AN ACT TO REPEAL SECTIONS 105, 106 AND 107
OF THE PENAL CODE OF GUAM AND TO ENACT A NEW
SECTION 105 RELATIVE TO ESCAPE OF PRISONERS;
TO AMEND SECTION 1215 OF THE PENAL CODE OF
GUAM RELATIVE TO EXECUTION OF JUDGMENT; TO
REPEAL SECTIONS 8800, 8801 AND 8803 OF THE
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, AND TO ENACT A NEW
SECTION 8800 AND AMEND SECTION 8802, GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE TO THE OPERATION
AND ADMINISTRATION OF CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

Section 1. Sections 105, 106 and 107 of the Penal Code of Guam are hereby repealed except with regard to offenses committed prior to the effective date of this Act and a new Section 105 is hereby added to Chapter III, Title VII, Part I of the Penal Code of Guam, as follows:

"Section 105. Escape of prisoner. Every prisoner who escapes or attempts to escape from the custody of the Director of Public Safety or his authorized representative or from any person having the lawful custody of such prisoner or from any correctional institution or other place of confinement or hospital in which he is confined by direction of the Director of Public Safety, or from any custody under or by virtue of any process issued under the laws of Guam by any court or judge, or from the custody of any peace officer or marshal or person pursuant to lawful arrest, is guilty of a felony and is punishable by imprisonment not exceeding 18 months and by fine not exceeding \$1,000."

Section 2. Section 1215 of the Penal Code of Guam is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 1215. Judgment, by Whom and How Executed. If the judgment is for imprisonment, or a fine and imprisonment until it be paid, the defendant shall forthwith be committed to the custody of the Director of Public Safety or his authorized representative and by him detained until the judgment is complied with."

Section 3. The Title to Chapter 9, Title IX, Government Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"CHAPTER 9

Confinement of Prisoners"

Section 4. Sections 8800, 8801, and 8803, Government Code of Guam, are hereby repealed and a new Section 8800 is hereby added to Chapter 9, Title IX, Government Code of Guam, to read as follows:

"Section 8800. Authority. The Director of Public Safety shall establish and operate correctional institutions, and other places of confinement, for prisoners serving sentences of imprisonment imposed by the courts of Guam and other authorized prisoners, persons charged with offenses, and other persons placed in the custody of such Director, or held by him or arrested, pursuant to the laws of Guam."

Section 5. Section 8802 of Chapter 9. Title IX. Government Code of Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Section 8802. Rules and regulations. The Director of Public Safety, subject to the approval of the Governor by Executive Order, is authorized to make and promulgate rules and regulations for the administration of correctional institutions and other places of confinement, including, but not limited to, necessary disciplinary measures for inmates thereof and for their treatment, care, labor, rehabilitation, and reformation. Such rules and regulations may be made concerning the employment of inmates in rendering such services and in the manufacturing and production of such articles, materials and supplies as may be needed by the government of Guam, and for the employment of inmates on a voluntary basis by any charitable or non-profit organization after such inmates have performed the labor required by the government of Guam. Employment for charitable or non-profit purpose organizations

may be performed with or without compensation but any funds realized therefrom shall be kept or disbursed by the Director of Public Safety for the use and benefit of such inmates or their dependents in accordance with such rules and regulations."

Section 6. This Act is an urgency measure.
