AN ACT TO REPEAL AND REENACT §3601(e) OF ARTICLE 6 OF CHAPTER 3 OF TITLE 16 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED AND §3209(c) OF ARTICLE 2 OF CHAPTER 3 OF TITLE 16 OF THE GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO THE USE OF SUN SCREENING DEVICES ON MOTOR VEHICLE WINDSHIELDS.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that it is in the public interest to regulate the use of, and determine provisions for
- 4 sun screening devices used on motor vehicles parked or driven on the public

highways or roadways of Guam. On a daily basis, law enforcement personnel encounter motor vehicles using various types and shades of tint which endanger safe operations of vehicles on our roadways. Dangerous occurrences could be mitigated or avoided with adequate visibility inside motor vehicles by the use of lighter, regulated shades of tint. The ability to view into motor vehicles through the windows enhances the effectiveness of the Amber Alert Program, a national child safety program which activates law enforcement agencies, the media, and the public to locate abducted children. During the course of traffic accident investigations, law enforcement officials have found that the lack of visual communication between drivers of motor vehicles has been known to be a contributing factor to numerous accidents. Dark or mirror-like tinting prevents eye contact and visual communication between drivers. It is also in the interest of law enforcement agencies to be able to see into motor vehicles operated on our roadways in order to effectively enforce traffic laws, such as the use of passenger or child restraint devices required by Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, Chapter 26. Also, mirror-like or chrome-like tint, not intended for use on motor vehicles, have been known to cause distractions or temporary blindness to other motor vehicle operators while driving. These distractions could lead to disastrous results. In the interest of protecting law enforcement officers from assault or injury during legal and necessary vehicular stops, adequate visual inspection must be afforded to our officers. Military installations on Guam concur with many of the concerns associated with window tinting and have adopted a standard which is acceptable to the military community and I Liheslaturan Guåhan.

It is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to amend provisions of the law which allow for the use of sun screening devices, provide for the inspection and testing of sun screening devices, and establish penalties for non-compliance of law while used on a motor vehicle on the public highways *or* roadways of Guam.

1	Section 2. Inspection and Testing. Subsection (e) of §3601 of Article 6 of
2	Chapter 3 of Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby repealed and reenacted to
3	read:
4	"(e) No motor vehicle using any sun screening device or combination
5	of devices in conjunction with the glazing material of a motor vehicle windshield,
6	except those in compliance with § 3209(c) of Article 2 of Chapter 3 of Title 16 of
7	the Guam Code Annotated, shall be issued an official certificate indicating the
8	motor vehicle passed a safety inspection."
9	Section 3. Windshields. Subsection (c) of §3209 of Article 2 of Chapter 3
10	of Title 16, Guam Code Annotated, is hereby repealed and reenacted to read:
11	"(c) No person shall install, mount, adhere, affix, or use any sun
12	screening device or combination of devices in conjunction with the glazing
13	material of a motor vehicle windshield which would make the glazing material that
14	is not manufactured for use on automobiles or other motor vehicles. Any tinting
15	film affixed to the glazing material of a motor vehicle windshield must conform to
16	U.S. automotive tinting industry standards.
17	This Subsection (c) shall not apply to:
18	(i) Transparent sun screening film materials
19	which are installed, affixed or applied along the top edge
20	of the windshield so long as such materials measure no
21	lower than eight (8) inches below the top of the
22	windshield, when measured from the bottom edge of the
23	top windshield molding.
24	(ii) Privacy drapes, curtains or blinds, or any
25	combination, installed on the interior of motor vehicles
26	while parked and not being operated on a public highway
27	or roadway of Guam.

1	Any person who violates this Subsection shall be fined not less than
2	Fifty Dollars (\$50) and no more than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars
3	(\$250) for each separate offense."
4	Section 4. Severability. If any provision of this Law or its application to
5	any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such
6	invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Law which can be
7	given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the
8	provisions of this Law are severable.
9	Section 5. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective one hundred eighty
10	(180) days from the date of enactment.
