AN ACT TO ADD CHAPTER 7 TO TITLE XII OF
THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM PERTAINING TO
FREE TUITION FOR RESIDENTS OF GUAM TO THE
COLLEGE OF GUAM, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Chapter 7, Title XII, of the Government Code of
3 Guam is hereby added to read as follows:

4 "CHAPTER 7
5 COLLEGE OF GUAM

6 Section 11600. Designation of College. The college
7 founded and established by the Government of Guam hereto-
8 fore designated as the Territorial College of Guam shall
9 be known and designated as the College of Guam.

10 Section 11601. Management. The management of the
11 College of Guam, for purposes of administration shall be
12 in accordance with Section 11101 of the Government Code
13 of Guam.

14 Section 11602. Registration and Tuition. Tuition to
15 the College of Guam shall be free to all residents of
16 Guam. Registration fees and other charges shall be
17 established by the Board of Education.

18 Registration fee and rate of tuition fixed by the
19 Board of Education shall be required of each non-resident
20 student. 'Non-resident student' means any person who
21 has not been a bona fide resident of the territory of
22 Guam for more than one (1) year immediately preceding the
23 opening day of a semester during which he proposes to
24 attend the College of Guam. Every alien student who has

1 not entered Guam as an immigrant or permanent resident
2 with the intention of becoming a United States citizen as
3 provided by law, prior to the opening day of a semester
4 during which he proposes to attend the college is deemed to
5 be a non-resident student.

6 Section 11603. Rules and Regulations as to Standards
7 of Admission. The Board of Education in addition to the
8 powers enumerated in Section 11101 of the Government
9 Code of Guam shall adopt rules and regulations for the
10 government of the College of Guam in prescribing (a) the
11 standards of admission for students entering the college;
12 and (b) the standardizing, as far as the Board deems wise
13 and necessary, of the courses of instruction offered in
14 the college. Students shall be admitted to the College
15 of Guam in accordance with the rules and regulations
16 of the Board of Education pursuant to this section."

17 Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
