1 Bill No. 29 2 Introduced by Committee on Judiciary. 3 by request. An Act to amend Sections 22001, 22002, 4 22004, 22005, 22007, 22008, and 22011 5 of the Government Code of Guam and to add Sections 22003.1, 22012, 22013, 22014, 22015, 22016, 22017, 22018, and to add Chapter 3, Title XXIII to the 6 Government Code concerning Notaries 7 Public. 8 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF 10 GUAM: 11 Section 1. Section 22001 of the Government Code is amended to read as follows: 12 "Section 22001. Same: qualifications. Every 13 14 person appointed as notary public must be, at the 15 time of appointment, a citizen of the United States. a resident of Guam for at least two (2) years, 16 twenty-one years of age and of a good moral 17 18 character." Section 2. Section 22002 of the Government Code is 19 amended to read as follows: 20 "Section 22002. Same: term. The term of 21 office of a notary public hereafter appointed shall 22 be five (5) years from and after the date of his 23 commission." 25 Section 3. Section 22003.1 is added to Chapter 1. Title XXIII, Government Code, to read as follows: 26 "Section 22003.1. Same: name and expiration 27 date of commission. Whenever a notary public affixes 28 his signature to any document in his official capacity, 29 he shall also affix thereto, beneath his signature, 30 in typewriting, or by rubber stamp, or by printing, 31

his name in printed letters and the date his

1 commission expires." Section 4. Section 22004 of the Government Code is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 4 "Section 22004. Same: records. If any 5 notary public dies, resigns, is disqualified, removed from office, or removes from the territory, 6 or upon expiration of his term of office and is 7 not immediately reappointed, his records and all 8 public papers shall, within thirty (30) days, be 9 delivered to the Director of Finance." 10 Section 5. Section 22005 of the Government Code is 11 amended to read as follows: 12 "Section 22005. Same: certification. The 13 Director of Finance, having in his possession the 14 15 records and papers of a former notary public, may grant certificates or give certified copies of 16 17 such records and papers, in like manner and with the same effect as such notary public could have 18 done." 19 Section 6. Section 22007 of the Government Code is 20 amended to read as follows: 21 "Section 22007. Same: bond. Each notary 22 public must execute an official bond in the sum 23 of one thousand dollars (\$1000.00), in such form 24 as may be prescribed by the Director of Finance 25 and approved by him. After approval the said 26 bond must be recorded, filed and kept in the 27 office of the Director of Finance." 28 Section 7. Section 22008 of the Government Code is 29 amended to read as follows: 30 "Section 22008. Same: payment of fee; oath; 31 recording. Before entering upon the duties of his 32

1	office, a notary public must 1) pay his fee;
2	2) take and subscribe his oath of office;
3	3) file and record in the office of the Director
4	of Finance his oath of office, and official bond.
5	If such action is not taken within thirty (30)
6	days from the date of his commission, such commis-
7	sion shall thereupon be void and of no effect."
8	Section 8. Section 22011 of the Government Code is
9	amended to read as follows:
10	"Section 22011. Fee. A fee of twenty-five
11	dollars (\$25.00) shall be paid to the Treasurer
12	of Guam for each appointment as notary public."
13	Section 9. Section 22012 is added to Chapter 1,
14	Title XXIII, Government Code, to read as follows:
15	"Section 22012. Acts after expiration of
16	term. No person who has been appointed and commis-
17	sioned as a notary public shall perform any act
18	as a notary public knowing that his term of office
19	has expired."
20	Section 10. Section 22013 is added to Chapter 1,
21	Title XXIII, Government Code, to read as follows:
22	"Section 22013. Same: validity. An official
23	act by a person who has been appointed and commis-
24	sioned as a notary public, performed after the
25	expiration of his term of office, is as valid as
26	if done during his term of office."
27	Section 11. Section 22014 is added to Chapter 1,
28	Title XXIII, Government Code, to read as follows:
29	"Section 22014. Same: ineligibility for
30	subsequent appointment. A person who has been
31	appointed and commissioned as a notary public
32	and who performs any act as such after expiration

"Section 22017. Penalty. Whoever violates any provision of this Chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor."

Section 15. Section 22018 is added to Chapter 1, Title XXIII, Government Code, to read as follows:

"Section 22018. Copy to be furnished. A certified copy of this Title shall be furnished each notary public with his commission."

Section 16. Chapter 3 is hereby added to Title XXIII, Government Code, as follows:

"CHAPTER 3

Section 22200. Officers authorized to perform notarial acts. Any commissioned officer of the armed forces of the United States, while on active duty, who is authorized to administer oaths by the Uniform Code of Military Justice, may administer oaths and affirmations, take depositions, affidavits, and acknowledgments of deeds, grants, transfers, and other instruments of writing, and powers of attorney, of any person who for the time being is on active duty with the armed forces of the United States, in the same manner as a notary public.

Any oath or affirmation administered, and deposition or affidavit taken, or acknowledgment certified by such officer hereunder, if otherwise in accordance with law, shall be effectual for all purposes as if administered, taken or certified by a notary public appointed and commissioned under this Title."
