

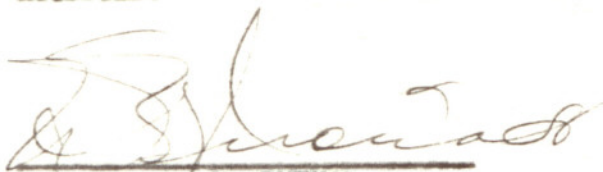
CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

11 Section 1. The sum of One Hundred Twenty-six Thousand
12 Three Hundred Twenty-four Dollars (\$126,324.00) is appropriated out
13 of any moneys in the Treasury of Guam, not otherwise appropriated,
14 for the contingent expenses of the Judicial Branch, government of
15 Guam for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1957.

16 Section 2. The sum of Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00)
17 is appropriated out of any moneys in the Treasury of Guam, not other-
18 wise appropriated, as the share of the Judicial Branch, in the
19 maintenance and up-keep of the Legislative Building for the fiscal
20 year ending June 30, 1957.

21 Section 3. The Chief Judge, Island Court, Guam, may
22 transfer the amount of Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00)
23 appropriated herein as the share of the Judicial Branch in the
24 maintenance and up-keep of the Legislative Building for fiscal year
25 ending June 30, 1957 to the custody and control of the Committee on
26 Rules, Guam Legislature.

27 Section 4. This Act is an urgency measure.
