9	Section 1. Section 39100.1 is hereby added to Chapter
10	2, Title XXXV of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:
11	"Section 39100.1. Eligibility for Parole.
12	Any person confined in the Guam Penitentiary,
13	except persons under sentence of death or treason,
14	shall be eligible for parole after he has served the
15	minimum period of time of his sentence as prescribed
16	by Section 39100 and as such minimum period of time
17	is reduced by allowance of time for good conduct as
18	hereinafter provided by this chapter."
19	Section 2. Section 39115 is hereby added to Chapter 2,
20	Title XXXV of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows:
21	"Section 39115. Good time allowance. Every
22	person confined in the Guam Penitentiary on any
23	judgment of conviction, except persons under
24	sentence of death or treason, shall be entitled
25	to a deduction from the term of his sentence
26	beginning with the day on which the sentence
27	commences to run, to be credited as earned and
28	computed monthly, provided that he observes all
29	the rules of the institution and has not been
30	punished, as follows:
31	(a) Five days for each month, if the
32	sentence is not less than six months and not

1 more than one year. (b) Six days for each month, if the 2 sentence is more than one year and less than 3 three years. 4 (c) Seven days for each month, if the 5 sentence is not less than three years and less 6 than five years. 7 (d) Eight days for each month, if the 8 sentence is not less than five years and less 9 than ten years. 10 (e) Ten days for each month, if the 11 sentence is ten years or more. 12 13 When two or more consecutive sentences are to 14 be served, the aggregate of the several sentences 15 shall be the basis upon which the deduction shall be computed." 16 Section 3. Section 39116 is hereby added to Chapter 2. 17 Title XXXV of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows: 18 "Section 39116. Release. A prisoner shall 19 be released at the expiration of his term of 20 sentence less the time deducted for good conduct. 21 A certificate of such deduction shall be entered 22 on the commitment order by the Director of Public 23 Safety of Guam." 24 Section 4. Section 39117 is hereby added to Chapter 2. 25 Title XXXV of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows: 26"Section 39117. Same: Parolee. A prisoner 27 having served the term or terms for which he shall 28 29 have been sentenced after the 21st day of July, 1950, less good time deductions, shall upon release 30 31 be treated as if released on parole, and shall be subject to all provisions of law relating to the 32 - 2 -

parole until the expiration of the maximum term or terms for which he was sentenced." Section 5. Section 39118 is hereby added to Chapter 2, Title XXXV of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows: "Section 39118. Forfeiture of Good Time Allowance. If during the term of imprisonment a prisoner commits any offense or violates the rules of the Guam Penitentiary, all or any part of his earned good time may be forfeited in the discretion of the Director of Public Safety." Section 6. Section 39119 is hereby added to Chapter 2, Title XXXV of the Government Code of Guam to read as follows: "Section 39119. Restoration of forfeited time. The Director of Public Safety may restore any forfeited or lost good time or such portion thereof as he deems proper under the circumstances." Section 7. This Act is an urgency measure and shall take effect immediately upon its approval by the Governor.
