AN ACT TO AMEND THE BUSINESS LICENSE LAW,  
TITLE XVII, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, TO  
CHANGE THE LICENSE YEAR FROM A CALENDAR  
YEAR TO FISCAL YEAR BASIS, AND FOR OTHER  
PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Item (n) of Section 16002, Chapter 1, Title XVII,  
3 Government Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read:

4 "(n) 'Renewal' shall mean the continuation for the next  
5 succeeding fiscal year (July 1 to June 30) of the privilege to  
6 conduct the licensed acts except that no license shall be  
7 renewed unless application is made therefor within three months  
8 of the expiration of the last license issued."

9 Section 2. Section 16014, Chapter 1, Title XVII, Government  
10 Code of Guam, is hereby divided into Section 16014 and Section 16014.1,  
11 and further amended to read as follows:

12 "Section 16014. Term of License. All licenses and  
13 endorsements applicable thereto shall be issued on a fiscal year  
14 basis (July 1 to June 30) and, regardless of when issued, shall  
15 expire on the thirtieth (30th) day of June of the year for which  
16 issued or renewed.

17 Section 16014.1. Apportionment of Fee. All original  
18 license fees shall be prorated and one fourth (¼) of the annual  
19 fee charged for each quarter or portion of a quarter remaining  
20 in the fiscal year from the date of issuance."

21 Section 3. Section 16015, Chapter 1, Title XVII, Government  
22 Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

23 "Section 16015. Renewal. A licensee may renew his license  
24 and endorsements applicable thereto at the expiration thereof by  
25 the payment of the annual license fee and by filing with the  
26 renewal application an affidavit under oath and subject to the  
27 penalties of perjury that he has continued to comply with all of



1 the prerequisites and qualifications provided by law, rules and  
2 regulations which were certified by the proper departments of the  
3 government of Guam in the application for his original license.

4 A licensee who fails to renew his license on or before the  
5 thirtieth (30th) day of June of each year shall be assessed a  
6 penalty of one dollar (\$1.00) per each calendar day he is  
7 delinquent, which penalty shall become part of the renewal fee.  
8 Any licensee who fails to renew his license on or before the  
9 thirty-first (31st) day of July shall be required to discontinue  
10 his business until he renews the license or be subject to an  
11 injunction issued by the Island Court and to prosecution under  
12 Section 16017. Such failure to renew while continuing the  
13 operation of the business shall constitute refusal and failure  
14 to obtain a license under the provisions of this Title."

15 Section 4. Section 16302, Chapter 4, Title XVII, Government  
16 Code of Guam, is hereby repealed.

17 Section 5. All business licenses, and any endorsements thereto,  
18 issued for the calendar year 1960 on or before the effective date of this  
19 Act under Title XVII, Government Code of Guam, and in effect on the  
20 effective date of this Act, are hereby extended to June 30, 1961.

21 Section 6. This Act shall take effect July 1, 1960.
