## Public Law 88--Third Guam Legislature 1956 (SECOND) Regular Session G. L. 259 AN ACT

An Act to amend Section 4110 of the Government Code of Guam relating to automobile allowance in the recruitment of off-island personnel, and to set aside funds for the expense and travel fund established by Section 6112.1 of the Government Code of Guam.

Be it enacted by the People of the Territory of Guan:

Section 1. Section 4110 of the Government Code of Guan is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 4110. Overseas differential. In the event it is necessary or desirable to recruit officers or employees for the government of Guam from the continental United States or other territory of the United States, the Governor may, on all contracts executed after July 1, 1951, authorize an overseas pay differential of not to exceed twenty-five (25) per centum of the base rate pay established for the position or for the class by this chapter. Such pay differential shall be in addition to allowances which may be provided for transportation of the employee, his dependents, and his household and personal effects. Provided, however, that in no case will any allowance which may be provided f or transportation as provided herein include in allowance for expense of freight charges for shipment of automobiles or similar vehicles, except that the following exceptions may be allowed and authorized in connection with employees' automobiles or similar vehicles:

1. An employee recruited outside of Guam (off-island) may at the time of his recruitment be allowed to ship his car, which has a market value of not less than \$500.00 to Guam, provided, he is willing to underwrite or pay out of his own personal account, one half  $\binom{1}{2}$  of the cost to have such car shipped to Guam.

2. An employee recruited off-island or outside of Guam, owning a car in the United States, which has a market value at the time of his recruitment, of not less than \$500.00, may be allowed reimbursement or credit for any loss which he may sustain in the forced sale of his car by reason of his recruitment to Guam; provided that in no event, such reimbursement or credit to an employee, be authorized for an amount exceeding \$250.00.

(a) The amount of the employee's loss on the forced sale of his car in the United States will be determined and computed on the basis of the difference between the market value of his car at the time of sale of his car and the amount realized or paid in the sale of his car."

Section 2. Of the total sum of \$7,565,163 appropriated by Public Law 2, Third Guam Legislature, 1956 (Second) Special Session, for the operation of the government of Guam for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1957, the sum of \$298,737 is hereby set aside to establish the expense and travel fund provided by Section 6112.1 of the Government Code of Guam for the uses and purposes therein set forth.

Section 3. This Act is an urgency measure.
