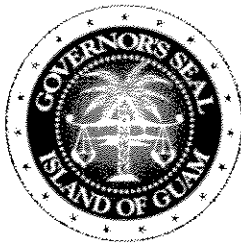





1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section 1. Appropriation.**

3 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the sum of Two Hundred Sixty
4 Thousand Dollars (\$260,000) is appropriated from the Fiscal Year 2014 General
5 Fund to the Guam Veterans Affairs Office to fulfill local funding requirements for
6 three (3) separate Veterans Cemetery Grants, CFDA No. 64.203; and *shall* include,
7 but not be limited to, the following:

1 (a) One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) for the
2 expansion of three hundred (300) preplaced crypts; to improve public
3 restrooms up to code; to add air conditioners in the administration building;
4 to add solar power to the administration building and to the lights of the
5 cemetery; to build a new maintenance shop with an office, an honor guard
6 room, a staff break-room, and a one thousand five hundred (1,500) square
7 foot meeting room, the rooms to be equipped with toilets, refrigerators,
8 lockers, microwave, showers, changing rooms, kitchen, and mirrors.

9 (b) Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000) to prevent further erosion
10 of the cemetery and its banks due to the *Agaña* River overflow into the
11 Philippine sea, and to reinforce and stabilize the banks of the cemetery; and

12 (c) Thirty Thousand Dollars (\$30,000) to clean, align, and replace
13 (some) tilting headstones and redo the turf, to raise sunken graves, to
14 relocate a Japanese machine gun nest, to care for the graves of German
15 sailors from World War I, and to beautify the cemetery.

16 Said funds *shall not* be subject to any transfer authority of *I Maga'laha*
17 *Guåhan*. Said funds *shall* continue to be available until fully expended for the
18 purpose stated herein.

19 **Section 2. Severability.** *If* any provisions of this Act or the application
20 thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not
21 affect any other provision or application of this Act which can be given effect
22 without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this
23 Act are severable.

**TESTIMONY ON
BILL 385-32
BY
JOHN S. UNPINGCO**

IT IS ALWAYS A PLEASURE TO TESTIFY BEFORE YOU TODAY.

BILL 385-32 IS QUITE IMPORTANT FOR A VARIETY OF REASONS:

FIRST, IT IS DENOTED AS BEING MATCHING FUNDS FOR IT IS THAT. BUT, WHAT IS DIFFERENT IS THAT AS PART OF A GRANT FROM NATIONAL CEMETERY GRANT SERVICE OF THE DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS IT IS RETURNED TO US AT THE END OF THE CONTRACT. ALL OF IT IS 100% RETURNED TO US.

SECOND, IT ENABLES US TO COMPETE FOR AND GET FREE FEDERAL MONEY. THERE IS NO GRANT IN KIND REQUIREMENTS NOR IS THERE A PAYBACK REQUIREMENT. WITHOUT THE MATCHING FUNDS, WE CANNOT RECEIVE A GRANT. WE ABSOLUTELY HAVE TO HAVE IT.

THIRD, AS OFF-ISLAND MONEY, IT IN TURN GENERATES ABOUT A HUNDRED JOBS FOR CONTRACTOR AND SUBCONTRACTOR PERSONNEL WHO ALL PAY TAXES. IN ADDITION, THE COMPANIES THAT ARE THE CONTRACTORS AND THEIR SUBCONTRACTORS ALSO PAY TAXES TO THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAM. THEY PURCHASE THE MATERIALS WITH WHICH THEY PERFORM THE CONTRACT LOCALLY. THUS, LOCAL VENDORS GET A SHARE OF THE GRANT FROM THE CONTRACTORS. THEY, TOO, PAY TAXES TO THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT.

FOURTH, THE FUNDS WILL BE USED TO UPGRADE AND BEAUTIFY THE EAST AGANA CEMETERY AFTER YEARS OF NEGLECT AND HELP MAKE IT AS PLEASING OASIS THAT VISITORS HOPEFULLY WILL FIND AN ATTRACTIVE SPOT TO VISIT. WITH ITS HISTORY DATING FROM SPANISH-AMERICAN WAR TO THE KOREAN WAR, IT HAS A WONDERFUL STORY TO TELL WHICH HIGHLIGHTS THE PATRIOTISM OF

OUR PEOPLE THROUGH HARD TIMES. AND, IT WOULD CURE AN EYESORE OF THE AGANA RIVER ERODING THE CEMETERY INTO THE PHILIPPINE SEA.

FIFTH, IT WOULD COMPLETE THE WORK AT THE GUAM VETERANS CEMETERY WITH THE ADDITION OF A MUCH NEEDED MAINTENANCE SHOP WHERE WE COULD STORE OUR EQUIPMENT WITHOUT FEAR OF IT BEING STOLEN. AND IT WOULD COMPLETE THE ADDITION OF THE UNDERGROUND CRYPTS SO THAT THIS CEMETERY CAN ACCOMMODATE OUR VETERANS FOR A GOOD TWENTY (20) YEARS FROM NOW.

FINALLY, IT IS THE INTENT TO DEVELOP BOTH THE EAST AGANA CEMETERY AND THE GUAM VETERANS CEMETERY INTO TOURIST ATTRACTIONS MUCH LIKE HAWAII'S PUNCHBOWL CEMETERY WHERE VISITORS BY THE BUSLOAD STOP TO TAKE PICTURES OF A SOMBRE YET BEAUTIFUL ATTRACTION.
