AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27104 OF TITLE XXVIII,
GOVERNMENT CODE OF GUAM, RELATIVE TO APPOINT-
MENT OF MEDICAL BOARDS OF EXAMINERS.

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE TERRITORY OF GUAM:

2 Section 1. Section 27104 of Title XXVIII, Government Code of
3 Guam, is hereby amended to read as follows:

4 "Section 27104. Boards of examiners. With the approval
5 of the Governor of Guam, the Commission shall appoint boards
6 of examiners as follows: (a) a board of examiners in basic
7 sciences; (b) a board of examiners in medicine and osteopathy;
8 (c) a board of examiners in chiropractic; (d) a board of
9 examiners in dentistry; (e) a board of examiners in mid-
10 wifery; and (f) such other boards of examiners in drugless
11 healing as are necessary under the provisions of this title.
12 The board of examiners in the basic sciences, the board of
13 examiners in medicine and osteopathy, and the board of
14 examiners in dentistry each shall consist of five members.
15 The boards of examiners in midwifery and in drugless healing
16 may consist of three to five members as the Commission may
17 deem proper. No examiner shall be appointed for a term longer
18 than two years. The Commission shall appoint no person as a
19 member of any such board who is not a citizen of the United
20 States, or a resident of Guam for at least one (1) year
21 immediately preceding his appointment; except that persons
22 employed in the services of the Government of the United States
23 or of the government of Guam may be appointed without regard
24 for their citizenship or previous residence, and may accept
25 such appointment and receive such compensation for their services
26 as examiners as may be provided by law; provided that such

employment is not inconsistent with the discharge of their duties as members of such boards.

Each examining board shall elect a chairman and a secretary and may make such rules regarding the discharge of its duties as the Commission may approve. Each board shall conduct the examination and make reports as required by law and by the rules of the Commission."

Section 2. This Act is an urgency measure.
