AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 4001 OF THE GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAN TO PROVIDE A FIVE-POINT CREDIT BENEFIT TO THE FORMER EMPLOYEES OF THE GUAN POLICE COMBAT PATROL IN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS AND SELECTION FOR EMPLOYMENT WITHIN THE GOVERNMENT OF GUAN.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Section 4001 of the Government Code of Guam is hereby

amended to read as follows:

"Section 4001. General. The employment and promotion of persons in the service of the government of Guam shall be upon the imsis of merit and fitness. Positions in the classified service as defined in Section 4002 of this chapter shall be filled as far as practicable by competitive selection methods. Preference in filling positions and all appointments in the government of Guam shall be is accordance with Section 9(a) of Public Law 630, Blst Congress, otherwise referred to as the Organic Act of Guam. Provided, also, that in competitive examinations and selection for employment in the service of the government of Guam, veterans of the Armed Forces of the United States, who received hongrable discharges therefrom or who were released from active duty under honorable conditions and who are residents of Guam, and former members of the Guam Police Combat Patrol who served honorably therein and whose service has been certified by the Director of Public Safety. shall receive a preferential credit of five points which shall be automatically added to their grade or score upon passing the required examination in computing their status within the competitive service." Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
