AN ACT TO REPEAL CHAPTER 9 OF TITLE XII OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM AND TO ENACT A NEW CHAPTER 9, TITLE XII OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM RELATING TO SCHOLARSHIPS AND STUDENT LOANS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Chapter 9 of Title XII of the Government Code of Guam is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Section 2. A new Chapter 9 is hereby added to Title XII of the

Government Code of Guam to read as follows:

CHAPTER 9

SCHOLARSHIPS AND STUDENT LOANS

SUBCHAPTEE A

SCHOLARSHIPS TO TERRITORIAL COLLEGE OF GUAN Section 11800. STUDENTS ENTITLED TO SCHOLARSHIP: AMOUNT OF SCHOLARSHIP. There are hereby established annual scholarships to the Territorial College of Guam, to include textbooks, waiver of tuition and other fees for a period of not more than four years. Recipients of such scholarships shall be selected from the high school students in each graduating class of the several public and private high schools in Guam, now or hereafter established, who have completed four years of high school, of which at least the last year shall have been in Guam, and who are among the highest 20% of their class in scholastic standing. Each graduating class of said schools is entitled to one such scholarship as herein provided, and in addition for every twenty-five (25) graduates, or fraction thereof, an additional scholarship is provided. Each school shall make the selection

based on scholarship, aptitude, interest, health, personality, ambition, and other criteria in accordance with regulations of the Board.

Section 11801. SAME: ALTERNATE UPON REFUSAL OR FAILURE TO ACCEPT. In the event any graduate selected to receive the benefits of the provisions of Section 11800 declines or fails to accept the scholarship herein provided, an alternate may be selected by the school in accordance with regulations of the Board: Provided that such alternate graduate meets all the other requirements of this subchapter.

Section 11802. ADDITIONAL TUITION WAIVER SCHOLARSHIPS. There are further provided tuition weiver scholarships to be awarded by the Territorial College of Guam to students enrolled in the teacher education program whe are preparing for a teaching profession and who, if entering freshmen, have a cumulative high school grade-point average of 'B' or better, or if already enrolled in the College have a cumulative grade-point average of 'C' or better.

Section 11803. STUDENTS ENTITLED TO SCHOLARSHIP: AMOUNT OF SCHOLARSHIP. In order to encourage attendance of high school graduates at the Territorial College of Guam, and to recognize superior scholarship and to encourage the development of other outstanding qualities, two college students in each annual graduating class of the Territorial College of Guam are hereby provided scholarships in an amount which shall

reasonably cover the cost of room and board, books, tuition and other college fees, as annually determined by the Board, in an accredited institution within the United States or its territories and which has been approved by the Faculty of the Territorial College. for a period of two years next succeeding the year of graduation. The Board may also provide, on the basis of financial necessity, additional grants to apply to or cover the cost of transportation to the college and return to Guam upon completion of the student's program of studies. Students shall be selected on the basis of scholarship, aptitude, interest, health, personality, ambition and other criteria consistent with the purposes of this subchapter. To be eligible for consideration for the scholarship a student must be a United States citizen and must have established his residence in Guam for a period of at least two years immediately preceding his application, and must have a cumulative grade-point average of 'B' or better upon graduation from the Territorial College. Selection shall be made by the Faculty of the College or a Committee thereof.

(f) AGRICULTURAL STUDENTS. One student per year for the three years next succeeding the effective date of this subchapter to study agriculture in a college or university within the United States or its territories;

(g) LAW STUDENTS. Two students for the year next succeeding the effective date of this subchapter to study law in a college or university within the United States or its territories;

(h) EDUCATION STUDENTS. Ten students per year for the ten years next succeeding the effective date of this subchapter to pursue a course of study in education in colleges or universities within the United States or its territories;

(i) GENERAL. Eight students per year for the five years next succeeding the effective date of this subchapter for courses of study in colleges or universities within the United States or its territories, which will, in the judgment of the Board, contribute to the growth, advancement, and development of Guam.

Section 11807. SAME: PREREQUISITES. The professional scholarships provided in Section 11806 are subject to the following limitations:

(1) The applicant must be a United States citizen and must have established his residence in Guam for a period of at least two years immediately preceding his application;

(2) The applicant, except in medicine and law, 1 must present to the Board prior to the awarding of a scholarship 2 satisfactory documentary proof that he has accumulated 3 approximately sixty semester hours or minety quarter 4 hours of college credit and has been admitted to a 5 college or university to pursue a program of studies 6 7 in the area of the scholarship applied for. An appli-8 cant for a scholarship in medicine or law must provide 0 satisfactory documentary proof that he has satisfied 10 the entrance requirements of and has been admitted to a professional graduate school in medicine or law; 11 12 (3) Preference shall be given to applicants who have graduated from the Territorial College of Guam; 13 (4) The colleges or universities must be properly 14 accredited and must be approved by the Board. 15 Section 11808. SAME: APPLICATION AND SELECTION. 16 The Board shall select the recipients of professional 17 scholarships upon the basis of scholarship, aptitude, 18 interest, health, personality, ambition and prospective 19 ability as members of the respective professions for 20 which scholarships are herein provided. 21 Section 11809. SAME: PERIOD OF AVAILABILITY. 22 In the event the Board does not find qualified applicants 23 for any or all of the scholarships herein provided within 24 the years prescribed, the Board is authorized, except 25 with regard to scholarships available under Item (i) of 26 Section 11806, to extend the period of availability of 27 each category of scholarship until all such schelarships 28 can be awarded to qualified applicants. 29

> Section 11810, SAME: AMOUNT. The scholarships herein provided shall be in an amount which shall

reasonably cover the cost of room and board, books, tuition and other school fees, as annually determined by the Board, for the period which the recipient needs to complete the requirements for the degree or certificate issued upon graduation by the schools or institutions attended: Provided that such period be no longer than the usual period for the fulfilling of the requirements for the said degree or certificate by a student not having the scholarship herein provided but similarly enrolled in the same school or institution. The Board may also provide, on the basis of financial necessity, additional grants to apply to or cover the cost of transportation to the college, and return to Guam upon completion of the student's program of studies.

Section 11811. SAME: CONDITIONS. In order to qualify for the professional scholarship herein provided, the student, in addition to the other conditions set forth in this subchapter, must also agree to be employed or make himself reasonably available for employment in his profession by the government of Guam for two years for each year of schooling for which he has received the professional scholarship herein provided. Such agreement shall contain appropriate convenants and conditions as shall effectuate the intent of this section.

Section 11812. SAME: FORFEITURE. Expulsion from the school or institution attended, or suspension for a period the same as or greater than one academic semester or its equivalent in such school or institution, or failure to complete the program for which the scholarship was awarded, or failure to comply with the regulations

23	period of one academic year in an accredited college,

19	for the Fund gifts, devises, bequests, donations and

Section 11818. REGULATIONS. The Board shall, subject to approval by the Governor, make regulations not inconsistent with the provisions of this chapter governing scholarships, student loans, and grants for transportation as authorized by this chapter, including the selection of students entitled to the benefits thereof, the amount and use of such scholarships and loans, the amount which may be loaned to any one person, the method and time for repayment of loans, the rights and duties of students, conditions of forfeiture, and providing generally for carrying out the provisions of this chapter. Such regulations shall be promulgated by Executive Order. Section 11819. SAME: SUBMISSION TO LEGISLATURE. All regulations, amendments thereto or repeals thereof. shall be submitted to the Legislature, which reserves the power to annul the same. Such regulations shall be so submitted not later than the next portion of the next regular session of the Legislature convening after the promulgation of such regulations, and such regulations shall remain effective unless amended or repealed by statute. Regulations not submitted to the Legislature in accordance with the provisions of this section shall become automatically inoperative at midnight of the last day of said legislative session." Section 3. All scholarship benefits under Subchapter A shall be made available to high school graduates of the Class of 1959.

Section 4. This Act does not affect rights and duties that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were begun, before its effective date.
