
4 for non-compliance with existing laws.

5 Therefore, this legislation amends specific provisions relative to the licensing of
6 businesses and others in the sale of alcoholic beverages, and allow for improved
7 compliance and enforcement by the pertinent government regulatory personnel.
8 Through these updates and changes, proper officials will be provided with necessary
9 enforcement mechanisms that will enhance their ability to assure the community that
10 appropriate and necessary restrictions are being applied to the operational activities of
11 these businesses for the benefit of the Guam community.

12 **Section 2.** A new §3122 is hereby *added* to Chapter 3, Article 1, Title 11 Guam
13 Code Annotated, to read as follows:

14 “§3122. (a) Closed. *Closed* means that the premise(s) *shall* be
15 vacated by all persons immediately after the ‘authorized’ hours of sale in
16 §3414 of this Title. In this Section, ‘all persons’ does not include employees
17 who may remain in the premises for the purpose of cleaning and
18 maintenance. §3613 of Article 6 of this Chapter *shall* apply to this Section
19 with respect to hearing and penalty as appropriate.”

20 **Section 3.** §3414 of Chapter 3, Article 4, Title 11, Guam Code Annotated,
21 is hereby *amended* to read as follows:

22 “§3414. **Hours of Sale. On Sale Premises.** An on-sale licensee *shall*
23 not sell or serve any person any alcoholic beverages after 2:00 a.m., except that
24 preceding New Year’s Day, the selling time *shall* be 2:00 a.m., on Saturdays,
25 Sundays and holidays the selling time *shall* be 4:00 a.m. Provided, however,
26 that all alcoholic beverages must be consumed within 15 minutes of the time
27 permitted for the sale thereof and premise(s) *shall* be closed thereafter. A

1 licensee may begin selling or serving alcoholic beverages at 8:00 a.m., Monday
2 through Sunday, inclusive.”

3 **Section 4.** Subsection (b) of §2105 of Chapter 2, Title 3, Guam
4 Administrative Rules and Regulations, relative to Business Regulations, is hereby
5 *amended* to read as follows:

6 “(b) All Class 4, On-Sale establishments *shall* have a duly registered
7 manager or assistant manager or registered designated responsible person on
8 the premises, in the absence of the licensee, and during the hours from 7:00
9 p.m. daily until closing. ‘Registered designated responsible person’ means a
10 person designated by the president, corporation, or owner of the
11 establishment, who *shall* be responsible in the absence of the manager or
12 assistant manager, and who *shall* be registered with the Department of
13 Revenue and Taxation. The manager or assistant manager or registered
14 designated responsible person *shall* be capable and competent in
15 maintenance of order and responsible for compliance with pertinent laws
16 and regulations as pertains to the licensed premises. Should the duly
17 registered manager, assistant manager, and registered designated responsible
18 person be absent from the premises at 7:00 p.m. until closing, the premises
19 *shall* be ‘CLOSED’ immediately until such time that one of the persons
20 named herein is present. If the premises remains open in violation of this
21 Section, the licensee *shall* pay a penalty of \$100.00 for each violation.”

22 **Section 5. Funds Generated to Support Compliance and Regulatory**
23 **Activities of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board of the Department of**
24 **Revenue and Taxation.** All funds generated as a result of the fine or penalties
25 imposed herein *shall* be subject to appropriation by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and re-
26 directed to the Department of Revenue and Taxation for the express use by the
27 Better Public Service Fund. In consultation with the Board, the Director of

1 Revenue and Taxation *shall* present, in the Department's annual budgetary
2 submission to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*, the sums generated from these penalties,
3 with the funds to be directed for alcoholic beverage license enforcement and other
4 regulatory activities.

5 **Section 6. Severability.** *If* any of the provisions of this Act or the
6 application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity
7 shall *not* affect any other provision or application of this Act which can be given
8 effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of
9 this Act are severable.
