10	Section 1. Section 4117 of the Government Code of
11	Guam is hereby amended to read:
12	"Section 4117. Reassignment of classes.
13	The Governor may, upon the recommendation of the
14	Personnel Board when he finds the economic conditions
15	warrant the necessity therefor, reassign classes of
16	positions to higher or lower pay ranges within the
17	pay range schedule than those to which they are
18	assigned in Section 4103 of this Compensation
19	Law; provided, however, that all classes of
20	positions in the classified service are reassigned
21	at one and the same time and in the same manner
22	and to the same extent. The provisions of this
23	section are not intended to nor shall they in any
24	way limit the authority conferred upon the Governor
25	by Section 4108 of this Compensation Law."
26	Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure and shall
27	take effect upon its approval by the Governor.
