Dear Madam Speaker:

Transmitted herewith is Bill No. 127-31 (LS), entitled: "AN ACT RELATIVE TO REPEALING INORGANIC PROVISIONS IN CONFLICT WITH 48 U.S.C. §1421G(A) – THE ORGANIC ACT OF GUAM, BY REPEALING §§ 80105.5 AND 80107 OF CHAPTER 80, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, PERTAINING TO THE GUAM MEMORIAL HOSPITAL AUTHORITY BOARD OF TRUSTEES", which I signed into law on April 4, 2011 as Public Law 31-14.

I am pleased to sign this bill into law for a couple reasons. First, this bill is noteworthy for *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* acting upon one of many welcome and much-needed opportunities to reform Guam law where necessary, be it to conform to the Organic Act of Guam or to correct local laws which may be antiquated, confusing, superfluous, or contradictory to other local statutes.

Second, this bill demonstrates that, when the Executive and Legislative branches work together to craft solutions, the result can successfully propel our government forward. In this respect, I wish to thank the Chairman of the Committee on Health & Human Services, Senior Citizens, Economic Development & Election Reform for stepping up to this task in quick fashion. The Chairman did well to swiftly introduce this bill as a positive measure to address Guam's only public hospital serving the medical needs of our island.

The Organic Act of Guam places the exclusive and vastly important duty upon the Governor that he "shall establish, maintain, and operate public health services in Guam, including hospitals, dispensaries, and quarantine stations." [48 U.S.C. §1421g(a)]. Furthermore, the Ninth Circuit Court of Appeals holds *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* "may not negate the command of the Organic Act that the ultimate responsibility for the governance of the Hospital be in the Governor ... [nor] take[] over the entire power to establish, maintain and operate the Hospital by dictating who the governing trustees shall be." (624 F.2d at 934).

Accordingly, I Liheslaturan Guåhan has now taken the first step toward removing impediments to the Governor's ability to perform his Organic Act duty to reasonably govern Guam Memorial Hospital ("GMH") through a Board of Trustees. I previously submitted my appointees to the

GMH Board of Trustees to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* for confirmation in an attempt to involve the Legislative branch and collaborate towards improving Guam's health care system. With the passage of this law, I hope my continued attempt to enlist the assistance of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* in addressing Guam's health care needs is not in vain. Again, the law of our land mandates that *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* not dictate who the governing trustees of GMH shall be, and that this is the sole responsibility of the Governor. Nonetheless, I am resubmitting my appointees to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* for its endorsement in the spirit of governmental community and with the sincere hope that we can advance our island's interests together. It is my personal philosophy that Guam can only prosper when the Executive and Legislative branches cooperate toward advancing their common goal of an effective government which truly serves its people. In that regard, I sign this bill into law and will continue to govern according to this principle.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Finding and Intent. I Mina'Trenta Na

- 4 (COR), which was enacted into law as Public Law 30-190, in an effort to further

- 1 Guåhan now finds that certain provisions of Public Law 30-190 are deemed by the
- 2 Attorney General of Guam to be inorganic, as stated in his Opinion LEG 11-0199,
- 3 of March 28, 2011. Specifically, §80105.5 [Trustees Nominating Council;
- 4 Establishment] and §80107 [Removal From Office] of Chapter 80, Division 4,

RE: Request for Speaker's Emergency Declaration Relative to Bill No. 127-31 (LS).

Dear Speaker Won Pat:

I wish to respectfully request your consideration of an emergency declaration relative to Bill No. 127-31 (LS), for the purpose of its expeditious consideration by *I Liheslaturan Guahan* during the current legislative session.

As you are aware, the Attorney General of Guam has issued a legal opinion (LEG 11-0199) relative to certain provisions of P.L. 30-190, and their inorganic mandates relative to the appointment and removal of members of the Guam Memorial Hospital Authority Board of Trustees (attached). Specifically, §80105.5 and §80107 of Chapter 80, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated. This request is made with due consideration of:

§ 2103. Public Hearings Mandatory. (a) No bill may be passed by I Liheslatura unless it has received a public hearing, except that when the presiding officer of I Liheslatura certifies that emergency conditions exist, involving danger to the public health or safety, the requirement for a public hearing may be waived and in the event the bill is identical to a bill introduced earlier, which later bill received a public hearing, then a public hearing for the identical bill may be waived.

The urgency lies in the conflict between the cited inorganic provisions remaining in statute, and our legislative inability to receive and confirm appointees to the GMHA Board of Trustees, which is statutorily mandated in a manner in conflict with the A.G.'s opinion on the respective sections. This dangerously impedes the proper administration and provision of critical health services provided by Guam's only civilian hospital. The sooner the conflict is resolved, the Committee on Health and Human Services can expeditiously move forward in the confirmation process, and subsequent consideration by *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*.

Your consideration of this matter is urgently requested.
