AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 26200, TITLE XXVII,
OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATING TO
AREAS RESERVED FOR PARKS PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 26200, Title XXVII of the Government Code
of Guam, is hereby amended as follows:

"Section 26200. Reserved properties. The below
described properties are reserved for public parks:

- (a) Lot No. 36 - Apugan (Fort Apugan, on the Cliff
just above and south of Agana).
- (b) Lot No. 235 - Umatac (Fort Santo Angel, on small
point on Agat side of Umatac Bay).
- (c) Lot No. 236 - Umatac (Fort Nuestra Senora de la
Soledad, on Merizo side of Umatac Bay).
- (d) Fort Santa Cruz, in Apra Harbor.
- (e) Lot No. 328-1 - Sunay (Fort Santiago, on Orote
Peninsula near Harbor entrance).
- (f) Lot Nos. 163 and 163-New - Umatac (Monastery ruins).
- (g) Lot No. 237 - Umatac (Fort Nuestra Senora del
Carmen, high on the hill above Umatac toward Agat).
- (h) Lot No. 5007-2 - Dededo. (Dededo Recreation Park).
- (i) All those examples of Spanish construction found
along the old trail from Umatac to Piti and the road from
Piti to Agana - particularly the two bridges in Umatac, and
the Sella Bridge (the first bridge north of Umatac), the
Taelayag Bridge (the second bridge north of Umatac), the
Taleyfac Bridge (the third bridge north of Umatac), the
approaches to the Agat Bridge, the old Atantanc Bridges,
the distance markers along the trail and road, etc.
- (j) Spanish Bridge Park (Lot No. 1, Block 6, New Agana).

(k) Lot No. 5174-remainder, Ypac Beach Recreation Park as delineated and described on Land Management Drawing No. E4-60T498, and recorded in the Department of Land Management as Document No. 38091."

Section 2. This act is an urgency measure.
