



AN ACT TO AMEND § 58146.1 OF CHAPTER 58, TITLE 12, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED (AS ADDED BY SECTION 3 OF PUBLIC LAW 32-233), RELATIVE TO PROVIDING FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF PROPOSED INDUSTRY SPECIFIC POLICY, CRITERIA AND MEASURABLE GOALS OF THE QUALIFYING CERTIFICATE PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that the Guam Economic Development Authority should develop and directly
- 4 submit to I Liheslatura (the Legislature) industry specific policy, criteria and

measurable goals of the Qualifying Certificate program, ensuring the appropriate stimulation of legitimate investment of new economic development; and further finds that the development of the proposed submission *should not* be seen as a rule making process to be conducted pursuant to Article 3 of Chapter 9. Title 5 GCA.

I Liheslaturan Guåhan also finds that the requested submission is necessary as a working tool in the refinement of the Qualifying Certificate program. It is, therefore, the intent of I Liheslaturan Guåhan to utilize the submission by the Committee on Economic Development as a framework to develop and refine through legislative processes the Qualifying Certificate program of the Guam Economic Development Authority.

It is, therefore, the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to amend § 58146.1 of Chapter 58, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated (as added by Section 3 of Public Law 32-233), to provide for the development and direct submission of industry specific policy, criteria and measurable goals of the Qualifying Certificate program to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* without going through the Administrative Adjudication Law.

Section 2. § 58146.1 of Chapter 58, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated (as added by Section 3 of Public Law 32-233), is *amended* to read:

"§ 58146.1. Qualifying Certificate; Abeyance Thereof. Development of Industry Specific Policy, Criteria and Measurable Goals.

(a) No later than sixty (60) days from the date of enactment of this Act, the Guam Economic Development Authority shall submit to I Liheslaturan Guåhan proposed industry specific policy, criteria and measurable goals; and which shall not include industry specific development projects already satisfactorily established on Guam, so as to ensure that the government not unnecessarily waive needed revenue for an industry specific project category that already exists or

is satisfactorily established. In the event the mandated industry specific policy, criteria and measurable goals are *not* submitted timely, pursuant to this Subsection (a), then the following *shall* become effective ninety (90) days from the date of enactment of this Act:

- (1) Hotel Qualifying Certificate; Provisional Abeyance thereof. Except as provided pursuant to Article 2 of Chapter 58, Title 12, GCA, no renewal of Qualifying Certificates for hotels shall be approved and issued until such time as the Guam Economic Development Authority has developed industry specific policy, criteria and measurable goals ensuring appropriate stimulation of legitimate investment of new economic development; and
- (2) General Industry Specific; Provisional Abeyance thereof. No new Qualifying Certificates, or the renewal of Qualifying Certificates, shall be approved and issued until such time as the Guam Economic Development Authority has developed industry specific policy, criteria and measurable goals ensuring the appropriate stimulation of legitimate investment of new economic development; and which *shall not* include industry specific development projects already satisfactorily established on Guam, so as to ensure that the government not unnecessarily waive needed revenue for an industry specific project category that already exists or is satisfactorily established."

Section 3. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such

- 1 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act which can be
- 2 given effect without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the
- 3 provisions of this Act are severable.
- 4 Section 4. Effective Date. This Act shall become effective upon
- 5 enactment.
