AN ACT TO AMEND § 5109(a) OF ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER 5, TITLE 12, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO PROVIDING A PREFERENCE FOR VETERANS WITH RESPECT TO PUBLIC HOUSING.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds that the problem of homeless veterans has become a cause of national concern. It is estimated that as many as forty thousand (40,000) veterans are homeless on any given day. In addition to the root causes of all homelessness – extreme shortage of affordable housing, livable income and access to health care – a large number of

displaced and at-risk veterans live with the lingering effects of post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD) and substance abuse. Furthermore, military occupations and training are not always transferable to the civilian workforce, creating challenges for veterans in seeking gainful employment. Those who have served our nation in the military, often in combat, are deserving of not only our respect but the support

of the community in securing safe, clean housing in a supportive environment free

of drugs and alcohol.

For this reason, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* that the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority, as the main public housing agency, provide for a preference for veterans in the selection process for public housing rental units.

**Section 2.** § 5109(a) of Article 1, Chapter 5, Title 12, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended* to read:

## "§ 5109. Duties of Authority with Respect to Tenant Selection.

(a) It may rent or lease the dwelling accommodations in a housing project only to families who lack the amount of income deemed necessary by the Authority to enable them, without financial assistance, to secure decent, safe, and sanitary dwellings, within the area of operation of the Authority, and to provide an adequate standard of living for themselves. The Authority *shall* charge rentals which it determines to be within the financial reach of such families. In the selection process, the Authority *shall* provide a preference for any veteran, as that term is defined in 16 GCA § 7120.2(b)(1), who is also the named applicant in any application for public housing.

The preference established by this Subsection *shall* be cumulative with any other preference allowed by the Authority for which the applicant qualifies, so that veterans have priority over non-service members and non-veterans within each preference category."
