
CERTIFICATION OF PASSAGE OF AN ACT TO THE GOVERNOR

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 121 OF THE
CODE OF CIVIL PROCEDURE OF GUAM
RELATING TO THE COMPOSITION OF THE
JUDICIAL COUNCIL.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 121 of the Code of Civil Procedure of Guam is
hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 121. Composition. There shall be a Judicial
Council of Guam, which shall consist of the Judge of the District
Court of Guam, who shall be chairman, the chief judge and
judges of the Island Court and the Judge of the Police Court,
the chairman of the Committee on Judiciary of the Legislature,
or his duly authorized representative, the Attorney General of
Guam, or his duly authorized representative, and the president
of the Bar Association of Guam, or his duly authorized repre-
sentative. The concurrence of four shall be necessary to any
action taken by the Judicial Council. The Judicial Council may
elect a vice-chairman from among its membership and a
secretary who shall not be a member of the Judicial Council.
No member or officer of the Judicial Council, except the
secretary, shall receive any compensation as such."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
