An Act to make appropriations for the operation of the government of Guam for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1955, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. The following sums are appropriated out of any moneys in the Treasury of Guam, not otherwise appropriated, for the operation of the government of Guam for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1955:

Section 2. The Governor of Gusa may transfer not to exceed twenty per cent (20%) of any of the foregoing item or items of this appropriation to any other item or items of this appropriation, but no item of appropriation shall be increased more than twenty percentum as a result of such transfer; provided, that quarterly a statement of any such transfer shall be transmitted to the Guam Legislature.

Section 3. The Governor is authorized to withdraw from time to time from the funds made available by the appropriation made herein for the operation of the Department of Education such sums as may be necessary, not to exceed a total of \$25,000, for making loans to worthy students for the purpose of furthering their education by their attendance at institutions of higher education all in accordance with regulations prescribed by the Governor.

Section 4. The Director of Finance may retain and make available for a period of one year after expiration of the appropriations herein made, a portion of the unobligated balance of appropriations for normal operation of the Government to be computed at five per cent (5%) of the outstanding encumbrances solely for adjustments in obligations as such adjustments may become necessary at the time payments are made.

Section 5. The sum of Ten Thousand Bollars (\$10,000) is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the Treasury of Guam not otherwise appropriated for use as a Housing Revolving Fund, which the Governor is hereby authorized to establish. Said Fund shall be available for payment of the costs of maintenance, operation and the supplying of light, power and water to housing quarters occupied by all authorized persons. All charges assessed against such persons as rent shall be payable to the Fund; provided, that it is hereby declared to be the policy of the government of Guam that housing for employees and other authorized persons of the government shall not be provided at a loss but shall be on a self-sustaining basis.

Section 6. This Act is an urgency measure and shall take effect upon the date of its approval by the Governor.
