



1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent.** *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
3 that as the Department of Education expands its use and availability of information
4 technology (IT) in schools, the use of the internet will be required as an integral
5 part of the curricula for most courses and in every grade level. While the internet
6 is proven to be a valuable learning tool, its inherent dangers are apparent at every
7 level of use. Every computer user faces the risk of infections from malware and

1 computer viruses, identity theft, phishing and bank theft scams, exposure to
2 violent, pornographic and obscene imagery, and solicitation from sexual predators.
3 While it is important that our schools incorporate the use of IT in the learning
4 process, it is also important to include “internet safety” in the applications of IT to
5 each course’s curriculum. It is the intent of *I Liheslatura* to ensure that all
6 students of the Department of Education are given training to avoid or reduce their
7 exposure to internet hazards.

8 **Section 2.** A new §4125 is hereby *added* to Chapter 4 of Title 17, Guam
9 Code Annotated, to read as follows:

10 **“§4125. Internet Safety in Course Curricula.** The Guam
11 Education Board *shall*, by Board policy, adopt internet usage safety
12 standards in the curriculum of each course where internet usage is required
13 or *may* be used by students for successful completion and mastery of the
14 course subject matter. The standards may include, but *not* be limited to,
15 teaching students to avoid computer viruses, identity theft, phishing and
16 bank theft scams, exposure to violent, pornographic and obscene imagery,
17 solicitation from sexual predators, and cyberbullying.”

COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

The Committee on Education and Public Libraries convened a public hearing on March 17, 2011 at 2:00 p.m. in *I Liheslatura's* Public Hearing Room. Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of Bill No. 100-31 (COR) "An act to add a new §4125 to Chapter 4 of 17 GCA relative to encompassing internet safety in public education curricula," sponsored by Senator V. Anthony Ada.

Public Notice Requirements

Notices were disseminated via fax or email to all senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on March 10, 2011 (5-Day Notice), and again on March 15, 2011 (48-Hour Notice).

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

Committee Chairperson Speaker Judith T. Won Pat, Ed.D. called the public hearing to order at 2:00 p.m. and announced the afternoon's agenda. **No public testimony** was submitted on Bill No. 100-31 (COR).

Speaker Won Pat afforded Senator V. Anthony Ada the author of Bill No. 100-31 (COR) to speak about the legislation.

Senator Ada expressed that the intention of the bill is to incorporate internet safety into the curriculum and not create a separate course in internet safety. He stated that students utilized the internet to enhance their studies. He pointed out that they are threats on the internet such as viruses, malwares or other hazards that may redirect a student during his/her research to an explicit website. He expounded of a more serious threat on the internet such as child predators that troll the internet social networks which students use to communicate with fellow students. He stated that there are numerous resources that are available at minimal or at no cost to educators to create internet safe classrooms. He closed by stating that instructing internet safety will educate students how to avoid the dangers and where to report them and we need to keep our students as safe as possible.

Dr. Nerissan B. Underwood, Superintendent of the Department of Education submitted written testimony in support of Bill No. 100-31 (COR). Written testimony attached.

III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Education and Public Libraries recognizes the instructional benefits of the internet while protecting students from its risks. Parents should be assured to know that the Department of Education is taking appropriate measures to ensure the safety of students and the consequences for misuse of the internet. With the passage of Bill No. 100-31, it will ensure that all students of the Department of Education are educated about the potential dangers of the internet.

The Committee on Education and Public Libraries hereby reports out Bill No. 100-31 (COR) with the recommendation **TO PASS.**

Testimony on Bill No. 100-31, Relative to Encompassing Internet Safety in Public Education Curricula

Buenas yan Häfa Adai Senators,

Thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony on Bill No. 100-31, "An Act to Add a New §4125 to Chapter 4 of 17 GCA Relative to Encompassing Internet Safety in Public Education Curricula." The Department of Education (DOE) supports the intent of Bill No. 100-31 as it provides an added layer of protection for our students, requiring them to understand the risks involved with using the internet. Furthermore, this Bill supports DOE Board Policy 379 which is the Education Technology Use Policy. The policy states, "All students shall use the department's technology (network, telecommunications, video, hardware, and software) in a responsible, efficient, ethical and legal manner in accordance with the vision of the department, local and federal regulations, mandates, restrictions, GPSS Education Board Policies, etc."

The support of this Bill is grounded on input from the management team, school administrators, and school guidance counselors.

High school principals noted that FSAIS has firewalls or measures to block and protect students from social networks (i.e. Facebook, Twitter, MySpace, etc.) or other inappropriate websites. The principals also stated that schools have developed their *Acceptable Use Policies*, and that the district has in place within its approved Content Standards and Performance Indicators, the *Educational Technology, Standard 4: Digital Citizenship*, which states, "students demonstrate safe, legal, and ethical behavior when using technology to communicate or create a product."

Middle school principals support the need for information technology (IT) security. However, there is concern about what penalties can be imposed if students violate the IT security policy. Furthermore, they point out that some schools have standard operating procedures (SOP) with regard to internet usage.

Elementary school principals are in full support of this Bill and recommend that the internet safety awareness instruction should be used when the internet is to be used in the classroom or for a class assignment.

Although this legislation will strengthen the support of current DOE policies and curricular mandates, some school administrators felt that this Bill is unnecessary as there are other usage policies in place. Other administrators indicated that specific objectives are needed for each level (elementary, middle, and high) to give Bill No. 100-31 more clarity while others point out that funding for the training of personnel on internet safety will be necessary.

Again, thank you for the opportunity to provide testimony in support of Bill No. 100-31 and to extend our agreement for the need of internet safety in the schools.
