

**AN ACT TO AMEND §§ 66102 AND 66104.2 OF
CHAPTER 66, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED,
RELATIVE TO ALLOWING NON-IMMIGRANT
ALIENS, WHO ARE ADMITTED INTO GUAM UNDER
THE COMPACTS OF FREE ASSOCIATION, TO SERVE
IN THE CIVILIAN VOLUNTEER POLICE RESERVE
(CVPR) OF THE GUAM POLICE DEPARTMENT.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. § 66102 of Chapter 66, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is
amended to read as follows:

“§ 66102. Recruitment.

The Chief of Police *shall* recruit on an entirely volunteer basis, local
residents who desire to make available their services to assist the Guam

1 Police Department in carrying out its crime prevention, fire control and
2 emergency functions. The Chief of Police *shall* further promulgate rules and
3 regulations regarding the age, health and other requirements for recruitment
4 purposes. Nothing in this Section shall prohibit the Chief of Police from
5 recruiting a resident who is a non-immigrant alien admitted into Guam under
6 the Compacts of Free Association between the United States and the
7 Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the
8 Republic of Palau.”

9 **Section 2.** § 66104.2 of Chapter 66, Title 10, Guam Code Annotated, is
10 *amended* to read as follows:

11 **“§ 66104.2. Authorization for Full-Time CVPR Officers.**

12 The Guam Police Department (GPD) may employ CVPR Officers on
13 a temporary, full-time basis, if such Officers are active members and have
14 attained *at least* two thousand eighty (2,080) cumulative service hours, if a
15 critical need arises because of military activation of police officers or
16 absence due to a long-term disability status which has been certified by a
17 medical doctor. The GPD may exercise this authority provided its authorized
18 budget for personnel is not exceeded. The CVPR Officer *shall* return to
19 volunteer status pursuant to this Chapter when the incumbent returns from
20 military service or long-term disability, or at the discretion of the Chief of
21 Police. CVPR Officers may only serve as equivalent of Police Officer I and
22 be compensated hourly only as a Police Officer I, Step I, and *shall* be
23 eligible to receive sick leave, and be eligible for the Government of Guam
24 Health Insurance Program, and *shall not* be eligible for a stipend as a
25 Reserve Officer for the duration of their temporary employment by the
26 Department. Notwithstanding § 77114(a)(1) of Article 1, Chapter 77 of Title
27 10 GCA, a CVPR Officer who serves as a Police Officer I, Step I, under this

1 Section may be a non-immigrant alien admitted into Guam under the
2 Compacts of Free Association between the United States and the Federated
3 States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Republic
4 of Palau.”
