5 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4207 OF TITLE V,  
6 GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, PROVIDING FOR  
7 CREDITS TO GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES IN THE  
8 GUAM RETIREMENT FUND FOR MILITARY SERVICE  
9 RENDERED IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE  
10 UNITED STATES OF AMERICA.

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

12 Section 1. Section 4207 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby  
13 amended to read as follows:

14 "Section 4207. Same: for service with armed forces.  
15 Prior service credit shall be granted any employee who served  
16 in the military or naval forces of the United States between  
17 September 23, 1950 and the operative date of this Chapter, as  
18 though such service was rendered for the civil government of  
19 Guam, provided the employee shall not be receiving a pension  
20 or annuity from the United States Government on account of such  
21 military or naval service, or is eligible to receive such pension  
22 or annuity on account of such service.

23 An employee shall also be allowed credit for active service  
24 in the armed forces of the United States for a period not to exceed  
25 three years in addition to any active service performed during a  
26 national emergency proclaimed by the President of the United  
27 States or during a national emergency or state of war declared by  
28 the Congress of the United States, occurring subsequent to the  
29 operative date of this Chapter, provided the employee entered  
30 such active service while employed by the government of Guam  
31 and re-enters its service within a period of ninety days following  
32 his discharge from the armed forces of the United States under  
conditions other than dishonorable."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
