Section 1. The continuation of construction of Guam Memorial Hospital and the conversion of the nursing school building to a general hospital building are hereby

Section 2. There is appropriated from any General Fund Surplus in the Treasury of Guam, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$800,000.00 for the purpose authorized in Section 1 of this Act, \$91,818,00 of this appropriation shall be made available immediately, and the balance of this appropriation shall be made available July 1, 1955.

Section 3. There is hereby established within the government of Guam a continuing special fund which is for the purpose of providing necessary loans to students who are in or are entering nurse's training and who are United States citizens and residents of Guam. Such loans shall be made to defray the costs of travel, tuition, board and room, and similar educational expenses in connection with nurse's

training in the United States or its Territories.

Section 4. There is hereby appropriated from any General Fund Surplus of the Treasury of Guan, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$20,000 which shall be and become a part of the Student Loan Fund created by Public Law 118, Second Guan Legislature for the objectives and purposes created by Section 8 hereof.

Section 5. There is hereby appropriated from any General Fund Surplus of the Treasury of Guam, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$66,500 for the following purposes:

- To provide additional quonsets for school buildings, the sum of \$16,500.
- (2) To complete the Government House, the sum of \$20,000.
- (3) To provide for the initial engineering and design of the proposed new Administration Building, the sum of \$7,000.
- (4) To complete the remodeling and rehabilitation of certain buildings of the Department of Finance previously authorized and appropriated for by Section 4, Public Law 1, Second Guam Legislature, 1954 (Third) Special Session, the sum of \$5,000.
- (5) To provide for the electrical wiring and completion of construction of the Inarajan School, the sum of \$16,500.
- (6) To provide a dispensary at Agana Heights, the sum of \$1,500.00.

Section 6. There is hereby appropriated from any General Fund Surplus of the Treasury of Guam, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$95,000 for the following purposes:

(1) For the purchase of new school buses,

the sum of \$45,000.

(2) For the purchase of construction equipment for the Department of Public Works, the sum of \$50,000.

Section 7. Every appropriation made herein except the appropriation made by Section 4, above, shall be available for expenses incident to the project for which the appropriation is made including expenses of administration, planning, supervision and other similar expenses. Each appropriation made herein shall continue in full force and effect and shall be available until expended for the purpose and project for which the appropriation is made.

Section 8. This is an urgency measure and shall become effective upon the approval by the Governor.
