





6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

7 Section 1. Sec. 200 of the Government Code of Guam
8 is hereby amended to read as follows:

9 "Sec. 200. Holidays. The holidays of this
10 territory are:

- 11 (a) Every Sunday.
12 (b) Christmas Day, December 25
13 (c) New Year's Day, January 1
14 (d) Washington's Birthday, February 22
15 (e) Memorial Day, May 30
16 (f) Independence Day, July 4
17 (g) Liberation Day, July 21
18 (h) Labor Day, first Monday in September
19 (i) Veterans Day, November 11
20 (j) Every day on which an election is held
21 throughout Guam
22 (k) Every day appointed by the President
23 of the United States or the Governor
24 of Guam for a public fast, Thanksgiving
25 day or holiday."

26 Section 2. Sec. 220 of the Government Code of Guam
27 is hereby amended to read as follows:

28 "Sec. 220. Liberation Day. The 21st day of
29 July in each year shall be known as Liberation Day,
30 and is hereby made a legal public holiday in the
31 territory of Guam in commemoration of the anniversary
32 of the liberation of Guam from the enemy on July

July 21, 1944, and the inauguration of civil government of Guam on July 21, 1950."

Section 3. This Act is an urgency measure and shall take effect upon its approval by the Governor.
