

5 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 32 AND 33, TITLE II,  
6 PART I, OF THE PENAL CODE OF GUAM TO CLARIFY  
7 THE DEFINITION OF AN ACCESSORY.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

9 Section 1. Section 32 of the Penal Code of Guam is hereby  
10 amended to read as follows:

11 "Section 32. Who are accessories. All persons, who,  
12 after a felony has been committed, harbor, conceal or aid  
13 a principal in such felony, with intent to assist said  
14 principal in avoiding or escaping from arrest, trial,  
15 conviction, punishment, or imprisonment, having knowledge  
16 that said principal has committed, or has been charged with  
17 or convicted of such felony, are accessories."

18 Section 2. Section 33 of the Penal Code of Guam is hereby  
19 amended to read as follows:

20 "Section 33. Punishment of accessories. All accessories  
21 are punishable to the same extent but not to exceed the  
22 penalty provided by law for the offense of the principal."

23 Section 3. This Act is an urgency measure.
