AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE SOUTHERN RIVER EROSION COUNCIL; AND TO AMEND § 68601 OF ARTICLE 6 OF CHAPTER 68, TITLE 21, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, TO MANDATE THE CREATION OF MULTI-YEAR MASTER PLANS TO ADDRESS THE EROSION ISSUES RELATED TO RIVERS IN SOUTHERN GUAM.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

- 2 Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan finds
- 3 that there is a serious problem regarding the erosion along the banks of the
- 4 Talofofo and Ugum Rivers, the Namo River, the Manenggon River, and other

rivers in southern Guam. I Liheslatura further finds that a recent site visit to the 1 2 Talofofo and Ugum Rivers was organized by the legislative Committee on Rules. Federal, Foreign & Micronesian Affairs, Human & Natural Resources, Election 3 4 Reform and Capitol District, and the Soil and Water Conservation District; and it 5 involved various stakeholders, including federal and local government agencies, 6 the private sector, and elected leaders. The site visit brought to the forefront this 7 concern of the erosion and the need for action to address this concern. I 8 Liheslaturan Guåhan further finds that the continuing erosion along these rivers is 9 having impacts far beyond the loss of acreage on both publicly and privately 10 owned lands. The continuing erosion also threatens important heritage sites and the jobs produced by the agricultural and tourism-related activities along the rivers. 11 The ongoing erosion is also adversely affecting the water quality of both rivers and 12 13 increasingly making these rivers less navigable and causing destruction to near shore benthic habitats. I Liheslatura further finds that at a series of roundtable 14 discussions with stakeholders conducted by the legislative Committee on Rules, 15 16 Federal, Foreign & Micronesian Affairs, Human & Natural Resources, Election 17 Reform and Capitol District earlier this year, there was a consensus that to mitigate this erosion would require a sustained, multi-year effort centered on dealing with 18 19 the watershed issues of the Bolanos Conservation Area, the waters from which are causing the erosion problems along both rivers. It was also the consensus of these 20 21 roundtable discussions that a similar erosion problem was occurring along the 22 Namo River and is threatening residences and infrastructure adjoining the Namo River. I Liheslatura further finds that in order to commence the process of taking 23 24 substantial, long term action to mitigate the erosion along the Talofofo and Ugum 25 Rivers, the Namo River, the Manenggon River, and other rivers in southern Guam 26 with similar erosion concerns, the involvement of the public and private 27 stakeholders should be provided with a statutory basis in order to sustain a multi-

year community-wide effort. I Liheslatura further finds that specific master plans 1 2 should be mandated to address the erosion concerns related to specific rivers in 3 southern Guam. 4 Southern River Erosion Council. Section 2. 5 (a) There is hereby created the Southern River Erosion Council (Council) with the mission of identifying and monitoring measures to mitigate the ongoing 6 7 erosion of the banks of the following rivers in southern Guam: 8 (1)the *Talofofo* and *Ugum* Rivers; 9 (2) the Namo River, including Namo Falls; 10 (3) the Manenggon River; and 11 any other rivers in southern Guam with serious erosion (4) concerns as identified by the Southern River Erosion Council. 12 13 In the case of each of the aforementioned rivers, the Council shall (b) 14 recommend a specific mitigation strategy for the ongoing erosion along these rivers in order to address the attendant adverse impacts of public concerns, 15 16 including, but not limited to: economic activity, infrastructure, water quality, the 17 environment, navigable waterways, public and private landowners, and heritage sites. The Council shall report its findings and recommendations to the Southern 18 Development Master Plan Task Force established by Article 6 of Chapter 68, Title 19 20 21, Guam Code Annotated. 21 Section 3. Composition of the Southern River Erosion Council. The Council shall be made up of the following members, who shall elect the 22 23 Chairperson of the Council: 24 (a) the Guam Department of Agriculture; the University of Guam; 25 (b) 26 (c) the Bureau of Statistics and Plans;

20	Section 4.	Comprehensive Master Plans to Address the Erosion
21	Problems of the	Talofofo and Ugum Rivers, the Namo River, the Manenggon
22	River, and Othe	r Rivers in Southern Guam as Identified by the Southern
23	River Erosion Council. § 68601 of Article 6 of Chapter 68, Title 21, Guam Code	
24	Annotated, is amended to read:	
25	"§ 68601. Geographical Definition.	
26	The Task Force created by this law (hereinafter Task Force) is hereby	
27	charged with the duty, as specified by this law, to develop a comprehensive	

Master Plan (hereinafter Southern Master Plan or Master Plan) for the 1 following villages: Agat, Santa Rita, Umatac, Merizo, Inarajan, Malojloj, 2 3 Talofofo and Yona, and such areas adjacent to or located in between said 4 villages, including, but not limited to, any offshore areas such as Cocos 5 Island and any body of water as to which the government of Guam has 6 jurisdiction to develop; and since some of the plans or projects to be 7 advanced by the Task Force may have incidental effect, residue application 8 or extension related to other geographical areas under the jurisdiction of the government of Guam, the Task Force may, when necessary and proper, 9 extend the application of the Southern Master Plan to such affected areas. 10 The Task Force shall also develop and incorporate into the Southern Master 11 Plan, specific master plans for the mitigation of the erosion problems along 12 13 the Talofofo and Ugum Rivers, the Namo River, the Manenggon River, and other rivers in southern Guam, based on the recommendations of the 14 15 Southern River Erosion Council."
