AN ACT TO REPEAL SECTION 12129 OF THE COVERNMENT COME OF GUAN TO REPEAL SOPSECTION I OF SECTION DOS OF THE PENAL CULE OF CHAM. TO AMEND SECTION 7600 OF
SUBCRAFTER A. CHAFTER G. TITLE X. GOVERNRENT CODE OF GUAN. AND TO ACD SUBCHAPTER
& TO CHAPTER G. TITLE X. OF THE GOVERNMENT
CODE OF GUAN. PERTAINING TO CONTROL AND
LICENSING OF LOGS IN CUAM.

Section 1. Subchapter M is hereby added to Chapter 6. Title
X. of the Government Code of Guan, to read as follows:

"Subchapter H

Control and Licensing of Dogs

Section 9620. Short Title. This Subchapter may be cited as the Dog Control Law.

Section 9620.1. Definitions. For the purpose of this Subchapter certain terms and words are defined as follows:

- (a) 'Dog owner' means every person owning, harbering or beeping a dog.
- (b) 'Can' includes berboring or beeping a dog.
- (c) 'Officer' means say member of the Department of Public Safety, the Cormissioners of Guan, and any person authorized by the Director of Medical Services.
- (d) 'Unlicensed dog' means any dog for which the license for the current year has not been paid or to which the tag provided for herein is not attached.

Section 9620.2. Lisense required. It shall be unlawfulfor any person to one a dog unless such dog is licensed as
provided by this Subchapter. This section shall not apply to
dogs under the age of three months, dogs in quarantine or
dogs brought into Cusm for a temporary term not to exceed

one month for the exclusive purpose of entering such dog in a show or exhibition.

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shall begin on July 1st. Licenses shall be issued commencing June 1st of each year. The owner of a dog imported into Gumu shall have fifteen (15) days to obtain the prescribed license. Dogs exempted by Section 9620.2 shall be licensed within thirty (30) days after the exemption cesses. For any license obtained after the date prescribed by this section, a delinquency penalty of fifty ceats (30.50) for each month or a fraction thereof shall be added to the fee and collected. The full fee shall be paid for any fraction of any year for which a license is issued.

Section 9620.4. License fees. Owners of dogs must procure as annual license for each and every dog they own. The easual license fee for each dog shall be as fellows:

Spayed females, each 2.00
Females net spayed, each 5.00

Defore a license is issued for a spayed female deg. the owner shall file with the licensing official an affidavit or certificate in writing, signed by a qualified veterinarian showing that the dog has been spayed. An affidavit or certificate shall not be required if such an affidavit or certificate is already on file.

Section 9620.5. Same: Seeing-Eye Dogs. A blind person emping a dog. trained to aid the blind, commonly called a seeing-eye dog. shall be exempted from any fees under this Subchapter.

Section 9620.6. Same: Duplicate tag. If any license tag is lost or stolen, the owner to whom such tag was issued shall be entitled to receive a daplicate thereof by presenting

to the Department of Finance satisfactory proof that such tag
was lost or stolen. A properly numbered substitute or duplicate
tag shall thereupon be issued and a fee of fifty cents (\$0.50)
collected.

Section 9620.7. Issuance of license. All licenses for dogs shall be issued by the Department of Finance upon payment of the prescribed fee. The license shall be in such form as the Director of Finance shall prescribe and shall include the following:

- (a) The name and address of the owner;
- (b) The expiration date of the license;
- (c) The date of payment:
- (d) Description of the dog for which the license is issued;
- (e) The number of the tag issued for such dog.

Section 9620.8. Tag. A tag in such form and design as shall be prescribed by the Director of Finance, stating the serial number, the year for which it is issued and the sex of the dog for which it is issued, shall be issued with each license. The tag shall be attached to a collar around the neck of or to a harness worn by the dog for which the license is issued.

Section 9620.9. Rabies certificate required. No dog
license shall be issued unless the owner present a valid
certificate of vaccination against rabies, signed by a
qualified veterinarian. The certificate shall state the date
of vaccination, the breed, sex, age and color of the dog, and
the origin and serial number of the vaccine used. The
Department of Agriculture Veterinarian is hereby authorized
to vaccinate and to issue a certificate therefor, upon the
payment of a fee not to exceed three dollars (\$3.00).

Section 9620.10. Transfer of license. Whenever ownership of a dog is transferred, the former owner may surrender

any unexpired license and tag issued to him. Upon payment of a fee of fifty cents (40.50) a new license and tag shall be issued to the new owner.

Section 9620.11. Quarantine of degat rables. Any dog showing any evidence that it has, or is believed to have, rables, or which has bitted a person, shall be examined by a qualified veterinarian, or a qualified person authorized by the Director, and shall be quarantined or isolated by the Director for a period of not more than fourteen (14) days. Such deg shall be released only upon the certificate of a qualified veterinarian, or by a qualified person authorized by the Director, filed with the Director, that the dog is free of rables. Any and all costs, including care and keep, shall be borne by the owner if known. Any dog found to have rables shall be destroyed.

Section 9620.12. Vicious dogs. Any dog which has bitten a person or persons two er more times may be declared to be a vicious dog and ordered confined or destroyed by the Director.

Section 9620.13. Immediate mensee. It shall be lawful for any officer to destroy summarily any dog running at large that constitutes an immediate meance to any one or more persons.

Section 9620.14. Dog ettacking person. It shall be lawful for any person who, while peacebly conducting himself in any place where he may lawfully be, is attacked by a dog, or any person witnessing any such attack, to kill such dog while so attacking.

Section 9620.15. Deg herassing domestic enimels. It shall be lawful for any person to kill any dog found herassing, chasing, worrying, injuring, or killing any domestic emimals or foul, except on the premises of the owner of such dog.

Section 9620.16. Liability. Any person killing or injuring a dog pursuant to ection taken by him as authorized under Section 9620.13. 9620.14. 9620.15. or 9620.16. Shall not incur any financial liability to the owner of such dog.

Section 9620.17. Damages by dog: owner liable.

If a dog shall injure may person or damage any property.

the owner of such dog shall be liable in damages.

Section 9620.18. Dog control unit. The Department of Public Safety shall maintain a dog control unit. The dog control unit shall maintain a dog pound, provide and carry out a territory-side plan to collect and impound all dogs running at large, and upon request to collect and dispose of humanely may sick, uged, or unmanted dog. The Consissioners of Guam shall have the responsibility within their respective jurisdictions of collecting all dogs running at large and turning them over to the dog control unit.

Section 9620.19. Pogs running at large.

- (a) All dogs ever three months eld remping at large shall be impounded.
- impounded under this section, as shown on the license, shall be notified in writing of such impounding, and that if the dog is not claimed within fifteen (15) days, such dog shall be sold or destroyed, and any costs for care and keep will be charged squiast the owner. Such notice may be delivered personally to such owner, or left at his place of residence in Guem or sent by regular mail to his last known address, as shown in the license. At the end of fifteen (15) days any such dog not claimed shall be sold or destroyed.
- (c) Any unlicensed dog that has been impossed shall be kept for five (5) days, and may be claimed by the owner

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by obtaining a license as provided in this Subchapter and paying for the costs of care and keep. At the end of five (5) days any such dog not claimed shall be sold or destroyed.

- (d) A fee of tweaty-five cents (\$0.25) per day for care and keep shall be charged and collected for every day or part thereof any deg is kept in the pound.
- (e) Any dog that is not claimed may be destroyed, or sold for the cost of care and keep incurred at the pound, and in the case of an unlicensed dog, upon payment of the license fee and cost of rabics vaccination.

super of any dog which has been seized and sold as provided in this Subchapter, way, at any time within thirty (30) days after such sale, redeem the same from such purchaser by paying to him the assumt of the purchase price paid by the purchaser and the sum of fifty cents (30.50) per day for the sumber of days from the date of the sale to and including the day of redesption. All sales made as provided in this Subchapter convey a good and valid title to the purchaser, and unless redesped, the owner of the day so sold shall theresefter be barred from all rights to recover the same.

Section 9620.21. Wrongful interference with efficers.

Any person resisting or obstructing an officer in the exercise of his duties as provided in this Subchapter shall be quilty of a misdementar and punished as prescribed in Section 9500.14 of this Chapter.

Section 9620.22. Disposition of moneys collected. All memors collected under the provisions of this Subchapter shall be covered into the General Fund."

Section 2. Section 12129. Covernment Code of Guam, is hereby repealed.

Section 3. Subsection (1) of Section 369 of the Penal Code

of Cuam is hereby repealed.

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Section 4. Section 9630 of Subchapter N., Chapter 6. Title K. Government Code of Guam. is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 9630. Confinement of animals. No pigs, goats, sheep, horses, cattle, carebae, or other docestic animals, other than foul and cats, shell be allowed to run loose or be at large in Agams or in any village or urban area. All such animals must be confined by fencing, or be kept properly secured by tying or staking. All animals allowed to run loose or be at large in violation of this section shall be impounded by the Department of Public Safety."

Section 5. This Act shall take effect on the first day of the first month after approval by the Governor, provided that no license under this Act shall be required with respect to any dog properly licensed on such date under prior existing lem until the expiration of the license year under this Act.
