

# AN ACT TO AMEND § 90.90(c) OF ARTICLE 4, CHAPTER 90, TITLE 9, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO INMATE COMPENSATION FOR PRISON INDUSTRIES.

### **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

Section 1. § 90.90(c) of Article 4, Chapter 90, Title 9, Guam Code
Annotated, is *amended* to read:

4 "(c) Earnings Formula, established. Inmates *shall* be paid at no less 5 than local prevailing wage rates as determined by the Director of Labor.

1	Each inmate participating in a prison industry shall have all wages earned
2	subject to this Earnings Formula:
3	(1) Twenty-five percent (25%) to the Criminal Injuries
4	Compensation Fund.
5	(2) Twenty-five percent (25%) to payment of court-ordered
6	fines, fees, and restitution. When such court-ordered fines, fees, and
7	restitution have been satisfied, this percentage shall be applied to the
8	Inmate's Account.
9	(3) Twenty-five percent (25%) to the Prison Industries
10	Revolving Fund.
11	(4) Twenty-five percent (25%) to the Inmate's Account.
12	Each participating inmate may elect to provide up to one hundred
13	percent (100%) of the twenty-five percent (25%) for child and spousal
14	support.
15	(5) In the event that the participating inmate <i>does not</i> owe
16	any sum listed above, one hundred percent (100%) of earned wages
17	shall be placed in the Inmate's Account."
18	Section 2. The Director of Corrections is hereby authorized to form a non-
19	profit organization to administer the prison industry program. The board of
20	directors of this non-profit organization shall have the fiduciary responsibility to
21	maintain the goals and objectives of the program.
