AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 16103 AND 16204, AND TO REPEAL SECTION 16002(k) OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAR RELATING TO APPLICATIONS FOR COMMERCIAL AND SERVICE LICENSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAN:

Section 1. Section 16103 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby mmended to read as follows:

"Section 16103. General Requirements. Each applicant for a commercial license must furnish evidence:

- (a) That he owes no tax obligation under the Business
 Privilege Tax Law, including any possity and interest thereon,
 to the government of Guam which is due and delinquent at the
 time of application;
- (b) That he is of good moral character, integrity and general repute as required by the rules and regulations pertaining thereto."

Section 2. Section 16204 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 16204. General Requirements. Each applicant for a service license must furnish evidence:

- (a) That he owes no tex obligation under the Business
 Privilege Tax Law, including any penalty and interest thereon,
 to the government of Guam which is due and delinquent at the
 time of application;
- (b) That he is of good moral character, integrity and general repute as required by the rules and regulations pertaining thereto."

Section 3. Item (k) of Section 16002, Government Code of Guam, is hereby repealed.
